Head's Update

Music Festival at Epsom Playhouse

Two fabulous performances this week at the Epsom Playhouse for the Epsom and Ewell Schools Music Festival. The selected children did a wonderful rendition of 'Lanterns' by Birds of Tokyo. The children sounded and looked great with some lovely harmonies and a few simple actions celebrating the singing skills of children from across the borough. My thanks and appreciation go to our music lead Mrs Johnstone who organised our performance at this event and also thanks to Miss Hallett and Mrs Baxter who helped during rehearsals and monitored the team backstage. Thanks to the parents and carers for supporting this event and coming along to watch and well done to all the children who performed as they did a fantastic job.

WF Infants and INSET days

We work as close as possible with the infants and enjoy joint staff meetings and joined events - along with PTAs that work on joined projects such as the annual fireworks and the circus. We discuss admissions together and in the past have worked with Surrey County Council on an admissions policy that helps parents with children in both schools or those who apply to come here after being at Wallace Fields Infants. We also work hard on transition and strive to ensure the journey from infants to juniors is as smooth as possible. The SENCos work closely ensuring support and learning issues are followed up and implemented when they join us.

Unfortunately there are differences between a school in an academy trust school (such as the infants) and a maintained school like us, who are supported by the local authority and sometimes this can produce a misalignment. Academy schools can have as many INSET trainings days as they wish and thankfully the infants still only take five - which is our limit as a locally maintained school. Secondly, academy trust schools often have two weeks off for October half term, and again thankfully, the infants only have one week - which is our limit in a maintained school.

In a maintained school, such as Wallace Fields Juniors, we must fulfil a minimum number of teaching days in the year for all the children and this limit does not apply to academy trust

schools. The infants try to match the number of days in their academic year although there are slight differences. We are starting back on 4th September 2025 and the academic year concludes on 21st July 2026 for the children. We have developed our curriculum around the National Curriculum and academy trust schools do not have to follow this so there will be differences.

INSET days are usually at the start to plan development priorities, midyear to review the school priorities and fulfil training such as first aid, professional training and safeguarding and at the end to review the school year. The infants have reviewed some of their dates and so some are aligned and some are not. In the same way other schools including secondary schools do not have the same INSET days, we can try to align as many as possible whilst understanding that an academy trust can ignore the requests of local schools and the community. The INSET dates that align are:

Wednesday 3rd September 2025, Monday 23rd February 2026, Wednesday 22nd July 2026.

Many families offset misaligned INSET days by helping each other out on those days by looking after a friend's children and then returning the favour on a future INSET to reduce pressures on work or commitments beyond the family. Whilst we recognise these offsets can be an inconvenience we are lucky that the academy does not choose to take many more INSET days or to insist on a double week for half term as we are simply not permitted to do this and the infants is trying to be as cooperative as possible. My thanks for your ongoing understanding and flexibility. My thanks to the infants for requesting a change of some dates to align better. Please keep an eye on the newsletter and the website for details of school dates and times.

Year 5 Biscuit Making

Year 5 will be having their Design and Technology (D & T) week next week - making biscuits. Children with allergies within the main biscuit recipe have been contacted separately to discuss alternatives for Thursday's making. Please find the recipe attached with a list of ingredients provided by the school and a list of items required between the pair. Each person will need a clean apron and a small Tupperware box. We will be sending the uncooked biscuits home on Thursday for baking at home - so you can all try the children's baked goods! Please let Miss Sarjeant or Mr Hurd know if you do not have the facilities to cook the biscuits at home on Thursday evening, so we can arrange a way for them to be cooked for Friday. If possible, please keep one biscuit behind for the children to bring back in on Friday for their evaluation. The children have paired up today to discuss possible healthy ingredients they might like to add. They have been encouraged to suggest items they know

they have in their cupboard already at home. We look forward to seeing the final biscuits on Friday! 😊

The Basic Biscuit Recipe

You are going to work in pairs; this recipe makes approximately 24 biscuits, depending on the size that you choose to make.

Ingredients (We will provide)

225g Self Raising flour
100g Margarine
100g Caster sugar
1 egg

You will need to bring in:

- 1 plastic bowl
- 1 plastic spoon
- 1 Tupperware box (to take uncooked biscuits home)
- Grease proof paper
- Scales
- Extra bowl for egg shell
- Apron (clean!)
- Additional ingredient

- Follow these simple instructions
 - Remember to follow the health and hygiene rules too!
1. Cream the sugar and margarine in the bowl, until light and fluffy.
 2. Add the egg and mix in.
 3. Now add your extra chosen ingredient or ingredients.
 4. Next, sieve in the flour and mix with a spoon to create dough.
 5. Split the dough into 2 portions and place into the smaller bowls
 6. Split your portion into smaller biscuit sized portions or roll out your dough and use a cutter.
 7. Place each biscuit in your Tupperware box, on greaseproof paper, as you complete each one.

