Farewell to Member of the Residents' Group

It is with great sadness that I heard of the passing of Ros Walker. Ros was resident on the Wallace Fields Junior School Liaison Group that meets every term to discuss local issues and explores ways of us being mutually beneficial. Ros was a regular contributor and she was

extremely efficient at chasing up councillors on a local and county level. She recorded the minutes for the group for many years and was always positive and supportive of the school. She helped the group achieve new road markings, helping clear the bridleway between our two fields and helped the group obtain proper street signage from the council. She had a lovely sense of humour and was always smiling. I would like to convey our sincerest condolences to Ros' family at this time and she will be missed by us here at the school.

Fire Drills, Lockdowns and Evacuations

With safeguarding being at the forefront of everything we do, it is important to remember that every term we carry out a fire drill, an evacuation practice and a lockdown drill. The children are very sensible and well behaved and the last drills were quick and efficient. The lockdown drills are carried out using low trauma examples - such as an air ambulance needing to land on the field so there is a need to come inside to avoid debris and keep them safe. The children are fairly indifferent to the experience. Staff are fully trained and the rehearsals always bring things to light that can be improved upon the next time. Evacuation follows the same routine as a fire drill, with relocation to the top field and if it were a real evacuation we convene in the infants. In the event of a real evacuation we have ensured that we are able to contact parents/carers remotely. We also test the software we use and checked that we are able to communicate fully with all people in the building at any given time. Well done to the children for being extremely mature and sensible during this term's recent practices.

Well Done Year 4

Well done to the Year 4 children who went to Ufton Court this week. They had an amazing time and returned excited and bursting with stories to tell. They told me they enjoyed all of it with highlights about the food, the feasting, the battles and the fun. The Ufton Court staff mentioned how impressed they were with the Year 4's behaviour and they wish all schools were as lovely as the Wallace Fields Junior children. This made us very proud and well done to all you parents for ensuring the children are polite, engaged and confident when away from home. My thanks also to the staff Mrs Curran, Mrs Kidwai, Mr Taylor, Mrs Murtagh and Mrs Garsden, and to the volunteer helpers Mrs de Bliques and Ms Hernandez-Ortiz.

Year 3 Trip to Butser Ancient Farm Thursday 27th March

Year 3 are very excited to be going on a trip to Butser Ancient Farm on Thursday 27th March 8.10 am to 3.30 pm. Please see below lots of important information about the day.

When do the children need to be at school?

THERE IS AN EARLY START FOR THIS TRIP Children need to arrive at 8.10am. It is an early start so please ensure your child is in school at 8.10 a.m. for registration as the coach will be **leaving school promptly at 8.20a.m.**

We will be leaving Butser at 2pm so should be **back at school for 3.30pm.**

Please check your email for any news on delays to this time, please do not call the School Office.

What do the children need to wear?

Butser Ancient Farm is an outdoor, muddy site. We will be completing activities that are outdoor, no matter what the weather!

Children should wear the following:

- **School uniform on their top half** – Jumper or cardigan, shirt and tie.
- **Casual clothing on their bottom half** such as jogging bottoms or jeans suitable for messy activities
- **Trainers** to wear all day that are suitable for muddy conditions
- All **MUST** bring a named **waterproof raincoat** as they will be outside all day.
- **Extra warm layers** such as vests, gloves, and warm hat if the weather is cold.
- **Sun cream and sun cap** if the weather is warm
- Butser Farm staff suggest an **extra pair of socks** can be a good idea too!
- The weather is forecast to be changeable so please keep an eye on weather and equip them appropriately
- We also ask that the children **bring a change of shoes and a plastic carrier bag** in their back pack so that children can put their muddy trainers away before entering the coach. The shoes and carrier bag should fit in their back pack so all possessions are kept in one place.

What do the children need to bring?

They should take a **water bottle and a packed lunch in a small back pack.** Bringing a packed lunch is part of the whole experience of going on a school trip. If you would like to extend the experience for your child, here are some suggestions for the sort of foods that would

have been available to people in Ancient Briton: Bread, butter, cheese, egg, ham, cooked meat, celery, apples, plums, and flapjacks. **No nuts or products containing nuts or sesame seed such as nutty flapjacks, sesame seed bread or Nutella products.** Please bring a **named water bottle**, which can be refilled with water from their taps.

Does your child have an allergy to farm animals?

Farm animals (goats, sheep and pigs) are on the site. If any children have specific allergies and may need *antihistamine medicine such as Piriton* products; then please let their class teacher know and provide a named container on the morning of the trip.

Does your child suffer from travel sickness?

The children will be going on a long coach journey so if they suffer from **travel sickness** please administer medicine before the journey and give their teacher (on the morning of the trip) named medicine for the return journey. All of the medicines held in the School Office such as inhalers and autoinjector pens (Epipens) etc. will be taken on the trip from school.

How do I pay and give permission for my child to go on this trip?

