Freya enjoyed the origami making in the outdoor classroom.

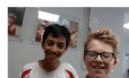
Year 4: Louie said that his favourite thing was the Year 6 production; he liked how funny it was.

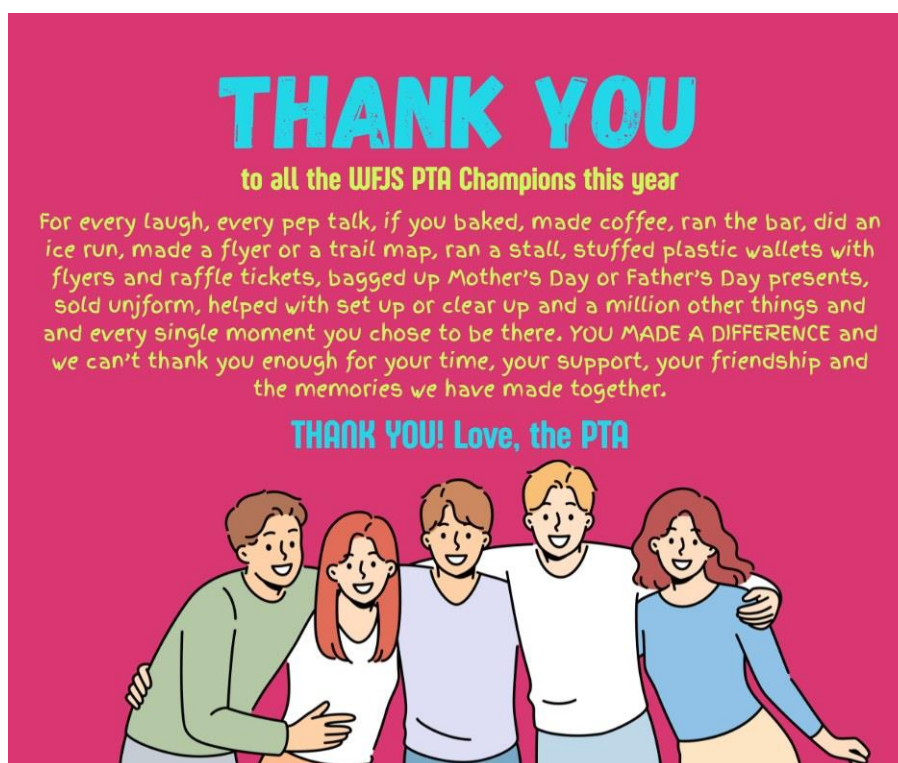

End of Term - The Last Day is Tuesday 21st July 2026

We break up on **Tuesday 21st July at 1.30pm** for the summer holidays and return on **Thursday 3rd September 2026**.

Changes to School Lunch Offer

We are delighted to share some exciting updates to our school meal provision for the next academic year!

From September 2026, we will be working with our new catering provider, **Nourish**, to offer children even greater flexibility and choice at lunchtime. Children will be able to enjoy a combination of packed lunches and school lunches throughout the week. For example, they may choose a packed lunch from Monday to Wednesday and a school lunch on Thursday and Friday.

There is no minimum number of days required, giving families the freedom to choose what works best for them. Once selected, lunch days will remain the same for the duration of each half term to help us manage catering arrangements effectively.

We recently shared Nourish's exciting new menu and have attached it again for your reference. We hope your child will enjoy exploring the range of delicious meals on offer!

From September, Nourish will also be providing a **vegetarian option** for children who currently receive a halal meal. Nourish operates either a halal menu or a non-halal menu, and we will continue to review these arrangements with them during the Autumn Term.

If you would like to make any changes to your child's current lunch arrangements, please complete the form below.

To make the process as simple as possible, we only need you to indicate the days on which your child would like to have a school lunch.

Please complete the form by Tuesday, 21 July 2027, only if you wish to make a change.

If your child requires a special diet, please indicate this on the form. Children who currently receive a halal meal should select the vegetarian option.

The cost of a school lunch is £2.90 per day. Lunch balances will be available to pay at the beginning of Autumn Term 1.

If we do not hear from you, we will assume that your child's current lunch arrangements will remain unchanged for the Autumn Term.

We look forward to introducing these new options and working with Nourish to provide enjoyable and nutritious lunches for all our pupils.

