#### Reminder Your Child's Flu Vaccination E-Consent

The Child and Family Health Surrey Immunisation Team is visiting Wallace Fields Junior School on **THURSDAY 2ND NOVEMBER** to deliver Influenza (flu) vaccinations via nasal spray.

#### Please complete the e-consent form by 4pm on FRIDAY 27TH OCTOBER by visiting:

- www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk<sup>3</sup> and entering your school's unique code SR125298
- If you do not want your child to receive a vaccine, then please fill in the 'No' box.
- If you do not want your child to receive the nasal spray vaccine on the basis of porcine gelatine, please fill in the 'No' box indicating this, and you will be given the opportunity to consent for an alternative vaccination. This vaccination is delivered by injection into the arm (intramuscularly) and does not contain any porcine DNA agents. We will deliver this in school when we visit, if you would like you child to receive this vaccination in a clinic, please contact us on the above number or email.

#### **Winter Uniform**

## Learning

## What Does Maths Look Like in School?

We have heard recently that some parents think that we have sets and stream for maths. We need to clarify that we do have maths groups, though they are designed to meet the needs of the children. This might be their confidence in maths, their academic ability or it might be the level of support they need. All the maths groups deliver exactly the same learning focus and expect the same outcome. For example, the year group might be looking at addition, so every group will be looking at that concept though with different size groups and different levels of adult help, to meet the needs of the children. These groups are not hierarchical and therefore children do not move 'up' or 'down' into groups. The teachers use their ongoing assessment, and knowledge of the children, to match the needs of the child to where they will succeed the most. Those children who are confident in maths will have the least additional adult support and conversely, those who need a significant amount of support will receive this. Teachers review these maths groups regularly and use their professional judgement to check the children are receiving the best level of support. Children may change group over the year depending on their confidence levels and support needs. We really appreciate all of your support with maths at home.

#### **Black History Month**

Black History month is an important time to remember and celebrate the contributions of the black community for UK and the world. WFJS children have been learning about the culture, history and traditions of black people across the world.

Here is what we did in our year groups:

In **Year 4**, we learned about the life and work of Nelson Mandela and his remarkable legacy. Children studied about his contribution to South Africa and the world. We discussed some of his life quotes (It only takes one person to change the world) and explained what they meant for us. We also created


artwork to celebrate the Rainbow Nation using impressionistic techniques and shirt designs to create something Madiba would have liked. Mrs. Curran shared various personal stories with the children about her experiences of growing up in South Africa and when she met Mandela. Finally, we created goals for ourselves and thought about which character traits we may need to achieve these whilst taking inspiration from Madiba - his kind and brave soul.

In **Year 3**, we have been celebrating Black History Month by learning about some inspirational people throughout history. This includes George Washington Carter, Barak Obama and Mae Jemison. We have been reflecting on their contributions to society and their achievements. In the new term, we will be creating poems about a famous sportsman or sportswomen through black history.


In **Year 5**, we have been looking at inspirational figures within STEM from the Black community. These included: Mae Jemison, Frank Chinegwundoh and Alice Ball. After researching and collating information about their successes and influential discoveries in the world of science and maths, we produced fact files and Google Slides to present to the rest of Year 5 on one significant figure. We have considered how these figures have impacted science and maths today through thoughtful reflections.


In **Year 6**, we have been considering inspirational black women from Britain, their impact on both the country in which they lived and on the wider society around them. We talked and learned about incredible women such as Mary Prince, Lashana Lynch, Lilian Bader, Nicola Adams- amongst others! The children chose their most inspirational woman, researched key information about their lives and created a biographical blog post about them. They also had to consider what our country or society would have been like without these inspirational women - and they were brilliant in their research, writing and considerations!


## Wallace Fields Juniors Book Club – October Meeting

## Wraparound Care Provided by Junior Adventures Group - JAG!

**Junior Adventures Group Club (JAG)** provides excellent wraparound care at Wallace Fields Junior School. They run Breakfast Club from **7:30am until 8:40am** and After School Club from **3:25pm until 6:00pm.** From September, a new part session 4.30pm -6.00pm has been created for After School Club and is live on the JAG Magic Booking system (price is £11.00). This means your child can attend a Wallace Fields Club and then join JAG at 4.30pm at the reduced price. This is from September 2023 and available to juniors only.

It would be very helpful if all parents could register on JAG <a href="https://www.junioradventuresgroup.co.uk/term-time/after-school-club/">https://www.junioradventuresgroup.co.uk/term-time/after-school-club/</a> even if they never use JAG during their time at WFJS. This would allow a late pick up in an emergency. JAG cannot take unregistered children due to them being under a different Ofsted registration. The office cannot look after a child beyond school day and those children who are regularly picked up late must register with JAG.



If possible, please walk to school. Mr Findlay is always on duty to ensure the traffic remains calm and controlled. Drive slowly and respectfully and please park on one side of the road and do not park over the residents' driveways. Obviously, do not park on double yellow lines and please give way to avoid gridlock. Use the turning circle at the bottom of Dorling Drive to maintain the flow of traffic. Avoid three point turns in the road as this blocks and is dangerous to children and other pedestrians. Thank you for putting the children's safety first.
