# **HEAD'S UPDATE**

### Welcome to the New Year 3

A huge welcome to the new Year 3 children who have effectively used this half week to settle into school routines. With the academic pressure off, the focus has been on getting organised, knowing the school site, getting to know the school systems and rules and learning how to ensure they are safe and happy in school.

It has been a joy to meet them and I have had a couple of specific talks with Year 3 at the end of the assembly and in their classes. They are already getting used to expectations in Key Stage 2 (juniors) and most have been keen to take on more responsibility and be accountable for their choices.

Their positivity and energy is a good sign and they are running into school now, keen to start each day.

### **Stars of the Week**

This week's Stars of the Week have been awarded their certificates. They have been outstanding in an aspect of our BELIEVE ethos and they each earn five house points for their respective houses. Well done to all of them for making an impression so early in the term. Two brothers from different classes managed to make the line up in the same week. Congratulations!



### **Update on Exciting Summer Building Projects**

There were a number of big school premises projects that started over the summer.

The former computing suite is been redesigned into a more flexible space, since the children no longer visit a room for computer studies and now complete their technical work and computing skills on Chromebooks in the classroom. This project includes fitting a dividing wall in the computer suite to create two usable and expandable spaces - one side a sensory classroom and a meeting room. The sensory room will be a breakout space for children with special needs and also available for intervention groups as well. This will provide two learning spaces rather than one and the meeting

room will be a more formal environment whilst the sensory room will be kitted out to create a safe space and have additional sensory resources within it. There is a lot of work to be done still and you will be kept updated as it develops.

The second big project is the installation of a multi use games area (MUGA) or all-weather surface, beyond the activity trail. After 4 years of fundraising, work started in the summer and continues to progress. We will let you know when the MUGA is complete and when the time comes there will be an official opening. It is safely fenced off for the time being and looks to be in the final stages of completion.

### **Online Accounts**

This week, Year 3 have spent time logging into all their new accounts that they need including Spelling Shed, Mathletics, Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) and the Google Classroom. Reading Records, with passwords in the front cover, have been sent home with the children today (Friday) so they have passwords available to log onto sites at home. Children should remember to bring in their Reading Records in their school bag every day so they have passwords available at school too.

### **Year 3 Homework**

Teachers have explained all homework expectations to Year 3 this week and discussed with parents and carers in the Welcome Meeting, in line with the home school agreement with parents.

Homework consists of:

- Reading at least 3 times a week to be noted and signed in the Reading Record.
- Spelling Shed 3 x 10 minute games will be set on a Monday.
- Times Tables Rock Stars 10 x 1 minute games will be set on a Monday.
- Mathletics 1 x 30 minute quest will be set on a Wednesday.
- Handwriting a written activity will be sent home in dedicated handwriting books on a Wednesday.

All homework is due in on the following Monday. Children who do not complete homework attend

Catch Up Zone to allow time to catch up on any incomplete or missed work.

We start homework proper next week, beginning on Monday 16th September 2024. Children will be reminded of this.

Personal, Social & Health Education: wellbeing, bullying, internet safety, stranger danger and roles in the community.



The teaching of spelling will be supported by the online programme 'Spelling Shed' which will be set as weekly homework (which you can complete as  $3 \times 10$  minute slots or a  $1 \times 30$  minute slot.)

### What is expected of my child in Maths?

- In maths, we cover topics including: Place Value Addition and Subtraction Multiplication and Division
- Fractions Measurement Shape

In order to pitch the support at different levels, we will group three ways for maths. Some groups have a higher adult to child ratio to support the children.

For the first few weeks, until we know the children, maths groups will be more fluid. Please do not worry if your child moves groups during the year as they are exposed to the same curriculum and we teach the exact same learning question.

# What is expected of my child in Reading?

- Wallace Fields promotes reading for pleasure and understanding. We ask that children bring in a book from home to read in class, however we do also have a fantastic book corner in each classroom, should your child want something different to read.
   At KSZ, a child needs to read the word correctly and build their understanding of the meaning and the context in which it is used.
   We will be teaching the children how to select appropriate books for them by regular visits to the library.
   We teach Guided Comprehension to develop the children's inference skills and enhance their understanding of different texts.

### What is expected of my child in Reading?

#### Reading Diaries

Children will be given a reading diary to record any reading that is done at home.

We ask that children read at home at least 3 times a week (preferably with an adult hearing them) and that a parent or carer signs and dates each entry.

1 dojo will be given to children who read 3 times a week, 2 dojos are awarded for 5 reads and 3 dojos are awarded for 7+ reads.



Please make sure the children bring their reading records into school every day as passwords for Mathietics, Speiling Shed and Times Tables Rock Stars will be stuck in the front page. https://www.wallacefields-jun.surrey.sch.uk/learning/english



Our homework reinforces topics taught that week in English, maths, science, history or geography.

Weekly Homework: Reading at home at least 3 x per week. This is to be signed by a parent/ carer.

English (30 minutes per week) Spelling Shed based on the sounds we are teaching (10-15 minutes) 3 x per week.

Maths (40 minutes per week) Times Tables Rockstars 10 sessions per week (10 minutes) and one Mathletics task per week. Handwriting (30 minutes per week) Handwriting books will be sent home with activities enclosed.

Termly Homework:

Spring History Summer Design project (tbc)

We will be giving the children their login details (stuck in the front of their reading records) and training them how to use these programmes in our Computing sessions over the next couple of weeks.

