#### **Readathon Week Commencing 26th June 2023**

An exciting few weeks ahead of us and it is time for our annual sponsored **Readathon**. Every year, pupils at Wallace Fields Junior School ask and want more time to read at school. So, this year, children will be working together in the classes to try to read the greatest total of books across two weeks. We will also be asking children to be sponsored to read per book. The size of the books does not matter; it could be a short story, a magazine, a comic, a cookbook, a newspaper, or a whole book. If your child is a particularly confident and fast reader, perhaps encourage them to read chapter books or you may be out of pocket! During the two weeks readathon, we will be tracking the class totals in the classroom. Children will be awarded certificates for each milestone reached. This will be for their 1st complete book, their 5th, 10th etc.

As an added bonus, two classes will win an extra playtime for having the highest number of books read, or the highest total of funds raised. During the two weeks, staff will be reading short stories to children in assemblies, having extra library slots and getting more independent reading slots during the day. Additionally, adults will be completing guest reading sessions at lunchtime (weather permitting). Children will come home with a sponsorship form the week commencing the 19th June 2023. Once the readathon is complete, please can **funds be collected and paid via our usual payment system Scopay** <sup>2</sup>**or cash in a named envelope can be brought in.** 

We are hoping to use the sponsorship money to buy an audible account for the school, to help children enjoy audio books whilst in the library and to help access different texts on the Chromebooks to continue developing our library space.



#### YEAR 3

#### **Upcoming Year 3 PSHE Lesson**

In our PSHE lesson this term, we will be teaching children about their body parts and the underwear rule, through the use of recommended national resources such as the PSHE association. We will focus on which parts are private, and should not be touched or seen by other people.

The content of the lesson will cover: Naming parts of the body; "Appropriate" and "inappropriate" touching; your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable; and who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried

We will also be teaching our pupils the NSPCC's Underwear Rule, using the 'PANTS' acrostic, which is a green cross code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for: **P**rivates are private, **A**lways remember your body belongs to you, **N**o means no, **T**alk about secrets that upset you, **S**peak up, someone can help.

- If they've already read or don't fancy the above titles they could choose from: Only Children by David Baddiel (short stories); Adam Wins the Internet by Adam B (humour)



#### **Lost Property**


**Lost property** is outside now next to the playground equipment storage. If you need to look in the lost property, it is in a grey plastic outdoor chest in the main playground. All labelled items are returned to the children. Unlabelled uniform is sold at the end of term and any unclaimed non-uniform is thrown away at the end of term. Please label as much as possible to ensure it is found and returned.

#### **Water Bottles**

With the hot weather, hydration becomes a priority and so the teachers and staff are ensuring that the children get plenty of water breaks and additional reminders to keep drinking water. Refill stations are available during both breaks. There is a new gimmick water bottle called Air Ups that are expensive with costly cartridges that give a very slight smell to mimic flavour. Air Us are not welcome in school as they are bulky and expensive and we have already thrown many unclaimed bottles from lost property this year. Please do not waste your money, but buy a simple water bottle with a secure lid and label it clearly with your child's name. Be aware that the school takes no responsibility for lost or broken water bottles, especially Air Up Bottles, though we will instantly return named bottles to their owners as soon as possible. #### **Stationery Reminder**

it is detrimental to your child's learning if they do not have the right stationery in class and impacts on everyone, as it disturbs others! Please ask your child to check if they need any stationery. Class teachers may send your child home with a slip indicating which stationery they need. Parents may provide their child with a little cash so that they can buy replacement stationery as necessary.
