On Tuesday 9th June 2026 the weather cleared and Wallace Field took its top throwers, long jumpers and triple jumpers to the tournament. Great performances took place and competitors did us proud walking away with medals across all the events with **Sonny G** and **Toby M** coming away with Gold in the throwing events! **Charlie A** (year 3) came second in the standing triple jump, **Mya M** (year 3) came third in the standing triple jump and **Lander S** (year 5) came third in the standing triple jump. Former member of staff Mrs Wilson kindly came along to help and said "The children all performed well and were very well behaved".

We ask that every child brings a **named water bottle** to stay hydrated, wears a **sunhat**, and has **sun cream** applied before coming into school each morning. These simple steps will help protect children from the sun and allow them to enjoy their learning and outdoor activities. Thank you for your support.

## New Uniform Launched - One Jumper for PE and Non PE days

### V-Neck Sweatshirt



As promised we have done a review of our uniform and adapted it to help reduce the costs to parents. **V Neck Red logoed sweatshirt and sweatshirt cardigan** will replace the v neck knitted jumper and PE sweatshirt so parents will only need to buy one jumper. **The old style knitted jumper and PE sweatshirt** are still permitted and the majority of children will still be wearing these styles.

Uniform is a great leveller and creates identity and is useful on trips and visits outside of school. We are proud of our uniform and the true sense of belonging that comes with it. To help reduce costs we have tried to keep logoed items to a minimum and allow high-street options such as supermarket plimsolls, trainers, gingham dresses, skirts, shoes, shirts, joggers and trousers.

We hold regular **second hand uniform sales** outside school every half term after school where good quality uniform can be purchased cheaply. We are still looking into cheaper alternatives and have removed any commission that some other schools charge.

**Please ensure all items are labelled.** Mapac sell labels on their website which are easy to use with no more ironing or sewing, simply peel and stick. These are incredibly sticky to ensure their ability to withstand washing cycles and tumble drying. Suitable for Clothing, Shoes and Equipment.

If your child is entitled to free school meals or you are having **financial difficulty** in acquiring the full uniform then please do contact the office to find out how we can help you.

### **Week of Monday 22nd June 2026 - Reminder to Final Groups for Year 6 Bikeability (excluding Sports Day)**

**The last 11 children will be taking part in Bikeability next week, starting on Monday 22nd June 2026.** Please note that there will be no Bikeability on Wednesday 24th June due to a clash with Sports Day. All children should come into school in their school uniform and **bring their comfortable cycling clothes, helmet and trainers** with them to change into for the course.

Training will go ahead whatever the weather so please remember **raincoats**. The forecast is hot next week so please send them in with **a small rucksack to carry a water bottle** (if they don't have a bottle holder on their cycle) and make sure that they all have **sun cream applied**.

For the safety of all the children in school it is important that your child **dismounts** once inside the school gates and if left overnight this is **at the owner's risk**. Bicycles should be padlocked at all times when not in use, **please attach a named key fob to the padlock key**.

**Please ensure their bicycle and helmet are suitable and road worthy** and spare some time to take your child out on the local roads over the weekend. To be able to progress on to the road, your child **will need to be able to control the bike whilst looking behind**, to check for approaching drivers. They will also need to be able to **remove one hand from the handlebars to signal**. If they are a bit shaky on either of these, please could you practise it with them.

### **Wednesday 24th June 2026 – Sports Day – Parents welcome**

On **Wednesday 24th June 2026** all parents and carers are welcome to come along and watch from 09:30 on our Wallace Fields Juniors Upper Field.

- 09:30 to 10:30/10:45 - All children will take part in mixed year groups, mixed teams based on houses and complete circuit of field events at bases around the field.
- 10:30/10:45 to 12:00 - All children will take part in mixed relay teams based on houses and not ability. There will be four races per year group. Year 3 races will be first and year 6 races last.
- 12:00 -12:10 - If time permits there may be a parents races.

Please note that timings are approximate and may be earlier or later; so please do get there early to avoid disappointment.

**Entry for parents is through the gate onto the Upper Field via the alley** (no need to come via the school office.)

There is a designated area for spectators to watch the children. Spectators are welcome to bring foldable chairs and parasols/umbrellas (it is open field with no shade). Toilets are not available for parents/carers.

All children are to wear their usual school P.E. kits with a t shirt in their house colour. Please also ensure your child:

Please do not give food/snacks to your children during the morning. The children will remain under the care of their teachers for the duration of the morning.

When is the next solar eclipse in the UK?

**Date:** 12 August 2026

**Eclipse type:** Partial

**What you'll see:** This partial eclipse will almost be total, with around 90% of the Sun being obscured by the Moon at the maximum. It'll begin at 6.17pm BST, with maximum at 7.13pm.

