#### **HEAD'S UPDATE**

#### **Year 6 Responsibilities**

As part of the school's drive to develop independence, resilience and get them secondary ready, the Year 6 children are given the chance to take on responsibilities. These range across the school to include things such as prefects, librarians, peer mentors, house captains, head teacher helpers, monitors, sports crew and digital leaders. The roles include key positions that will help develop their abilities to apply themselves, follow instruction effectively and work together as a team. They can put themselves forward for specific roles and many of them are keen to get involved. Not all Year 6 are expected to take on a responsibility, however, if they do choose to do this, it will be mentioned in their end of year report. The Year 6 children have found out what their particular responsibilities are going to be for the year. I was very keen to meet my new helper team and many of the roles will involve training to understand the responsibilities involved. There is more information on the Year 6 roles and ambassador elections below in the Year 6 section.

#### **Gas Main Update**

On Monday there was a vast amount of noise, traffic and machinery outside school and it was a hectic scene. Since then I have had meetings with the site manager and the health and safety officer of the company and discussed issues and ways of limiting danger and more consideration for those arriving at school. The company (Forefront Utilities) have agreed to remove all heavy machinery and vehicles for the drop off and pick up sections of the day. They have also installed much taller 'Heras' fencing to prevent the chances of anyone falling down a hole. The works have moved into St Johns

already and the work is being completed at a significant pace. The gas main is being fitted along one side of St Johns Road and in the coming weeks it will switch to the other side however I have been assured that the path on one side of the road will be clear for access and egress of the school. The traffic is severely impeded and so I would strongly advise you to walk if at all possible. The turning circle at the bottom of Dorling Drive is accessible however the road is restricted to one car width in places. Please make sure your children stick to the path and keep a safe distance from the temporary fencing. The clearance of the area seems to have helped the situation at drop off and pick up times.

#### **Geography Accreditation Award**

Congratulations to Mr William Taylor who has worked so hard on the school accreditation for geography from the Geography Society. The feedback was extremely positive and the geography curriculum came out as very strong with recognition of the enthusiasm and delivery of a very rich and varied curriculum. This award is external verification of the excellent geographical skills and development of the subject that goes on in school and this is in alliance with the extra orienteering programme that goes a long way to reinvigorate geography at Wallace Fields Juniors. ## **Wallace Fields Juniors Awarded Geography Quality Mark**

I am delighted to announce that Wallace Fields Junior School has successfully achieved the Geography Quality Mark. The school has achieved a Silver Award which shows that as a school we are an outstanding school for teaching geography. This accreditation is moderated and awarded by the Geographical Association highlighting many outstanding aspects of geography such as how well planned and coherent our curriculum is and how 'place' is investigated from a local to a global scale. The association also highlighted how pupils at Wallace Fields Junior School are given the opportunity to develop their opinions, how to think collaboratively and are encouraged to think critically.

Here are some of the strengths from the Geography Association report:

"A well thought through submission which clearly aims to show the topics studied and that they are chosen with a clear focus on the pupils at Wallace Fields Junior School providing them with an opportunity to think at different scales from local to global. The teaching and learning of geography is purposeful with opportunities for the children to think, speak and write like geographers. We particularly enjoyed the evidence provided of the Year 5 lesson plan, creating a model and video of a river, as well as the Year 6 exploration of a rainforest biome, where pupils designed their own rainforest water cycle to understand impact"

"The application process has been a positive one as well as having an impact on the children's learning. It has provided an opportunity to celebrate the amazing learning opportunities provided by Wallace Fields Junior School. As a result of compiling the PGQM and developing the curriculum the subject lead has invigorated staff and children alike about geography, which is clear in their testaments of how he has improved it".

#### **Please Name Label All School Uniform**

**Please ensure all school uniform is clearly name labelled.** If uniform is found then the Year 6 helpers make sure the item gets returned to the correct child.

