Head's Update

School Council Achieving Change

The School Council consists of two members of each class (sixteen children in all) who are elected by the class to represent children's ideas in school. This is part of what is known as 'pupil voice' and enables the children's opinions and ideas to be discussed in a formal and cooperative atmosphere. They meet with me every month and the minutes of the meeting are shared with the school governors. They have achieved a number of things over time and in more recent times they have asked for improvements in some of the day to day things. By listening to the children we get a real picture of their perception and improve things that are important to them. Here are a few of the things they have achieved this past year so far:

Quiet Area: This was moved to the skipping area as the quiet area in the shade sale area was not actually that quiet. There have been a number of benches and seating moved to the skipping zone to create a new quieter space to sit, read and chat in peace.

Playground Markings/Marked Games: School Council asked for more playground markings and this was completed. There is a circuit, reflection and skill games and we got the netball courts and playground remarked whilst they were doing that. They have recently had a second Champ Square marked out and it looks great.

Birthday Book Donations: A better way of recognising a child's birthday without the hassles of allergies or gifting the whole class with a small token or anything edible. Children get a certificated book that goes into the library and a personal certificate of donation to take home.

Playground Equipment: More equipment on the playground including the return of scoops.

School Dinners and Lunchtimes: A lot of feedback from the children is about the school lunches and the routines at lunchtime. I have recently met up with the managers of our school lunches (Twelve15) and discussed feedback from the pupil questionnaire feedback and individual issues arising. It was a very productive meeting with exciting plans to improve the choices and quality of the dinners. There will be taster sessions organised for the School Council (and in the future parents/carers) to get ideas and opinions on the new planned menus and options. More choice is something we hope to improve and thereby drive up the popularity of school dinners whilst meeting all the dietary and allergy needs simultaneously.

All Weather Pitch: Completed in the summer after several years of fundraising and school /PTA funds made up the difference. School Council were also involved in the creation of a rota for the use of the all weather pitch.

Outdoor Classroom: This Octagonal classroom was bought with PTA contributions. It is in full use and the Sports Crew hold activities every lunchtime in there. It is also good for outdoor classrooms and a meeting point for orienteering lessons.

Guinea Pig Booking System: Clearer guidelines to ensure children get to see Chocolate and Cream, our school guinea pigs.

My thanks to all the school councillors who contribute well in all meetings and take their role very seriously. They are a very potent voice for pupils and they hold sessions with their classes every month before the next meeting. A very vocal and enthusiastic force for change and school improvement.

Your Donations Are Needed As Funding is Being Squeezed

In a school where state school funding is lower than we would like, voluntary contributions and fundraising are vital. As per the recent Government Spring Statement and recent news stories, the funding we are now set to receive is being squeezed and is certainly insufficient to cover inflationary costs and expected wage rises.

We would like to thank our fantastic PTA who raise significant funds that allow us to keep offering a distinctive education such as the outdoor classroom, whole school experiences (e.g. dance workshops), the final contribution for the artificial pitch and furnishing the new

Garden Room. They would love to help us next term by match funding on additional Chromebooks.

We would also like to thank families who have donated to the School Fund this year – which again allows us to fund the extras that we wouldn't be able to from DfE funding alone - to fund projects such as the artificial pitch and the structural work we needed to convert the old computing suite to the new Garden Room – it really is a beautiful space now.

Our next large capital project is IT related – we are moving the school from traditional IT servers located in school to a cloud-based solution - an invaluable asset for schools in today's digital age. Coupled with this, we are moving the school fully to Windows 11 making us digitally secure. 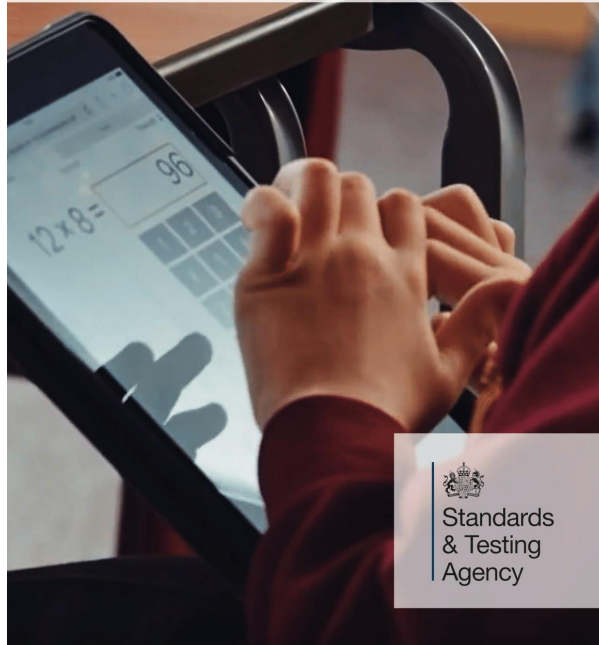

