Gas Main Works

They have reassured us that they will also repair the damaged surfaces on the island so there may still be some more work next outside the main gate soon though we hope it will be concluded over half term.

Thanks to the PTA and Parent Helpers

A big thank you to the parent helpers and PTA leads who made the Hallowe'en Disco such a huge success. The children had a great time and the hall and diner were cleared up very carefully ensuring that the mess was all gone after the disco and the school ready for use the next day. We do have a few lost property items from the event - these are in the lost property box in the quad. Thanks also to the staff who attended to help with monitoring and managing the children to ensure everything went smoothly - they were very generously giving their time after what has been a very long half term and their efforts are very much appreciated.

Air Tags and Trackers Ban

With the growth of technology and subsequent 'surveillance parenting', there has been a growth in popularity of air tags. These are location devices primarily used for finding keys and luggage, now being used to track children, many without their knowledge. We have banned these from trips and visits following the triggering of anti-stalking software on iPhones on trips, the lack of consent to track and the safeguarding issues that arise in revealing the exact locations of children who may have court orders, are looked after (fostered/in care) and those children that need to be protected from this tracking. The details are too many to go into so put simply, they will be removed from bags and rucksacks (using an app) before any trips or visits outside of school, so please remove them from your child's bag on the trip days. Any air tags or trackers found on children on a trip day will have it confiscated and the parent can collect it from the office directly (if the classes have not departed). If they are found on a trip they will be confiscated and the parent can collect from the main office on the return of the group.

This ban on trackers and Air tags on trips has been written into our mobile phone policy and includes a ban on smartwatches (that can take photographs) and other tracking devices (e.g. 'Tile'). Thank you for your understanding with these issues. Safeguarding is not compromised as if there is a serious incident on a trip or visit, the staff act in loco parentis, and will contact parents immediately.

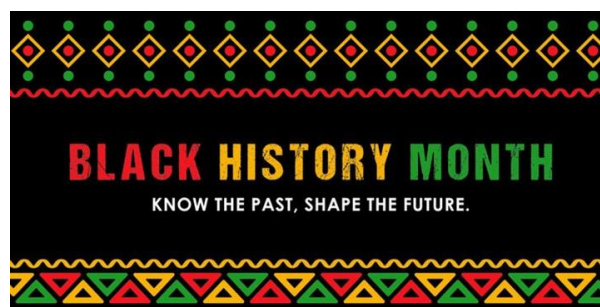

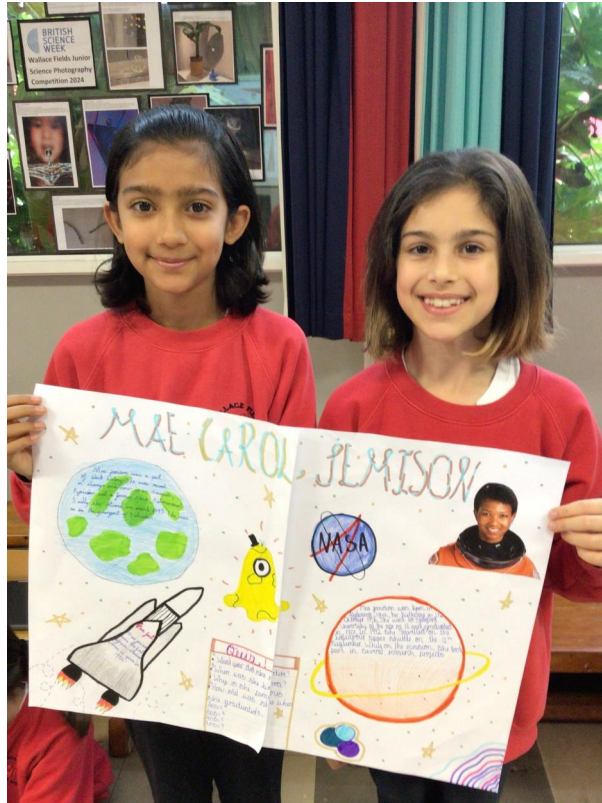
Wallace Fields Junior School Celebrating Black History Month

1 September 2024
You can apply online for a school place.

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.
By 17 March 2025
You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.
By 31 March 2025
For many schools, if you wish to appeal, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 18 June 2025. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

Is your child in year 6?
If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by **31 October 2024**.

