# **Take Care When Cycling or Walking to School**

A polite reminder that if your child is cycling or walking to school please remind them to make sure they are paying attention and looking both ways when turning across a road and not to walk with a mobile phone in their hand.

We received the following messages from parents today

"A year 5 pupil cycled straight across in front of a car at the top of Wallace Fields this morning not looking and the car was going at a speed! Very near miss!"

"There was a phone mugging at 3.30pm yesterday afternoon, not far from school. Two year 8 Glyn boys were targeted by 3 men in their 20s. The boys were unhurt and all 3 men arrested. The area it happened is usually very safe and at that time of day some Wallace fields infant school parents saw the men (not the incident) as they came home with their children."


















# **NEXT WEEK and DATES COMING SOON**

### **Ear Piercing**

With the summer holidays approaching it is important to remind you that if you are thinking of getting your child's ears pierced the beginning of the summer holidays is the best time. This will give enough time for the ears to heal and for the removal of earrings.

Pupils are only allowed pierced gold/silver stud earrings and they cannot be worn during P.E. If your child is unable to remove their earrings they will not be allowed to participate in P.E. or games – we do not allow pupils to cover earrings with plasters. # **Epsom and Ewell Ghost Writers and Poetry Competition**

On **September 14th 2024** Bourne Hall Museum will be celebrating some of the famous writers connected to the local area. All have passed hence ghost writers.

There will be four re-enactors playing the writers details of which are below. To run alongside the event, we are holding a poetry competition for local children to write poems on what they like about the local area or a local place.

These will be judged by the poet Ana Mclaughlin in the following age groups 5-8, 9-12, and 13-16. If there is the demand, we could add and further older age group. The top three in each group will win a signed copy of her new anthology Heroes and Villains, which will be presented by her at a special event in October at Bourne Hall. Poems should be emailed to me at dbrooks@epsom-ewell.gov.uk<sup>16</sup> or dropped off at the Bourne hall reception desk by the 14 September.

Mrs Beeton the Victorian author of the Book of Household Management, wrote one of the most famous cookery books ever published. The first instalment, published in 1861, was an immediate success, selling over 60,000 copies in its first year and nearly two million by 1868. She lived in Epsom for many years before her marriage.

Robert Fabian was a police officer, who rose to the rank of Detective Superintendent in the Metropolitan Police. After retirement from the force in 1949, he worked as crime writer. His work was dramatised in the 1954–6 BBC drama series Fabian of the Yard based on his book of the same name centred on New Scotland Yard. He lived locally and died in Epsom Hospital in 1978.

Samuel Pepys had the best-documented life of his time, not just because he was a key figure running the Royal Navy, but because the nine-year period covered by his diary gives a unique insight into his daily actions and innermost thoughts. During this period Pepys visited our area on six occasions: once in 1663, four times in 1665 and once in 1667. He spent time in Ewell and Nonsuch Palace. He makes it clear that he was already well-acquainted with the area: a cousin lived at Ashtead and Samuel spent time there as a boy.

Charles Dickens, the greatest novelist of the Victorian period, created some of literature's best-known fictional character. His novels and short stories enjoyed unprecedented popularity during his lifetime and are still widely read today. Dickens visited and wrote about the Derby, and it even appears in one of his books. He once said that you could fire a cannon ball down Epsom High Street 364 days of the year and it would hit no one, but take out half of England on the 365th – Derby Day.

#### Romans Britannia Group of re-enactors

Meet the new Roman governor of Britain as he stops over in Ewell, protected by members of the Praetorian Guard, to make an offering to the sacred springs. The governor has arrived in Ewell coming up from the South Coast on the new road built as a route to London. His encampment contains many of his entourage; they will show visitors the Roman way of life, food, trades, and crafts. The governor will be looking to recruit men for the army, while gladiators will fight to the death to entertain him, hoping to win a chance to fight in the imperial city. Roman Ewell was a stopping-off point on this road where folk could rest, eat, and stay the night. They could also make an offering of a coin or brooch in the sacred spring or leave a larger offering in one of the sacred shafts dug deep in the chalk just outside the settlement. Each shaft was sealed with the bones of three dogs to protect them.

Ewell Grove Talk Part of the CBA Festival of Archaeology Thursday 18 July 7.30pm to 8.30pm At Bourne Hall, £6 per person

Ewell Grove hides a long history from the Bronze Age through the Romans up to modern times. Traces of the Iron Age and Roman settlement have been found there and it became the site of Ewell's Saxon cemetery. Its secret tunnels and the traces of Nonsuch Palace in its boundary wall add to its mystery.

# Prehistory Exhibition Part of the CBA Festival of Archaeology 15 July to 31 December 2024



Visit Bourne Hall Museum's exhibition on life in the area during prehistory. Items on display from the Stone Age to the Iron Age telling how folk came to its spring to hunt and drink and how during the Bronze Age the spring became a place where the gods lived, and gifts were thrown in as offerings. On display will be the bones of an aurochs, a now extinct ancestor of modern cattle. This one died some 3500 years ago and was buried on Epsom Downs. Aurochs survived well into modern times, the last known individual dying in 1627. The size of the aurochs bulls varied between 155 cm and 180 cm, depending on the local circumstances. The size of cows was between 135 cm and 155 cm. Bulls were significantly larger than cows. The body shape of an aurochs was different from many developed cattle breeds today.