Medicines / Medical Conditions Meeting – 30th April at 8.50am

If your child has a medical condition that requires medication or explanation, **please attend a brief individual medical meeting in the school hall on Wednesday 30th April 2025 at 8.50am – 9.15am.**

Please enter the school via the school office. You will be directed through to our Garden Room where you will meet with Mrs Bruen individually. All instructions and medicines including autoinjector pens (Epipens), spare inhalers and travel sickness tablets (if required)

should be given to Mrs Bruen on **Wednesday 30th April at 8.50 am**. Please ensure all appropriate medicine is supplied, even if your child suffers from only mild symptoms of asthma, or eczema, as indicated on your consent form. All medicines that children require must be clearly labelled, in their original packaging and with the child's name and full written instructions for administration and dosage. Only new treatments or medicines, which cannot be handed in before the half-term, such as antibiotics, should be given to Mrs Bruen on the actual morning of the trip at drop-off.

If your child needs travel tablets, please supply both the outbound and return tablets to Mrs Bruen. She will administer both outbound and return tablets prior to the journeys. Auto injector pens (Epipens etc) and inhalers will be taken from school on Tuesday morning and stored in insulated medical backpacks.

What should I do with my child's Autoinjector (Epipen) ?

Autoinjector pens / Epipens will be the responsibility of the adult first aiders who will accompany the children. However, if your child uses an Epipen, please supply an additional/ spare one in a named insulated carry bag to be given to Mrs Bruen on the day of the trip. Please **also** attend the medical meeting on **Wednesday 1st May at 8.45am** so that school held Epipens and care plans can be checked with parents. Year 5 Epsom Islamic Centre Visit – Wednesday 21st May 2025

As we are about to start studying Islam as part of our Faith and Philosophy curriculum in Year 5, we have organised a visit to the Epsom Islamic Centre, on Hook Road. This will give the children greater knowledge and apply their learning from the visit when we start the unit. The trip is planned for Wednesday 21st May 2025 and we will be leaving school at 9.00am prompt. Please ensure **your child is in school by 8:50am** as we want to do the register, toilet trips and water bottles before we leave at 9.00am. We will walk there and back, and will be back before lunch. Please note, **pick up is as usual** as we will be in school for lunch and the afternoon. Children do not need a packed lunch.

There is no charge for this trip as we will be walking to and from the centre and as we already have parental consent for local walking trips, we do not require any further permission.

Please make sure your child has a named water bottle and morning fruit snack for the trip (fruit or vegetables) and they are dressed appropriately with additional layers if the weather is not due to be dry. It is Year 5 PE day so the children will already be in their PE kits and trainers.

This trip will be highly beneficial and we are very grateful to Mrs Salam for helping us arrange this visit to inspire our upcoming Islam learning.

YEAR 5 and 6

Selected Year 5 and Year 6 Swimming - Continues in Summer Term

Following the recent swimming lessons, parents/carers of selected children have been emailed about continuing the swimming programme in the summer term to embed their skills and ensure they are competent in water. Lessons will continue on Monday mornings from 28th April at Epsom College. Due to bank holidays and school events, the lessons will be on the following dates: 28th April, 19th May, 2nd June, 9th June, 16th June (exc. Year 6 on French Trip) 23rd June and 7th July 2025. YEAR 6

Year 6 National Standard Level 2 Cycling Course

Each child in **Year 6 is given the opportunity to sign up take part in the Bikeability Training Scheme later in the Summer.** It will happen during the week commencing **19th May and 2nd June 2025** but we need to know numbers by Easter. The Level 2 qualification teaches cycling on roads with moderate traffic. Children taking part should already be able to cycle and have good control and balance on their bicycle. Children taking part must have a road worthy bicycle and helmet. The course is run by Surrey County Council so you will need to enrol and pay (£15 or free if eligible for Free School Meals) using the following link:

Year 6 Residential Trip to France – Passport and GHIC reminders

Passports - All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip.

If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:

- Less than 10 years old
- Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France. All parents will be invited to a passport collection point in the hall on **June 4th at 8.45am**. You will be required to provide your child's passport/ residents permit (if applicable), EHIC and pocket money.

If your child holds a non-EU/UK passport please confirm this on your consent form.

The current rules are that school age children do not require a Schengen Visa if travelling as part of a school trip. However, we will continue to check this for any rule changes in 2025 and keep you informed. If you hold a UK Residents Visa, please ensure you send this in with your child's passport.

EHIC/GHIC -All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC. You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is free of charge on the ⁹NHS website^{10,11}. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. **Please ensure you apply for this at least three months prior to the trip.**

Year 6 Leaver's Hoodies

It has been a tradition at Wallace Fields Junior School for Year 6 to order hoodies as part of the leavers' process. They are ordered now so we can receive them in time for the children to wear them on the French trip and other end year events. Your child can select the colour they want and all the class names will be printed on the back. Please read the following information carefully and complete the Google form and the online order on time, so we do not encounter delays with our order.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about BLUESKY SOCIAL APP

AGE RESTRICTION 13+
With an App Store rating of 13+ and Google Play rating Mature

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?
While Bluesky has been around since 2019, it's suddenly taken off in a big way thanks to a significant exodus from X (formerly Twitter). Indeed, it looks and behaves a lot like Twitter before Elon Musk bought the platform. Bluesky has been touted in recent months as a safer, more open-minded alternative to X – but like any social media site, it still has its share of risks.