Year 4 Multiplication Table Check

The Multiplication Table Check (MTC) is taking place after the half term between 2nd-13th June. The handout has been given out in autumn and spring terms explaining the multiplication table check; it is below again for reference. **Please encourage your children to use the 'Soundcheck' area on Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS)**. Completing sessions in this area will prepare your child for the check in June, with a very similar setup to the real test. We do lots of practice in school and the children have made outstanding progress with their tables over the year. The Year 4 team have worked incredibly hard to prepare the children for the check and will continue to focus on times tables next half term ahead of June. Information for parents: multiplication tables check



Do you have a child in year 4 at primary school?

If so, your child will be participating in the multiplication tables check (MTC) in June.

The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify if your child may need additional support.

What is the multiplication tables check?

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

What if my child cannot access the check?

There are several access arrangements available for the check, which can be used to support pupils with specific needs. Your child's teacher will ensure that the access arrangements are appropriate for your child before they take the check in June.

The check has been designed to be inclusive and accessible to as many children as possible, including those with special educational needs or disability (SEND) or English as an additional language (EAL). However, there may be some circumstances in which it will not be appropriate for a pupil to take the check, even when using suitable access arrangements.

If you have any concerns about your child accessing the check, you should discuss this with your child's school.

Do I need to do anything to prepare my child for the check?

No, you do not need to do anything additional to prepare your child for the check. As part of usual practice, teachers may ask you to practise times tables with your child.

Schools will have unlimited access to a 'try it out' area from April. They can use this to make sure pupils have the necessary support to access the check. This includes opportunities for pupils to familiarise themselves with the check application and try out any access arrangements that may be required.

How will the results be used?

Schools will have access to all their pupils' results, to allow them to identify pupils who need additional support.

Will I receive feedback on my child's check?

Yes. Your child's teacher will share your child's score with you. There is no pass mark for the check.

Year 5 Marchants Hill Residential Trip – 6th to 9th May 2025

Medicines Drop Off / Medical Conditions Meeting – 30th April at 8.50am

If your child has a medical condition that requires medication or explanation, **please attend a brief individual medical meeting in the school hall on Wednesday 30th April 2025 at 8.50am – 9.15am.**

Please enter the school via the school office. You will be directed through to our Garden Room where you will meet with Mrs Bruen individually. All instructions and medicines including autoinjector pens (Epipens), spare inhalers and travel sickness tablets (if required) should be given to Mrs Bruen on **Wednesday 30th April at 8.50 am.** Please ensure all appropriate medicine is supplied, even if your child suffers from only mild symptoms of asthma, or eczema, as indicated on your consent form. All medicines that children require must be clearly labelled, in their original packaging and with the child's name and full written instructions for administration and dosage. Only new treatments or medicines, which cannot be handed in before the half-term, such as antibiotics, should be given to Mrs Bruen on the actual morning of the trip at drop-off.

If your child needs travel tablets, please supply both the outbound and return tablets to Mrs Bruen. She will administer both outbound and return tablets prior to the journeys. Auto injector pens (Epipens etc) and inhalers will be taken from school on Tuesday morning and stored in insulated medical backpacks.

What should I do with my child's Autoinjector (Epipen) ?

Autoinjector pens / Epipens will be the responsibility of the adult first aiders who will accompany the children. However, if your child uses an Epipen, please supply an additional/ spare one in a named insulated carry bag to be given to Mrs Bruen on the day of the trip. Please **also** attend the medical meeting on **Wednesday 30th May at 8.45am** so that school held Epipens and care plans can be checked with parents. Year 5 Epsom Islamic Centre Visit – Wednesday 21st May 2025

As we are about to start studying Islam as part of our Faith and Philosophy curriculum in Year 5, we have organised a visit to the Epsom Islamic Centre, on Hook Road. This will give the children greater knowledge and apply their learning from the visit when we start the unit. The trip is planned for Wednesday 21st May 2025 and we will be leaving school at 9.00am prompt. Please ensure **your child is in school by 8:50am** as we want to do the register, toilet trips and water bottles before we leave at 9.00am. We will walk there and back, and will be back before lunch. Please note, **pick up is as usual** as we will be in school for lunch and the afternoon. Children do not need a packed lunch.

There is no charge for this trip as we will be walking to and from the centre and as we already have parental consent for local walking trips, we do not require any further permission.

Please make sure your child has a named water bottle and morning fruit snack for the trip (fruit or vegetables) and they are dressed appropriately with additional layers if the weather is not due to be dry. It is Year 5 PE day so the children will already be in their PE kits and trainers.