How do I apply?

- The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online. Visit surreycc.gov.uk/admissions to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.
- You can start your online application any time from 1 September 2024 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2024. We would suggest you submit your application by **Friday 25 October 2024**, before the half-term holiday.
- You can download the app ParentComms to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On 3 March 2025 you will receive an email with the outcome of your application and, if you have registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by **17 March 2025**.

What else do I need to know?

- School open days will usually be held in September or October. Please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings. You should contact schools directly if you'd like to arrange a visit.
- You can name up to six schools on your application forms, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools.
- Schools will not know where you have ranked them on the application form so the order of your preferences does not disadvantage you.
- The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools.
- If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.
- If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them.
- If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.
- Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in addition to the application form. Find out more about supplementary information forms at surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.
- If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough or district and the council tax account number for the property where your child normally lives. Otherwise you will be asked to provide evidence of where your child lives.
- When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receive a confirmation email which sets out your preferences and confirms your application reference number.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email you should check your application to ensure its status has been changed to 'submitted'.
- If you write to us or submit information to support an application, remember to include your child's name, date of birth and application reference number (if you applied online).
- If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.

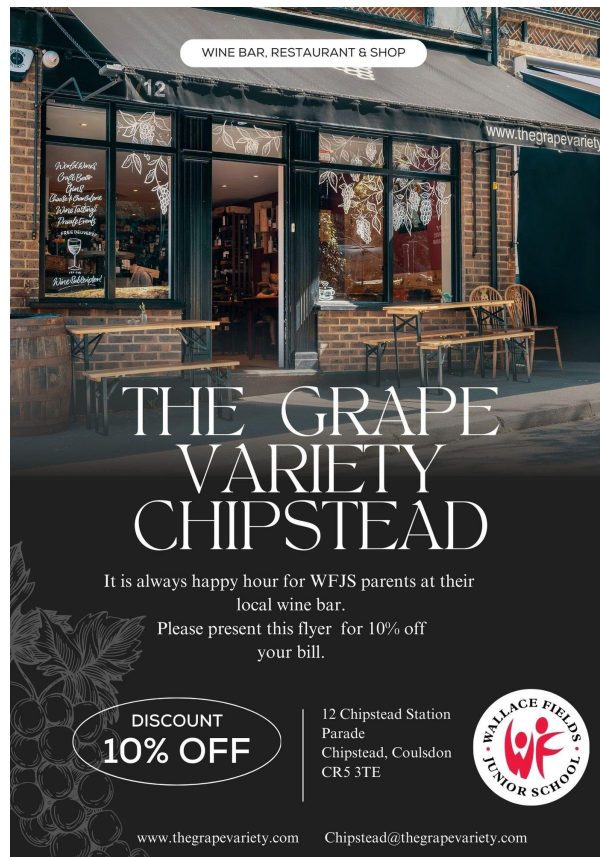

Winter Uniform After Half Term - No Polo Shirts

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators SUPPORTING YOUNG PEOPLE TO BUILD EMOTIONAL RESILIENCE

With increasing societal pressures, many children struggle with managing emotions, facing challenges and processing failure in a healthy way. This is why building emotional resilience in young people is vital for their mental health and personal success. This guide provides practical strategies for parents and educators to help children develop resilience and foster confidence, adaptability and a positive mindset.

