PUPIL MOBILE PHONE USAGE

It has been drawn to our attention that some children have been receiving inappropriate messages on their mobile phones late at night. Please be mindful of your child's usage of their mobile phones and talk to them about sensible use of phones, including appropriate times to communicate. We would advise that mobile phones are removed from the children at bedtime to aid a restful and peaceful sleep, needed to learn effectively. We take E-safety very seriously at school and regularly discuss sensible online and mobile phone use with children in the class, in assemblies and during our E-safety Week. Please promote the safe use of internet and digital technology, including mobile phones at home to support our message in school. For example, discuss how comments intended to be funny, can often be misinterpreted online whereas if said face to face they could be acceptable as facial expressions, body language, tone of voice and context that all help to ensure that remarks are taken the right way.