This trip will be highly beneficial and we are very grateful to Mrs Salam for helping us arrange this visit to inspire our upcoming Islam learning.

Selected Year 5 and Year 6 Swimming - Continues in Summer Term

Following the recent swimming lessons, parents/carers of selected children have been emailed about continuing the swimming programme in the summer term to embed their skills and ensure they are competent in water. Lessons will continue on Monday mornings from 28th April at Epsom College. Year 6 National Standard Level 2 Cycling Course

Each child in **Year 6 is given the opportunity to sign up take part in the Bikeability Training Scheme later in the Summer.** It will happen during the week commencing **19th May and 2nd June 2025** but we need to know numbers by Easter. The Level 2 qualification teaches cycling on roads with moderate traffic. Children taking part should already be able to cycle and have good control and balance on their bicycle. Children taking part must have a road worthy bicycle and helmet. The course is run by Surrey County Council so you will need to enrol and pay (£15 or free if eligible for Free School Meals) using the following link:

Passports - All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip.

If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:

- Less than 10 years old
- Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France. All parents will be invited to a passport collection point in the hall on **June 4th at 8.45am**. You will be required to provide your child's passport/ residents permit (if applicable), EHIC and pocket money.

If your child holds a non-EU/UK passport please confirm this on your consent form.

The current rules are that school age children do not require a Schengen Visa if travelling as part of a school trip. However, we will continue to check this for any rule changes in 2025 and keep you informed. If you hold a UK Residents Visa, please ensure you send this in with your child's passport.

EHIC/GHIC -All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC. You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is free of charge on the ⁷NHS website^{8,9}. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. **Please ensure you apply for this at least three months prior to the trip.**

Year 6 Leavers' Hoodies

It has been a tradition at Wallace Fields Junior School for Year 6 to order hoodies as part of the leavers' process. They are ordered now so we can receive them in time for the children to wear them on the French trip and other end year events. Your child can select the colour they want and all the class names will be printed on the back. Please complete the Google form and the online order on time, so we do not encounter delays with our order.

Firstly on the Google Form indicate you are happy for your child's name to be printed and what name you wish to appear on the back. Typically all the current Year 6 are added so if this is not your wish you must indicate that.

OPTIONAL: Initials Not everyone wants the initials on the front so you have to opt in for this when you place your order. Please enter the initials you would like to be printed on the FRONT of the hoodie. There is a maximum of 4 characters and it will be printed in capitals. SAFEGUARDING and WELLBEING

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about INSTAGRAM (Age Restriction 13+)

Instagram remains one of the world's most popular social media platforms, especially among teens – with around 70% of 13 to 17-year-olds using it. Owned by Meta, Instagram allows users to share photos and videos, create interactive 'stories', broadcast live, send private messages and follow others. With regular updates and new features, it's essential for parents and educators to stay informed about how children are using the app – and what the risks are.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- EXCESSIVE SCREEN TIME:** Instagram's design encourages prolonged use through endless scrolling and autoplaying content. Excessive use can lead to sleep deprivation, reduced productivity, and increased anxiety, which may disrupt their day-to-day activities.
- AI CHATBOT CONCERNS:** Meta's AI, which is available on Instagram, allows users to chat with an AI persona. While often helpful, it can blur boundaries for young users, who may not be or need someone that is inappropriate or see it as a real friend or confidant. Always ensure one-on-one conversations may not be as secure or private as children believe.
- RISKS OF GOING LIVE:** The Broadcast feature allows real-time broadcasting to followers or anyone. If the account is public, this increases the chance of unwanted contact from strangers and pressure to act in ways that gain attention, including engaging in inappropriate behaviour. Viewers may also post offensive or harmful comments during live sessions.
- THREADS INTEGRATION:** Threads is Instagram's sister app for public, text-based conversations. Posts from Threads appear in users' Instagram feeds and can lead children to more direct and personal conversations with strangers. The content may not always be age-appropriate and can be misleading or false.
- SCHEDULED MESSAGING:** Instagram's new ability to schedule direct messages means that children could receive messages later at night or during the morning. This can disrupt their sleep or keep them preoccupied before the school day even begins.
- EXCLUSION AND LOW SELF-WORTH:** Feeling left out online can have a real emotional impact. Being left out of photos, receiving fewer likes, being unfollowed, or being ignored in chats and comments can leave children feeling excluded, which often leads to negative self-talk. There is a risk this can lead to reduced self-esteem and a sense of not belonging.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- USE INSTAGRAM'S SUPERVISION TOOLS:** Instagram built its Family Centre to help parents monitor how much time their child spends on the app. Specialist 'teen controls' are parents by default and other controls are on the message thread. Make sure that children use their toolkits when registering their account to ensure they have these protections.
- OPEN UP THE CONVERSATION:** Talk regularly to the children in your care about what they enjoy on Instagram – and what makes them uncomfortable. Encourage honest chats about filters, body image, and online approval. Reassure them that they don't need to add their appearance or others' likes to feel valued.
- MEET OUR EXPERT:** Dr Claire Sutherland is an online safety consultant, educator and researcher who has delivered and presented on digital safety and cyber security for schools. She has written various guidance papers and worked for several of the education government's key advisory bodies, including the Department for Education, the UK's first government-commissioned, user-centred research on the online safety of young people in the UK, USA and Australia.
- SET BOUNDARIES FOR THREADS AND AI:** Parents should monitor their child's usage of Threads. These allow parents to monitor time spent in the app, check follower lists and suggest exposure to sensitive content. Contact 1010 for more help with Threads or check out our chatbots over 11 real people and should be used with care.
- BE MEDIA-SAVVY WITH INFLUENCERS:** Parents should follow a list of the influencers their child watches, so they can better understand the content they're seeing. Use the new algorithmic tool about the difference between genuine recommendations and paid promotions – and how online personalities can shape opinions and beliefs.

