ALL WEATHER PITCH SPONSORED WALK FUND RAISER





At Wallace Fields Junior School, it is our priority that pupils, staff and our wider community are supported with their wellbeing - mentally and physically. This year, we want to promote the relationship between a positive wellbeing and exercise. There is a range of evidence, supported by the Department for Education (DfE), which highlights the positive impact exercise can have on our wellbeing, not only physically but also mentally - increasing our mental alertness, energy and positive mood. We have planned some exciting events that the children will be partaking in whilst at school to allow all the children and staff to come together to ensure regular access to exercise throughout the week. This term, we would like to introduce a Sponsored Walk/ Run as we ask Wallace Field Junior School pupils to 'Walk Fast, Jog Swiftly'.

This is an event where all children are involved in a fund-raising effort on behalf of the school. All money raised goes to the PTA school fund which is used to support pupil activities over the academic year. For this event, we would like to donate money towards the all-weather pitch. ALL WEATHER PITCH

Each class will be challenged to work as a team to walk, jog or run a certain VIRTUAL distance.

Year 3 – walking/running 53 miles to Brighton.

Year 4 – walking/running 61 miles to Portsmouth.

Year 5 – walking/ running 70 miles to Cambridge.

Year 6 – walking/ running 80 miles to Dover.

The children will be given the opportunity each week during the Weekly Mile and at the start of each games lessons to complete as many laps of the playground in a designated time. Their laps will be counted, converted to a distance and recorded. All pupils will have 3 weeks to complete the challenge. Each child will be contributing to the class total and you will be sponsoring the entire class as a whole unit. If you or anyone in your community wishes to sponsor your child's class, your child will be sent home with a sponsorship form on the week commencing 22nd January 2024.

We ask that all sponsorship be paid online via the link below by the end of the half term. Any donations are highly appreciated.

Please return all sponsorship forms to the school office and make your donations by Friday 9th February 2024.

We hope this event serves to promote the children's physical and mental wellbeing as well as create some healthy competition across the school. Please see our newsletter for weekly updates on how the children are progressing. We look forward to seeing which class can reach their destination first!

Epsom and Ewell Schools Music Festival

Year 5 & 6 Choir members parents/carers have been contacted regarding the annual Epsom and Ewell Schools Music Festival which takes place at the Playhouse every year. As more schools have been invited this year, the size of the choir we are able to bring has been reduced to just **14 children.** So we are planning to **divide the choir into two groups one performing on Tuesday 26th March 2024 (5-7pm) and one on Wednesday 27th March 2024 (5pm -7pm).** Parents/Carers have been **emailed a Google form** to indicate their preference. Please be aware that there is a parents evening clash on the Tuesday. There will also be a **daytime rehearsal at the Playhouse on Monday 25th March 2024, from 10.00am - 2.30pm.** If there are too many responses for the 28 places, I will give priority to Year 6 and the two Year 5s who missed out last year before picking the remaining children out of a hat.

Year 5 and 6 Mobile Phone Policy

We have had to speak this week to some of the children about inappropriate use of their mobile phones within the school grounds. This is a safeguarding and online safety issue and the children have been made well aware of this numerous times.

Mobile phones are not encouraged, for their own safety and the safety of their peers, so we do require a reason for your child to bring their phone on to the premises - which is highlighted on the 'Mobile Phone Policy for Pupils^{3'}.

Key points are as follows:-

- Mobile phones should be switched off at the gate before they enter school and handed in to the class teacher or the School Office. Phones can be collected at the end of the school day or after a club.
- All phones have been given a label so that children can write their name on their phone; this is to prevent children taking the wrong phone; which has happened previously.
- Parents must sign the mobile phone agreement for pupils should you decide to send your child into school with their phone. Please click here ⁴to download the form or pop into the School Office.
- If phones are brought in to school without a name, without the signed permission slip with a valid reason, or still turned on beyond on the school site, they will be confiscated in line with our policy. Parents will be be asked to collect the mobile phone at the end of the day.

Passports

All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip. If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:

- Less than 10 years old
- Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France

You will need to send in your child's passport to the school office by 6th June 2024.

EHIC / GHIC

All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card).
