Stars of the Week



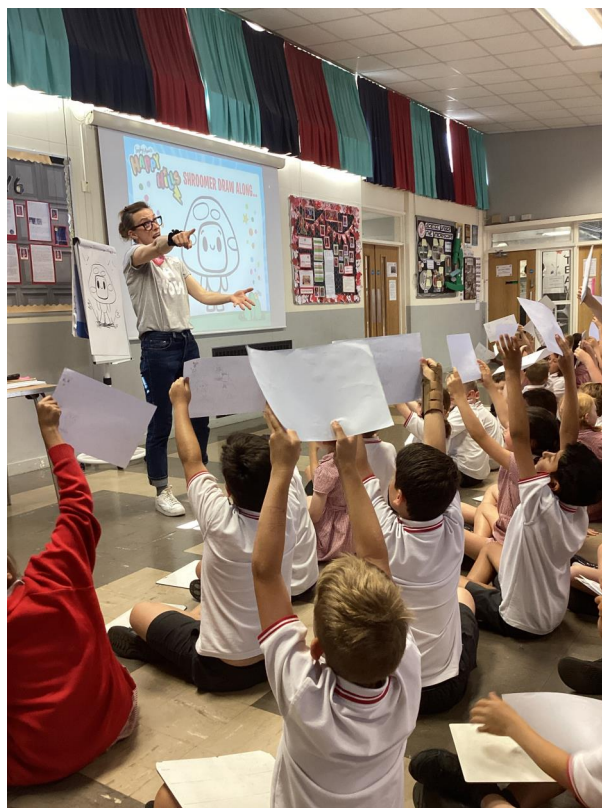
This week's **Stars of the Week** were announced in assembly - they create an excellent role model for their fellow peers through their efforts and commitment by following the school values.

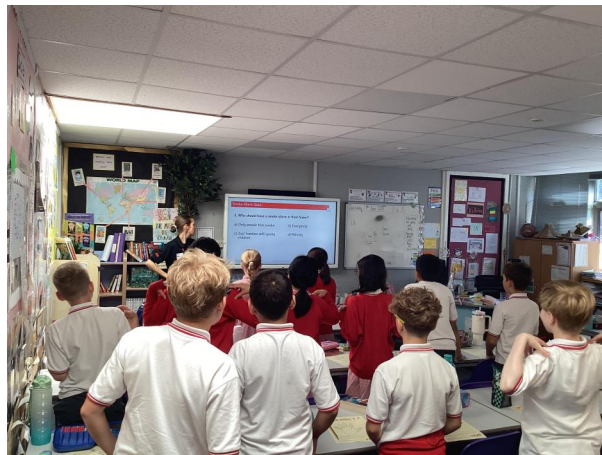
Sophy Henn Visited Year 3 and 4!

We are hoping they will be here next week and Miss Day will distribute the books to those children who have paid. We hope the children enjoyed the experience of meeting an author and also inspired some to be graphic novelists or book illustrators!





Year 5 Fire Safety Visit



Year 5 were visited by Jen from Surrey Fire and Rescue Service on Tuesday. Jen spoke to us about keeping ourselves safe and how to identify possible fire risks in our homes and school. She spoke about regularly checking our smoke alarms and if you hear a smoke alarm, we need to 'get out, stay out, call 999'. Jen gave out magnets for each Year 5 child to remind families to check their smoke alarm every week. We discussed Fire Action Plans, like the fire drills we do in school. We do these regularly to know how to appropriately respond in the case of a real emergency. Some children said they have a fire action plan at home; it is really important that all children know how to safely exit their home in case of an emergency. We

spoke about the importance of having a Plan A and Plan B. This is necessary in case of smoke outside a bedroom door, or the bottom of stairs (for example). Thank you very much Jen for such an informative and important talk.



Dear Parent or Carer



Your child has taken part in a fire safety session led by Surrey Fire and Rescue Service. As part of our prevention work, we visit schools to teach children and young people key fire safety skills. We want all families to be safe from fire, so please take a few minutes to talk to them about what they learnt during the session.