If you have not done so already, **please pay on Scopay**. The voluntary contribution is **£51** per child to cover the cost of two trips - Butser Farm trip and Wisley Gardens. Smaller instalments are available and financial assistance may be possible on request. We will treat payment as permission to take part in the trip.

Just a reminder, **we will no longer be posting individual, or small group photos**, though we will share further photographs via the weekly newsletter or the website after the trip.

YEAR 6

Year 6 Residential Trip to France – Passport and GHIC reminders

Passports - All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip.

If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:

- Less than 10 years old
- Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France. All parents will be invited to a passport collection point in the hall on **June 4th at 8.45am**. You will be required to provide your child's passport/ residents permit (if applicable), EHIC and pocket money.

If your child holds a non-EU/UK passport please confirm this on your consent form.

The current rules are that school age children do not require a Schengen Visa if travelling as part of a school trip. However, we will continue to check this for any rule changes in 2025 and keep you informed. If you hold a UK Residents Visa, please ensure you send this in with your child's passport.

EHIC/GHIC -All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC. You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is free of charge on the ¹¹NHS website^{12, 13}. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. **Please ensure you apply for this at least three months prior to the trip.**

You will be responsible for completing the order direct with the supplier and you will need to enter the following information:

- **Student Name** – This should be your child's full name (This is purely for delivery purposes and not what will be shown on the back of the hoodie)
- **E-mail Address** - Please enter your best contact e-mail address
- **Hoodie Colour** – You can view all colours available and then select your chosen colour from the drop down menu
- **Hoodie Size** – A sizing chart is available on the website. Please measure your child carefully as you are responsible for selecting the correct size from the drop down menu

OPTIONAL: Initials Not everyone wants the initials on the front so you have to opt in for this when you place your order. Please enter the initials you would like to be printed on the FRONT of the hoodie. There is a maximum of 4 characters and it will be printed in capitals. (Note this is an additional £2.50) The price is £18.99 for each hoodie. (+£2.50 for front initials)

Please make sure you press the order button where you will be directed to the payment page (please make sure you enter all the required information). The order is not complete until payment has been successful. The WFJS online shop is now open. **It will CLOSE at 10pm on Wednesday 23rd April 2025.** Please make sure you order as soon as possible to avoid missing the deadline. What Parents & Educators Need to Know about STREAMERS

Livestreaming has become a big part of the entertainment people consume, and what began as a series of gamers sharing their screens has grown into a huge industry packed with personalities - and potential risks for your children. With over 2.5 million people watching Twitch, the most popular streaming service, at any one time, it's important to remain aware of the risks associated with streamers.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some gaming streamers will stick to family-friendly titles, but others will play more violent games that tend to be more popular. Non-gaming streamers could, in theory, discuss just about anything, and some streamers will often stream in revealing outfits.

NEGATIVE INFLUENCES

While things have improved, streamers are often paid by companies to promote products, and this isn't always stated explicitly. While it's unlikely these goods will be harmful to your child, some streamers and influencers have engaged (knowingly or not) in scams in the past.

FINANCIAL HARM

Streamers will often have donation buttons on their screens for users to submit money. What can start as small amounts can quickly spiral as streamers engage with paying viewers more often, potentially leading to financial issues.

UNREALISTIC EXPECTATIONS

Influencers often showcase how glamorous their lives are, making some users feel as though they are lesser. However, it's important to stress that, in many ways, this is an act, or at the very least, not common. Logan Paul, who has been successful as a streamer and influencer, has a Pokemon card worth \$5 million, but this is atypical of anyone working in the medium.

MISINFORMATION

Streamers are, in many ways, just like us - and they can get things wrong or reel off an opinion without having thought about it. Some can simply say awful things to get a rise out of viewers or to sway them to their side of a hot topic.

ADDICTION AND SCREEN TIME

If your child is watching a lot of a particular streamer, it can be just as damaging to their social life as playing too many video games.

Advice for Parents & Educators

EXPLAIN HOW STREAMING WORKS

For a younger viewer, being a streamer or influencer seems aspirational, but it involves a lot of work and no small degree of good fortune. Streamers are often managed and unable to speak freely due to sponsors, and influencers are just that - influencing young minds, for better or for worse.

CHECK OUT STREAMING PLATFORMS

While Twitch was the de facto streaming service for years, YouTube has gained popularity, too. Then there are Kick and Rumble, which have grown in popularity with moves for big-name streamers - despite many being dogged by controversy.

DO NOT LOG PAYMENT INFORMATION

Streamers can reward donations with additional content, an on-camera "shout out" and more. If you're unsure about who or what your child is watching, consider avoiding linking payment information. This is especially notable with Twitch, which is owned by Amazon and therefore has some crossover.

SET SCREEN TIME LIMITS

You can set screentime limits for mobile apps on iOS and Google, but with other platforms like a PC it may be more difficult to keep tabs. Consider checking in regularly to ensure your children aren't watching content they shouldn't be.

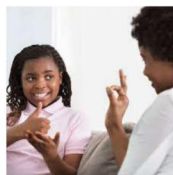