- 1 ENCOURAGE OPEN COMMUNICATION**
Regularly engaging children in open dialogue fosters trust and emotional expression. Encourage them to share their thoughts and feelings freely without judgement. Let them know you're there to listen and support them. Use open-ended questions like "How's your day going?" or "What's your favourite part of school today?" to encourage them to express themselves openly.
- 2 MODEL POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR**
Children often learn how to manage emotions by observing adults. By modelling calm and positive responses to challenges, you can teach them how to handle their own. When you're faced with a difficult situation, verbalise your thoughts and explain how you managed to stay calm. For example, "I'm a bit worried, so I'm going for a walk to clear my head."
- 3 TEACH PROBLEM SOLVING SKILLS**
Helping children break down challenges into manageable steps encourages a positive mindset. Encourage them to enter a problem and identify what they can control. For example, "If you're struggling with a task, break it down into smaller steps. What's the first question for this?"
- 4 FOSTER A GROWTH MINDSET**
Encourage young people to view mistakes as learning opportunities. A growth mindset helps them see challenges as opportunities to learn and improve. Encourage them to set goals and celebrate small wins. For example, "You've improved your reading skills. Keep practicing and you'll see even more improvement. This reinforces the idea that effort and persistence lead to success."
- 5 PROMOTE SELF-CARE PRACTICES**
Teaching children about self-care helps them understand how to manage stress and maintain their mental health. Encourage them to engage in activities they enjoy, such as reading, listening to music, or spending time outdoors.
- 6 BUILD HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS**
Strong relationships with peers and adults provide a support system and enhance resilience. Encourage positive, respectful interactions with others. Parents or carers can model healthy relationships. Children can resolve conflicts with friends by modeling and practicing open communication.
- 7 SUPPORT EMOTIONAL AWARENESS**
Helping children to identify and name their emotions allows them to manage those feelings more effectively. When a child is upset, encourage them to talk to you about what they're feeling. Use simple words and phrases to describe their emotions. Encourage them to journal or draw to express their feelings.
- 8 ENCOURAGE INDEPENDENCE**
Giving children opportunities to make their own decisions builds confidence and problem-solving skills. A good example of this would be letting children choose their own lunch for school, guiding them with options but allowing them to assume responsibility for the task to help them take ownership.
- 9 DEVELOP COPING STRATEGIES**
Teaching children to manage their emotions, such as deep breathing or journaling, can help them to deal with stress. Encourage them to identify coping strategies when they're feeling overwhelmed. Practice these strategies together. Encourage them to use these techniques if they've been successful during stressful moments.
- 10 CELEBRATE SMALL WINS**
Recognising effort, no matter how small, reinforces positive behaviour and encourages children to keep trying. Celebrate a child's progress, such as completing a task or showing a different type of personal growth. For example, "You've been so good at staying on top of your work. It's great to see you so proud of your work."

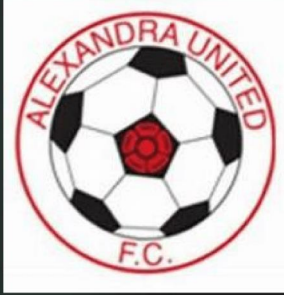

Schools will be performing songs and poems and placing poppy crosses to remember the loss of servicemen and women in all conflicts.

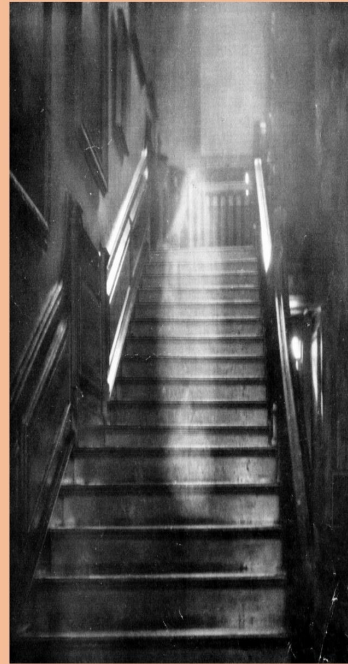