NO PRIVATE ACCOUNTS
While most social networks allow accounts to be private, at the time of writing, all Bluesky accounts must be public. The development team has indicated this might change in the future, but the app is built on a public-first protocol. If private accounts are ever introduced, it may only be in a limited way – such as through the implementation of group chats.

INTERACTIONS WITH STRANGERS
Every account being public means that anyone can be contacted by anyone else. While users don't have to respond and can easily block people and move on, it does mean that youngsters are at particular risk of being contacted by scammers, messaged by predatory adults or exposed to others with ill intentions. These hazards can be compounded by the fact that Bluesky doesn't require its users to provide their real name.

TROLLING AND BULLYING
While Bluesky currently feels a lot friendlier than X seems to have become, its lack of private accounts means that there's nothing to stop users from trolling and cyberbullying younger people. While accounts can be blocked and reported, a persistent bully could simply create a new profile, potentially making their victims feel unsafe in continuing to use the app.

DANGEROUS MISINFORMATION
Established news organisations have fact-checking and editing processes, but social networks have no such controls and can often serve as breeding grounds for misinformation and disinformation. Bluesky will possibly be no different once it reaches a certain size, and children may not have the critical thinking skills to tell fact from fiction – or to discern an informative, honest user from a malicious one.

ADULT TARGET AUDIENCE
Bluesky isn't designed with children in mind, and there aren't many parental controls on the platform. In an interview with the BBC, Bluesky's CEO originally said that the app would only allow users aged 18 and above to sign up, but a spokesperson later clarified its age restriction as 13+. This could imply the app was originally meant for an adult audience and suggests that making the platform more child-friendly might not currently be a priority.

RAPID GROWTH
At the time of writing, Bluesky seems calm in comparison with other social networks where moderation is lax and the atmosphere toxic – but that's due at least in part to its smaller community. The app has recently been adding as many as a million users per day, and if that continues, there'll be more unpleasant users to handle, and moderators could struggle to maintain the pleasant environment Bluesky is currently known for.

Advice for Parents & Educators

USE THE ADULT CONTENT FILTER
Bluesky doesn't have much in the way of parental controls, but there are content filters which can hide sexual and graphic imagery. These are enabled by default for underage accounts but can be manually turned on in the 'Moderation' section of the app's settings. The 'advanced' Moderation Service lets you restrict content even further, hiding – for example – self-harm content, extremist rhetoric, and even rude posts.

LOOK OUT FOR FAKES
Impersonation is a problem on all social networks. While the consequences are usually benign, imposters sometimes attempt to scam or groom children by pretending to be a popular influencer or online personality. Bluesky is unique in that it can be connected to official domains, with users' handles linking to other sites; while this isn't widely used right now, it could be a reliable way to verify celebrities and public figures in future.

ENCOURAGE BLOCKING AND REPORTING
Another tool that Bluesky uses to ensure a decent experience is muting and blocking accounts. The former prevents you from seeing a specific user's content, while the latter stops them from seeing yours. If a child is encountering trolls or bullies on the platform, encourage them to use this function, while also reporting the offenders to help make the platform a nicer place for everyone.

KEEP AN OPEN DIALOGUE
As with all social media platforms, moderation and content filters can only do so much. It's highly likely that a child will eventually face something unsettling. For that reason, it's important to make sure that young people are aware of the risks and know how to handle the technology if anything they see on the app makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable.

The team requires a manager to support the team administration. A parent/coach usually works well in this role. The manager will be responsible for team sign-up and match day management.

SELECT YOUR PLAYERS

Teams are formed through friendship, school, sports clubs, or in your neighbourhood. So select between 5-8 players and agree on a team name. We require teams to enter school year group leagues so please consider this.

CHOOSE YOUR VENUE

We are currently in process of launching a number of venues over the next year so please select your chosen venue during registration and stay in touch for more venues coming soon!

COMPLETE REGISTRATION

Please register your team. We will require specific information for each individual player such as date of birth. We suggest using our player invitation and sending this to the team manager. Payment will be taken at registration.

PLACE YOUR KIT ORDER

We will require players to wear the NS5 team kit which can be submitted by the whole team. We require each player's name and date, size along with their squad/team name.

STAY INFORMED

Please do stay in touch and up to date. Upon sign up you will have an account giving you access to fixtures and timings. We also have social media platforms on Facebook and Instagram search NS5 Football which provide further information.

Registering your team is a breeze with our streamlined process designed for your convenience. To get started, simply visit our website at ns5.co.uk. Fees are charged per season and are expected to be settled ahead of game week 1.

Select **EPSOM** as your venue. You will then be presented with a list of year groups. Navigate through the list and select the **YEAR GROUP** into which you wish to enter a team. This selection process is crucial as it ensures that participants are grouped appropriately based on their age and skill level. You will then be taken to **CREATE AN ACCOUNT**.

We understand that many are eager to participate, and we are committed to expanding opportunities as demand grows. As teams register and we assess the capacity, we will open up additional leagues when possible.
