## **IMPORTANT - WHOLE SCHOOL**

#### **NASAL FLU**

Thank you to all the parents who have already completed the online form to book your child's flu vaccination on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> or Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November 2020. If you have not yet done so yet, please complete the e-consent form by **4 PM ON THURSDAY 29TH OCTOBER 2020** (when the website portal will close). Go to the e-consent form at:www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk Our school's unique code/URN number is SR125298 which you will need to enter on to the flu consent form. Some children may receive a letter with a bar code from NHS England once they have registered for nasal flu which has caused confusion. **The School Nurses at NHS Child Health are not collecting the bar code**, so please be reassured that you do not need to send it into school, and our process has not changed.

#### **EMAILING TEACHING STAFF**

Due to the restriction of covid, teachers are receiving a much higher number of emails than usual from parents and carers. The time being taken up with teaching, marking and assessing means that only a fraction of these emails can be got through during the working day. Because of this we are asking politely that all parents and carers try to use the Reading Record books and/or the Homework Diaries as a way of contacting the teacher and the teaching support about any issues or queries you might have. The website has recently been updated and is now populated with all subjects on the 'learning' tab and the progression maps and the curriculum intentions are also included. If you find that the website does not have the answer then please call the main office, or if absolutely necessary, email the staff. Please bear in mind that the teaching staff have very little time to read and respond to large emails and so we would be very grateful if you could keep your enquiry short and to the point should there be a complaint or concern.

## SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS (SEN) PROVISION AND EHCP'S

Our school, like most, is under pressure from self-isolating staff and the loss of staff waiting for covid tests after having symptoms. The testing is not yet working quickly enough and so we are doing our best to maintain teaching and learning as close to normal as possible. There are times when support staff are also not in school and on these occasions additional adults are allocated to the SEN and EHCP children. The DfE makes it clear that schools are to do their best in the circumstances of the covid pandemic and at times it is recognised that EHCPs may be affected to some degree and that this is fully acceptable. Please be patient and understand the school pressures and the effect the global pandemic is having on staffing and provision. We thank you in advance for not contacting the school about the very fine detail that we put in place now and again as we are doing our very best to ensure school is operating as normal as possible especially for SEN provision.

#### **LETTER FOR PARENTS ABOUT COVID 19 SYMPTOMS**

Public Health England (PHE) have produced a letter for schools to distribute to parents which explains when a person requires a coronavirus test and what the main symptoms of coronavirus are. The Department of Education (DfE) have asked us to share and circulate this letter amongst parents and carers.

The intention of the letter is to support both teachers and parents in answering some of the questions parents may have around testing. ### CATCH-UP INTERVENTION AND RECOVERY CURRICULUM

We have completed assessments with all the children and will now be implementing even more intervention and support to ensure children reach their full potential. Please be aware that this is not simply a SEN provision but additional sessions to ensure children are back where they should be after the long break from school and the learning lost over the four months of school lockdown and a subsequent summer break. We are confident we can meet the needs of the children and are enthusiastically pursuing lessons and additional maths and English groups to drive the pupil progress up. If your child reports that they were in a small group lesson in the morning or afternoon, it is not because they are not making progress but specific gaps in their national curriculum learning are being targeted and brought back up to speed. We will not be reporting specific group lessons or support to parents, but the reporting of SEN and EHCP pupils will continue through the specific SEN plans that have been created.

#### REMOTE LEARNING PROVISION

The last staff meeting and INSET were dedicated to getting up to speed with the new DfE requirements to have a remote learning provision in place. This is to provide learning for the pupils, should they need to self-isolate for 14 days, if the year group bubble is closed down and sent home or the entire school is closed due to a covid situation. PHE will inform us if the school needs to close the year group or the school. A policy is being drawn up and will soon be available on the website. We are currently looking to increase the detail, clearer instructions and guidance for online provision and the Year 3 are becoming more familiar with our Google Classroom platform should they be required to learn from home. We will send more detail out next week.