Wallace Fields Junior School Book Club – Spring Term Update

We have covered a lot of ground in book club since the beginning of the academic year:

SEPT 24 - We discussed what we'd read over the summer hols and then chose from books around the question **What if...?** E.g. *Loki* - (what if you were a Greek God trapped in the body of an 11 year old schoolboy) or *The Last Life of Lori Mills* (what if your gaming characters broke out of the screen and into your home?)

OCT 24 - For Halloween we talked about books we found scary and funny things we'd done - hiding the book, reading with the lights on etc and chose from Strange & Spooky reads including *Gobbolino the Witch's Cat*, *The Beast and The Bethany*, *The Cat Mummy*, *Bunnacula* and *Ghost Boys*.

NOV 24- In the month of the US Presidential election, we talked about American authors/books we'd read and discussed the question - 'If you could recommend one book to Donald Trump what would it be and why?' We chose from books by American authors, set in the US or with a political theme. These included *Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing*, *The World According to Humphrey*, *The Wild Robot* and *The Accidental President*, *Front Desk*, *Holes* and *Alistair Campbell Talks Politics*.

DEC 24 - we talked about which book we might like to find in our Christmas stocking and chose from books with a **wintry** theme including *Sprouts*, *The Snowman Code*, *Murder by Narwhal*.

JAN 25 - In cold and rainy January, we spirited ourselves away with books on an **Ocean** theme, including *A Boy and a Bear in a Boat*, *We Won an Island*, *Julia and the Shark*, *Peril on the Atlantic* and *The Somerset Tsunami*. I challenged the children to pay as little as possible for a cool read by finding a book in a charity shop or at a book sale.

FEB 25 - Reading is a superpower so we looked at books with a **heroic** theme including *My Brother is a Superhero*, *El Deafo*, *Solving Crimes is Not my Superpower*, *Dexter Proctor*, *Night Bus Hero* and *Worst.Superhero.Ever* We did a fun activity where we created our own book title and then I challenged the children to create the cover art for the book.

MAR 25 - O.G. Vs Newbie - We discussed how authors often put a new spin on an existing idea and challenged ourselves to read a pair of books for example '*The Twits*' by Roald Dahl and '*The Twits Next Door*' by Chris Smith; *Malory Towers* by Enid Blyton vs *New Class at Malory Towers* by Patrice Lawrence; *The Borrowers* by Mary Norton vs *The Smidgens* by David O'Connell; *Journey to the River Sea* by Eva Ibbotson vs *Escape to the River Sea* by Emma Carroll. I challenged the children to think about how they'd put a new spin on one of their favourite books by adding new characters to an existing world, taking the story to an exciting place or using an existing book as a jump off for their own new version.

APR 25 - We did our end of term **Easter quiz** featuring pixelated book covers and have some fabulous reads to keep us busy over the holidays from authors who started out with other jobs including *Diary of a Future Billionaire* by Pamela Butchart (also a teacher) *Adventures of the Rap Kid* by MC Grammar (also a teacher); *How to Rollerskate with One Leg* by Ella Dove (also a journalist); *The Girl Who Wasn't There* by Jacqueline Wilson (also a journalist) and

Small Fry by David Baddiel (also a comedian). Our task over the holidays is to reach out to an author via a letter and see who replies!

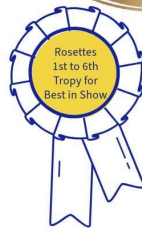