Deadline for Ordering Uniform for Next Term and Sweatshirt Cardigan update

V Neck Red logoed sweatshirt and sweatshirt cardigan will replace the v neck knitted jumper and PE sweatshirt so parents will only need to buy one jumper and therefore reduce costs. Sweatshirt cardigans as well as sweatshirt tops can be used for PE.

The old style knitted jumper and PE sweatshirt are still permitted and the majority of children will still be wearing these styles.

YEAR 4

Year 4 Important Life Skills To Practice Over the Summer

As your child prepares to move into Year 5, we would like to ask for your support with two important life skills: **telling the time on an analogue clock** and **using money confidently**. We have noticed that many children are finding these areas particularly challenging. Both are essential life skills that children are expected to use confidently as they move through upper Key Stage 2 and beyond. Over the summer holidays, we would be very grateful if you could:

Telling the Time

- Purchase an **analogue watch** for your child (if possible).
- Encourage them to **wear it regularly**, including when they return to school in September.
- Spend time practising key time-telling skills at home, such as:
 - Reading o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.
 - Reading times to the nearest 5 minutes.
 - Understanding the relationship between the hour and minute hands.
 - Using time in everyday situations, such as calculating how long until an activity starts or finishes.

Using Money

We would also encourage children to have opportunities to **handle and use cash** wherever possible. In an increasingly cashless world, many children have limited experience of recognising coins and notes, calculating totals and checking change. Some simple ways to practise include:

- Giving a small amount of **pocket money** and discussing how to save or spend it.
- Allowing children to pay for small items in shops.
- Encouraging them to count out the correct amount.
- Checking that they receive the correct change and understanding how it has been calculated.
- Talking about the value of different coins and notes.

These experiences help develop confidence with money and support important mathematical understanding, as well as preparing children for everyday life. Regular practice, little and often, can make a huge difference to a child's confidence and fluency. Developing these skills over the holidays will help ensure that children are **Year 5 ready** and able to

access the curriculum more successfully. Thank you for your continued support. We hope you all have a wonderful summer break and look forward to welcoming the children back in September.

Year 4 into Year 5 - Only Year 6 Permitted to Walk Home Alone

As we informed all parents in March 2026 we have made an important update to our procedures regarding pupils walking home from school. After considerable efforts to strengthen our safeguarding measures, we continue to have concerns related to the safety of younger pupils walking home alone. As a result, we have made the decision that, **from the start of the new school year in September 2026 permission to walk home alone will no longer be available for pupils in Year 5.** From September 2026, only Year 6 pupils will be permitted to walk home alone, and only with confirmed parental permission. We know that this change may affect routines for some families, and we are genuinely sorry for any inconvenience this may cause. Please be assured that this decision has not been taken lightly. Our primary responsibility is to ensure that every child is safe, and we believe this is the most appropriate step in supporting that aim.

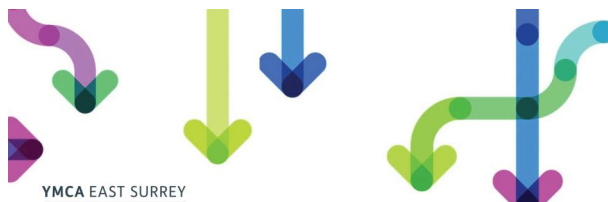

Ear Piercing - Get It Done Over the Summer Break

Now the summer holidays are here it is important to remind you that if you are thinking of getting your child's ears pierced the **beginning of the summer break is the best time**. This will give enough time for the ears to heal and for the removal of earrings in the autumn term. Pupils are only allowed pierced gold/silver stud earrings and they cannot be worn during P.E. If your child is unable to remove their earrings they will not be allowed to participate in P.E. or games – pupils are not permitted to cover earrings with plasters. It is recommended that children do not wear their earrings on the day they have P.E. or Games.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about SKIN BETTING