How you can keep your family safe from fire:

In addition to discussing today's session with your child, there are steps that you can take to ensure your family is safe from fire and prepared in case of an emergency.

Common fire hazards at home include

- cookers / ovens
- candles and fireplaces
- matches and lighters
- electrical items
- barbecues / bonfires

Please remind your child to **stay away** from these items.

Always supervise your child when using cookers, and never leave lit candles, fireplaces, barbecues, or bonfires unattended.

Matches and lighters should always be kept out of the reach of children.

Electrical fires are increasingly common: replace damaged cables, allow hot electrical items sufficient time to cool in a safe place, avoid overloading plug sockets with too many devices and overcharging items, especially after the charge cycle is complete.

What to do in case of a fire - follow these simple steps:

- Respond to a smoke alarm immediately and shout 'Fire!' to alert others
- Get out quickly and safely
- Once out, stay out, then call 999

You can help your family escape safely in case of an emergency by creating a **fire escape plan** and ensuring that exit routes are kept clear. The key advice to remember is to **'Get out, Stay out and Call 999!'**

Calling 999

It helps if everyone knows their home address if they ever need to call 999. 999 can be accessed in a variety of different ways, from calling 999 to using different options from relay services, text messaging and emergency buttons on mobile phones. Please make sure you set these up correctly and register with the appropriate service so 999 can be accessed in a way which is best for all family members.

What to do if your clothes catch fire: follow these simple steps:



Stop, Drop & Roll – rolling on the flames to smother them

For wheelchair users: **Stop, Cover to Smother** – use material such as clothing or a blanket to smother the flames

National Numeracy Visit

This week, Year 3, 4 and 5 were visited by Maria from National Numeracy for an exciting assembly on **maths in the real world**. This has been a focus in school for the last few years, as we try to provide children with examples of where they will need to use maths in everyday life after their school days! In Year 5, we entered the **Number Heroes** competition, and the children spoke about how they will use maths in their dream jobs. Please see some excellent examples below. On Friday, Year 5 had a session with Maria where we looked at characters, their jobs and their hobbies. The children discussed with Maria the possible links to maths in each of these. The children made some excellent contributions on where we might see maths beyond the classroom. If you have time over the next few weeks, perhaps you could discuss with your children how you use maths in your everyday life? Can your child spot maths in the real world when you're out shopping? New Style Sports Day - Wednesday 25th June 2025 9.30am to 12.10pm

On Wednesday 25th June 2025 all parents and carers are welcome to come along and watch from **9.30am** on our **Wallace Fields Juniors Upper Field**. **To make the morning as fun as we can this year, we have decided to try something different. Sprints will be replaced with Track Relay races! We hope you enjoy the spectacle and make as much noise as you can during the running!**

The timetable for the day is as follows (with approximate timings):

- **9.30 to 10.30/10.45am** - All children will take part in mixed year group, mixed teams based on houses and do a circuit of field events on bases around the field.
- **10.30/10.45 am to 12.00pm** - All children will take part in mixed relay teams based on houses and not ability. There will be four races per year group. Year 3 races will be first and year 6 races last.
- **12.00pm-12.10pm** - If time permits there may be a parents race or two.

Please note that timings are approximate and may be earlier or later; so please do get there early to avoid disappointment.

Entry for parents is through the gate onto the Upper Field **via the alley** not via the school office. There will be a cordoned off area for parents to stand. There will be **no shade or seating** available for parents/carers so please bring your own foldable chair or parasol if required. Unfortunately, we are also **not able to offer toilets** for parents/carers.

All children wear their **school PE kits** to school on the day. Please ensure your child wears a labelled **hat or cap if it is hot and that you apply sun barrier cream** before leaving home. It would be great for children to bring in a **t-shirt in their house colour** to wear on the day. All children must bring in a **named water bottle**.