### Safety tips for observing the Sun

If you are thinking of viewing the Sun, your first concern should always be eye safety. Serious eye damage can result from even a brief glimpse of our nearest star.

Never look directly at the Sun with the naked eye or with any unfiltered optical device, such as binoculars or a telescope.

During a solar eclipse, you should still be wary of looking at the Sun directly. Unless the Sun is fully eclipsed, **you will need an appropriate type of welder's glass** or special Mylar glasses to safely observe it. Never use normal sunglasses!

### How to view the partial eclipse

The Sun is so bright that looking at it directly will blind you. Even at mid eclipse, the remaining bright part of the Sun is far too bright to view. You need to cut its brightness down by about 100,000 times. Ordinary sunglasses are useless, and you should never use household materials such as bin liners or food wrappers. So, either use an authorised eclipse viewer, or project the Sun's image using a small mirror or a telescope or binoculars. **A welder's No 14 glass is also OK for viewing directly.**

### **Surrey Consultation on School Holiday Dates**

I am pleased to share that the Surrey consultation has shown strong support for a return to a one-week October half term, with 80% of responding school leaders favouring this approach. ## What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ROBLOX

Roblox is an online platform where users can play and create games known as 'experiences' made by other users. Roblox has a large UK audience. TV News has reported that millions of people in Britain use the platform regularly, with children forming a significant proportion of its users. The sheer scale of it makes it extremely difficult to moderate effectively, creating risks for unsupervised children, though a June 2025 update has improved things greatly.

### WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

#### A PLATFORM RATHER THAN A GAME

Roblox offers from traditional video games to that it hosts millions of user-created experiences rather than a fixed level of developer-controlled content. This flexibility is self-imposed by its creator rather than the inherent rigidity of traditional games. In the case with PEGI-rated games, with millions of user-created experiences, moderation is largely automated which means that inappropriate content is more likely to be missed and have a harmful effect.

#### RISK OF ADDICTION

Roblox encourages repeated and extended play. Many experiences use a system of level-ups, rewards, and progression systems that can prompt users to keep playing for longer periods of time. Some games use incentives, daily rewards, or limited events to encourage frequent login. These devices can make it difficult to stop playing. Spending long periods of time on Roblox, or using it to escape from activities it bounds, can be a risk.

#### IN-GAME SPENDING

Roblox is free to play, but many experiences and cosmetics include optional purchases using Robux, the platform's virtual currency, to unlock content in games. Robux can be purchased with real money. It is common for children to spend large amounts of money unintentionally or without understanding the real-world cost.

#### MATURE CONTENT

With much of Roblox's moderation done through AI and creators self-censoring harmful or inappropriate content frequently appears on the platform. Some experiences may have content intended for older players. As of June 2025, Roblox defaults to only showing games from verified developers to reduce the risk of inappropriate content. However, some user-created games may still contain mature or inappropriate content you deem inappropriate.

#### COMMUNICATION WITH OTHER USERS

Roblox includes text chat since features that allow players to chat in shared game spaces. While the platform uses moderation filters and moderation tools, media investigations have found that inappropriate and potentially harmful messages can still get through. There are risks that children could be targeted by groomers. In a June 2025 update, Roblox introduced a 'Safe Chat' feature that restricts chat to pre-approved phrases and restricts chat to the age of a user. The platform also has features and moderation technology to enforce these rules.

### Advice for Parents & Educators

#### USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox's parental controls provide an important starting point. Linking a child's account to an adult account allows parents to apply spending controls, limit communication features, and review recent activity. Regularly reviewing use of parental controls, and conversations with children about what they see online can help reduce the risk of inappropriate content.

#### PLAY TOGETHER WHERE POSSIBLE

Playing Roblox with a child can help adults understand the types of experiences and the moderation tools. This shared experience can also make it easier for children to raise concerns if something feels wrong. Parents and educators should monitor or play games on Roblox due to its largely self-censoring nature.

#### CONSIDER LIMITING OR DISABLING CHAT

Although Roblox has introduced higher age-related chat restrictions, some parents and educators may prefer to disable chat entirely to avoid the risk of stranger danger. This is the safest for children to be on the platform for any account up to the age of 13. Children can still play games, while communicating with friends they know through other platforms, such as Discord.

#### ENCOURAGE OPEN CONVERSATIONS

Many Roblox experiences are creative and age-appropriate, and for many children, the platform is an important way to connect with friends. Some that having a supportive, moderated and monitored environment to talk openly with children about online safety, spending, and how to respond to inappropriate behaviour.

	<b>AI chatbots</b>	Romantic or sexual AI chatbots will be banned for under-18s. All AI tools must also switch off similar features for anyone under 18.