#### PE and Games

We teach a variety of Games including: Netball, Tennis, Football, Rugby, Hockey, Cricket and Rounders. In PE, we teach Gymnastics, Dance, Fitness and Athletics. We are lucky to have our expert Sports, Mr Sellars, to teach some of our games lessons.

Year 3 have P.E./Games on Mondays and Tuesdays and will therefore need to attend school in their PE kits on these days.

If there are any children who have earrings, they are responsible for taking them out themselves or advised not to wear them on  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{PE}}/\ensuremath{\mathsf{Games}}$  days.

#### Year 4 Parent / Carer Fact Sheet Welcome to Year 4!

This is information to help you understand the approach and key content of Year 4

The class teachers in Year 4 are Mrs Curran and Mrs Kidwai The group teacher is Mrs Elliot.

#### The Teaching Assistants (TAs) are:

Mrs McGahan, Mrs Salam and Ms Grover

#### Topics and Curriculum

Year 4 covers some exciting topics such as:

- Bistory: Anglo Saxons and Vikings.
  Geography: Weather, climate, mapping and Kenya.
  Science: Forces, changing materials, the Earth and beyond and mini-beasts.
  Art: 3D modelling, silhouters, Impressionism, observational drawing and clay masks.
  Design & Technology: Money containers, mulfins, and pop-ups.
  Life Lessons: Please see progression map on the Life Lessons webpage.
  Relationships and see deutaction: Changes to body and personal hyginen.
  Faith and Philosophy: Christianity, Sikiism, Humanism and a thematic unit.
  Computing: Coding, research and word processing.
  FE & Games, which Indudes: Football, neball, rugby, hockey, tennis, rounders, cricket, athletics, orienteering, gymnastics and fitness.

#### Reading

We ask children to read at least three times per week at home. Please spend some time listening to your child read aloud, as well as allowing them time to read alone and record this in their reading record. This must be **handed in every Wednesday.** The children will receive house points/ class dojos for their efforts.

We ask you to avoid reading the books we study in class which are:

- "Gangsta Granny" by David Walliams
   "Leon and the Place Between" by Angela McAllister
   "Boy at the Back at the Class" by Onjali Q. Raúf

Discussing the children's books with them - characters, plot, predictions, language and motivations of characters - is important to develop their comprehension skills

#### Homework

In Year 4, children will receive 1 piece of maths homework, 1 piece of English homework and are expected to read at least 3 times **every week**. They will also be set a project homework every half term which relates to a topic in our learning.

### Weekly Homework:

Beginning every Wednesday.

Children are expected to read at least 3 times per week. Reading records will be taken in on Wednesdays.

Every Wednesday

The children will be given Times Table Rockstars activities and/or Mathletics tasks which total 30 minutes.

### The children will also be set 30 minutes of Spelling Shed activities.

All of these will be due the following Wednesday.

#### Half Termly Homework:

One homework task will be given on a Friday, once each half term. This will usually be topic or foundation based, which is to be handed in on a date later in the term.

In the <u>Summer Term</u>: In preparation for Year 5, the children will receive a Spelling and grammar homework on a Wednesday, due in the following Wednesday. This will not start until the summer term.

If homework is not completed on time, pupils will go to the Catch-up Zone and they will then be expected to complete their homework that evening.

We can't wait to have a fantastic year and are excited to see how well your children progress and develop throughout their year.

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





## **COMMUNITY NEWS**







### Epsom and Ewell ghost writers

On September 14<sup>th</sup> 2024 Bourne Hall Museum will be celebrating some of the many writers who have celebrated our local area. All have died, hence ghost writers.

Four re-enactors will be playing the writers details of which ones are on the reverse.



To run alongside the event, we are holding a poetry competition for local children to write poems on what they like about the local area or a local place. These will be judged by the poet Ana Mclaughlin (shown above) in the following age groups: 5–8, 9–12, and 13–16. If there is the demand, we could add a further older age group. The top three in each group will win a signed copy of her new

anthology *Heroes and Villains*, which will be presented by her at an event in October at Bourne Hall. Poems should be emailed to me at <u>dbrooks@epsom-ewell.gov.uk</u> or dropped off at the Bourne Hall reception desk by 14 September.

Mrs Beeton the Victorian author of the *Book of Household Management*, wrote one of the most famous cookery books ever published. The first instalment, published in 1861, was an immediate success, selling over 60,000 copies in its first year and nearly two million by 1868. She lived in Epsom for many years before her marriage.

Robert Fabian was a police officer, who rose to the rank of Detective Superintendent in the Metropolitan Police. After retirement from the force in 1949, he worked as crime writer. His work was dramatised in the 1954–6 BBC drama series *Fabian of the Yard* based on his book of the same name centred on New Scotland Yard. He lived locally and died in Epsom Hospital in 1978.

Samuel Pepys had the best-documented life of his time, not just because he was a key figure running the Royal Navy, but because the nine-year period covered by his diary gives a unique insight into his daily actions and innermost thoughts. During this period Pepys visited our area on six occasions: once in 1663, four times in 1665 and once in 1667. He spent time in Ewell and Nonsuch Palace. He makes it clear that he was already well-acquainted with the area: a cousin lived at Ashtead and Samuel spent time there as a boy.

Charles Dickens, the greatest novelist of the Victorian period, created some of literature's best-known fictional character. His novels and short stories enjoyed unprecedented popularity during his lifetime and are still widely read today. Dickens visited and wrote about the Derby, and it even appears in one of his books. He once said that you could fire a cannon ball down Epsom High Street 364 days of the year and it would hit no one, but take out half of England on the 365th – Derby Day.