There are lots of items currently in lost property labelled with children who are no longer at our school which may be cause these items have been bought second hand and not renamed. If lost they cannot be returned to their owner. It was great to see so many people supporting the PTA

#### Parents Must Handover to Staff at Morning Clubs and Wrap Around Care

Parents/carers must handover to staff at morning clubs such as Dodgeball and Tennis and JAG Wrap Around Club. They must **not** be left alone in the car park. Some staff have found children wandering around the car park in the morning alone which is safeguarding issue. If you are running late then call the club leader to make them aware and then wait with your child until a member of staff can take your child through to the club. The best way to avoid issues attending morning clubs is to allow a lot of time to be on time. The club leader waits for the majority at the main gate and then needs to go into school to start the club. Thank you for helping us keep the children safe. Parents picking up and dropping off at JAG are permitted to drive right into the staff car park (please drive extremely slowly).

### **NSPCC's Speak Out. Stay Safe**



#### Year 5 River Walk - Thursday 3rd October 2024

Year 5 are currently studying the journey of the river and its surrounding environment, we have organised a river walk and a visit to Bourne Hall to learn about the importance of the spring in Ewell. The trip is planned for Thursday 3rd October 2024 and we will be leaving school at 9.30am and returning to school at 3.00pm. Please note, pick up and drop off is as usual.

This trip will be highly beneficial in consolidating the work that we have done in the children's geography topic and will allow them to take a closer look at the features and habitats of a river and how people settled in Ewell in the past.

#### **Year 6 Roles and Responsibilities and The Ambassador Elections**

## **Apply for Secondary School Place Before October Half Term**

From 1st September 2024 you can apply for a secondary school place. **Surrey County Council suggest you submit your application by 25th October 2024** as this is the Friday before the half term holiday. Closing date for applications is 31st October 2024. Please also find attached below a Surrey County Council leaflet with important dates for applying.



#### How do I apply?

The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online. Visit surreycc, gow.uk/a/dmissions to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.

time from 1 September 2024 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2024. We would suggest you submit your application by Friday 25 October 2024, before the half term holiday.

- You can download the app ParentComms to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On 3 March 2025 you will receive an email with the outcome of you application and, if you have registe for ParentComms, you will also red a notification with the outcome.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer.

#### What else do I need to know?

- September or October, Please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings. You should contact schools directly if you'd like to arrange a visit.
- You can name up to six schools on your application form, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools.
- Schools will not know where you have ranked them on the application form so the order of your preferences does not disadvantage you.
- The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools.
- If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.
- If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them.
- If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.

- Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in addition to the application form. Find out more about supplementary information forms at
- If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough or district and the council tax account number for the property where your child normally lives. Otherwise you will be asked to provide evidence of where your child lives.
- When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receive a confirmation email which sets out your preferences and confirms your applicatio
- If you do not receive a confirmation email you should check your application to ensure
- If you write to us or submit information to support an application, remember to include your child's name, date of birth and application reference number (if you
- appied online].

  If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.

Please keep any second hand logoed uniform and bring into school for the next uniform sale by the PTA.




#### **CLUBS**

#### **Sign Up for Excellent Wrap Around Care - JAG!**

JAG offers either end of school until 6pm or after clubs (4.30pm) until 6pm. If you do not know whether your child has got into a club of their choice, JAG have recommended you book the full session and you can amend booking (up to 7 days before start of term) to the 4.30pm until 6pm slot on the days their child has a club.

Please remember that JAG will take on children after their club at school (usually around 4.30pm) - Kidsquest (at WFI) do not pick up after clubs so you must book JAG if you want your children to take part in after school clubs followed by wraparound care up to 6pm.

Welcome to the new JAG manager Nicola Boakes - she is very experienced in child care and has implemented more safeguarding measures to make sure the children are even safer. She is a very honest, open and friendly leader and we maintain good links with Nicola and her team to keep the children happy and safe.