No food must be given to the children at all and the children will remain under the care of their teachers for the duration of the morning. They will have their lunch at the usual time. For those who have a school dinner, Twelve 15 will be doing a picnic lunch that day so all can eat on the field. If you could **help serve with the water bottle refill station** then please email the school office on office@wallacefields-jun.surrey.sch.uk⁶. If time, we hope to have a parent race at the end. So please wear appropriate footwear if you wish to take part. This event finishes as usual at lunchtime. Children will have lunch and return to class for the afternoon.

Children go home at the usual time at the end of the day and cannot be collected early.

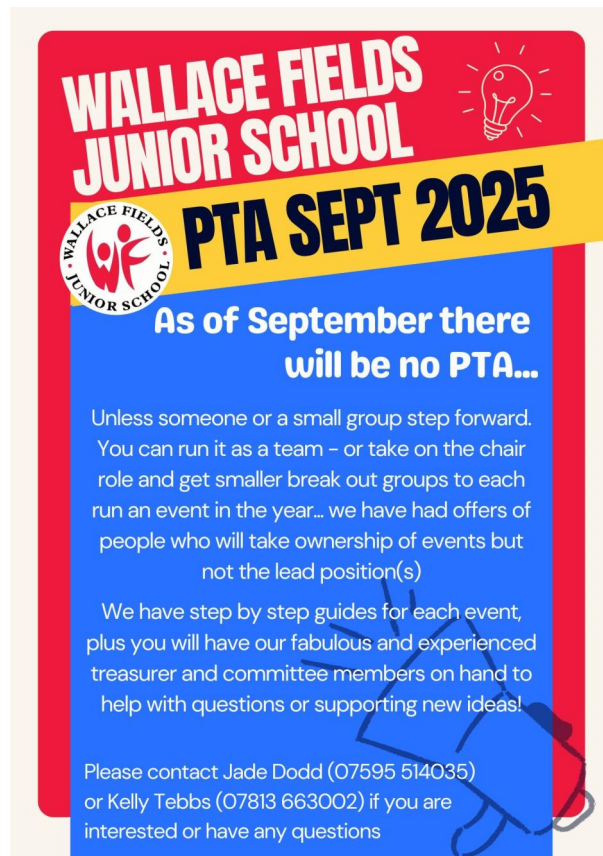

Sex and Relationship Education for Year 3

In our **Life Lessons (PSHE)** this term, we will be teaching children about their body parts and the underwear rule, through the use of recommended national resources such as the PSHE association. We will focus on which parts are private, and should not be touched or seen by other people.

The content of the lesson will cover: Naming parts of the body, “Appropriate” and “inappropriate” touching, Your child’s right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable, and Who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried

We will also be teaching our pupils the **NSPCC’s Underwear Rule**, using the ‘PANTS’ acrostic, which is a green cross code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for: **P**rivates are private. **A**lways remember your body belongs to you, **N**o means no, **T**alk about secrets that upset you, and **S**peak up, someone can help.

blend of tunes, step & clog dance, and song inspired by English traditions. Deb is in high demand as a ceilidh musician, playing primarily with Licence to Ceilidh and Ceilidh Tree.

Deb runs the Ealing Sessions folk music evening class and teaches music, song and dance regularly for The English Folk Dance and Song Society, as well as on a freelance basis for various workshop series, festivals and music services. She recently completed The Teaching Musician MA degree course at Trinity Laban Conservatoire, graduating with distinction, and has since launched The Fiddle Project, an integrated method for learning traditional English fiddle.

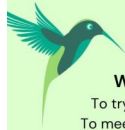

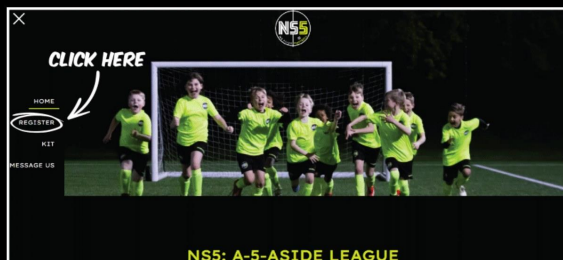