"Skin betting" is the term used when players gamble using virtual in-game items, such as weapon 'skins' or character cosmetics. Although these items appear purely decorative, some can hold significant real-world value. Research suggests that children as young as 13 have engaged in this type of betting, often on sites with limited age checks or safeguards, blurring the line between gaming and gambling.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- UNREGULATED PLATFORMS**
Skin gambling typically takes place on peer-to-peer websites that are not licensed or regulated. These platforms often lack age verification, making them easily accessible to children. By trading their gaming accounts, users can deposit skins, phone bills, and other valuable assets in exchange for in-game items – often without adults being aware these activities are happening.
- REAL-WORLD VALUE**
Skins may look like single cosmetic upgrades to a game item and characters, but some are worth hundreds or even thousands of pounds. They can be traded or sold on online marketplaces, meaning they function much like real money. When young people bet with skins, they are risking items of genuine financial value, even if no physical cash is exchanged directly.
- INFLUENCER PROMOTION**
Some gaming influencers and streamers have promoted skin betting sites to their content. This can make the behaviour appear normal or even glamorous, potentially encouraging younger audiences to engage in these activities without fully understanding the risks involved.
- SOCIAL STATUS PRESSURE**
In games such as Counter-Strike: Global Offensive (CS:GO) and Fortnite, new skins can act as status symbols. Young people may feel the pressure to own high-end items to fit in with peers. This can lead them to take risks – such as using gambling sites – to obtain desirable skins, leading to them becoming hooked on addictive behaviour online.
- LIMITED OVERSIGHT**
Skin betting can take place both in-game and on external websites that parents and educators may not be familiar with. Because skin betting does not always resemble traditional gambling, it can go unnoticed until significant losses have occurred, in both terms of money.
- GATEWAY BEHAVIOURS**
Skin betting mirrors many aspects of traditional gambling, including chance-based outcomes, fixed payouts and excitement. Early exposure to these mechanics can normalise gambling behaviour before children and young people even reach legal gambling age. Research indicates that this may increase the likelihood of developing unhealthy habits later, particularly if early wins create a false sense of control or skill.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- UNDERSTAND IN-GAME ITEMS**
Familiarise yourself with the games young people are playing and learn whether they include cosmetics or gamble items. Sites like CS:GO and Rust are known for skin marketplaces, but similar systems are increasingly common across games.
- DISCUSS VALUE AND RISK**
Help children and young people understand that cosmetic items like skins can carry real-world value. Explain that trading them through betting is comparable to losing money, therefore reinforcing the connection between in-game actions and real financial consequences.
- LOOK FOR WARNING SIGNS**
Be alert to changes in behaviour, such as secrecy around gaming or strong interest in acquiring specific items, or a sudden loss of in-game items. There could indicate involvement in skin gambling and provide an opportunity to start a conversation about it.
- USE CONTROLS AND SAFEGUARDS**
Make use of parental controls and platform settings to restrict trading, purchases, and access to external websites. Where possible, disable marketplace features on games and monitor young people's account activity to reduce the risk of unsolicited transactions.

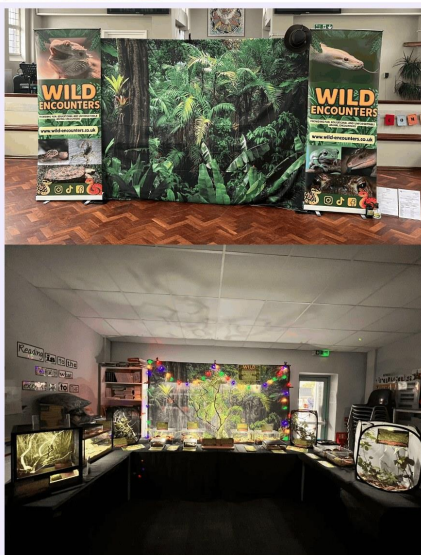

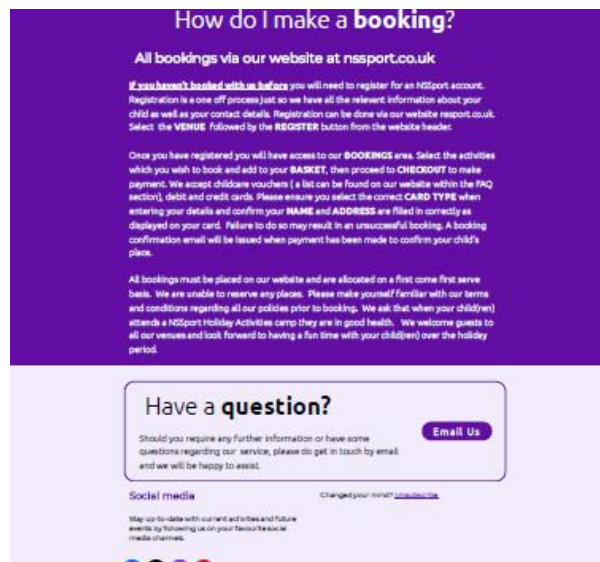

Great British Summer Savings
