## HEAD'S UPDATE

**Local Councillor Supporting Parking Patrols Outside School:** I met with Councillor Steve McCormick this week and it was a very productive meeting. He shares my frustration with dangerous and disrespectful parking that is putting pedestrians (and specifically children) at risk. Surrey County Council have taken on the parking controls from Epsom and Ewell. Despite many requests, patrolling of parking infringement has not occurred and so Councillor Steve McCormick is helping join the campaign to have parking patrolled properly outside school. I have asked many times for parents and carers to not park on double yellow lines or over local driveways and so hopefully with a push on patrolling by Surrey, they can start to give out some fines and hopefully discourage poor parking and make it safer outside school.

**Available on the Gate:** I make it a key part of my day greeting the children at the gate every morning and seeing them off at the end of the day. I generally know most of the names of the children (I am still learning a few newer children and some Year 3) and they are always polite and respectful in saying good morning in reply. If you would like a quick chat or want to ask a quick question please do approach me and I will do my very best to help. I will be at the gate in rain, wind or snow though if I have a governors' meeting then I am afraid, I will not be there - this is only once every half term. I want to say a special thank you to Joe Findlay, our caretaker, who goes over and above to marshal the traffic, greet the children and he has even been seen fixing bikes and helping parents with enquiries. Without Mr Findlay directing the traffic we would have grid lock and lost tempers and he is a great asset to the school.

**Common sense - Walking to School:** After some time the water authorities have discovered where a significant leak was occurring in the area. They are currently repairing that leak and they have closed one of the footpaths to school and clearly marked and signposted this. Children walking to school alone are considered by parents and carers to be sensible enough not to walk in the road or put themselves at risk. Please remind your child that they should cross over to the far side on their approach to school rather than put themselves in danger in the road. At the same time I would ask politely that those driving to school should take extra care and drive very slowly when approaching or departing from the front of the school due to the increase in pedestrians crossing over due to the closed footpath. ## SMARTPHONE SAFETY TIPS for young people

You may have been lucky enough to have unwrapped a smartphone at Christmas, or you might be eagerly anticipating getting a new one at some point during this year. Whether it's your first ever phone or an upgrade on your old model, it's always useful to have a refresher about how to set it up and adjust the settings to keep yourself – and your valuable personal info – safe and secure. We've collected some expert tips to help you enjoy your smartphone in the healthiest way possible.



### NEVER SHARE YOUR PASSCODE

Alongside face or fingerprint recognition, your passcode is crucial to unlocking your phone and accessing your apps and personal information. You shouldn't give it out, even to close friends – after all, you wouldn't hand them a key to your house and let them go in for a night's sleep, would you? If you do share your passcode, ask them why and make sure you can see what they're doing with it.

### ONLY USE AGE-APPROPRIATE APPS

Before downloading a new app or game, check about age ratings. It's not just for parents! If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

Two words: look up. It might sound obvious, but it's so easy to get so absorbed in what we're doing on our phones that we forget to look up. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### DEVELOP HEALTHY HABITS

Phones offer a vast amount of content and the chance to chat with friends whenever we feel like it, which can make it difficult to take time away from the screen. If that's something you struggle with, try setting boundaries. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### IGNORE UNKNOWN NUMBERS

There are some scammers who might call or text telling you to share personal data or to click on a link and provide your details. Some might claim to be from a genuine company, but eventually, they'll ask you to provide personal data. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### SWITCH OFF GEOLOCATION

In your phone's settings, you'll be able to disable location services for individual apps and photos. This means that people you're talking to won't be able to see your location. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### THINK ABOUT OTHERS

Watching videos, listening to music or calling someone can all help to pass the time while we're on the bus, waiting in a queue or working down the street. It's important to remember that other people, though they might not want to hear your music or your conversation, might be overhearing something personal about you.

### FLM'S AGE GATES

Although MyLOL states it is not available to anyone under 13, there is no real age gate. This means that anyone can create a profile and use the site. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

MyLOL allows users to post images and videos. This means that anyone can post content that is inappropriate for children. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### POTENTIAL CYBER-BULLYING

MyLOL has a chat room where users can chat with others. This means that anyone can bully others. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### IN-APP SPENDING

MyLOL is free to join and use, but it has in-app purchases. This means that anyone can spend money on the site. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### DATA COLLECTION

MyLOL collects personal data from users. This means that anyone can collect personal data. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

MyLOL allows users to contact anyone. This means that anyone can contact anyone. This is a concern because the site is aimed at teens, but anyone can use it. If you're not sure, ask a friend or family member.

### Advice for Parents & Carers

#### DISCUSS ONLINE DATING

It's vital to talk to your child about the possible dangers of platforms like MyLOL – particularly the threat of online predators. Be clear about the risks of sharing intimate images and information with strangers and emphasize that they should never share their 'releaser' (anything that can be used to identify them) with anyone. It's not just about the site, it's about the risks of online dating.

#### EXPLAIN PRIVACY RISKS

Before your child begins using a service such as MyLOL, it's important that they understand the potential risks of giving out personal data on this type of platform. Explain to them, for example, that they should never share their personal information with anyone who they don't know, as someone can be quite convincing when attempting to steal someone's identity.

#### RESTRICT IN-APP SPENDING

If your child has access to a bank card or other payment method, they may be enticed into signing up for MyLOL's premium features. Having their profile boosted and receiving more attention might be especially tempting if their friends also use the site. You could consider altering their device's settings to disable internet purchases, or at the very least keeping an eye on their online spending.

#### SET UP LOCATION ALERTS

If you're worried that your child may be planning to meet up with someone they've met on MyLOL, you could consider utilizing GPS or similar location tracking technology to follow their whereabouts in real time. You can even set up a virtual boundary or 'fence' and get to receive an alert to your phone if your child enters or exits a specified area.

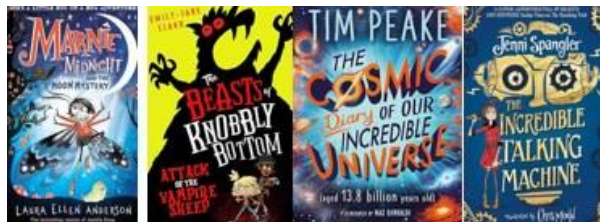


