HEAD'S UPDATE



Community Police Visit: All classes had a very informative visit from two community police officers PC Tom and PC Chris who spoke to the children about the role of the police. They discussed issues in an age appropriate way and in the upper school this included social media and public perception. Thanks from the school to the two officers and for bringing in their police van and riot gear for us to have a look at. Both of them commented on the excellent behaviour of the children and how respectful and responsive they all are. We hope they can come back again in a couple of years.

Musical Performance Assembly: It was a truly fabulous musical performance assembly this week with the talents shining out as we listened to the musical talents of Year 5. We enjoyed violin playing, piano pieces and singing (including duets). The quality was excellent and we were all very impressed. Thanks to Mrs Johnstone for organising this. Thanks to those parents who came in to see it.

Absence Levels: Behind the scenes we have a massive raft of support, interventions, special activities, phonics and special needs provision. The week's learning is very carefully mapped out and every subject has a strong progression map. If children are absent they miss this support and simply will not make progress. Please ensure your child comes into school and if they are unwell in the day

we will send them home. Please also note that I do not authorise term time holiday in line with an agreement with the local cluster of primary schools. There is no point in quoting other schools as authorising term time absence as they are not committed to ensuring good attendance at school. We are. Thank you to all those families that ensure their children are in every day and there are attendance certificates for the year. at each termly celebration assembly. Obviously if they are unwell they cannot come in so simply take their temperature to confirm and err on the side of sending them in if well enough. Many anxieties disappear once they are in school and they get on with enjoying the day with their friends and peers.

Authorising Entrance Exams: I authorise half a day for any entrance exams for selective schools. I do not authorise 'hot housing' or tutoring absence taken to push children through an entrance exam. Your child should be able to be successful without this pressure, otherwise the school is wholly inappropriate for your child. The poor absence incurred by a child is passed on to the receiving school and this may affect their application. All children should return to school for the part of the day they are not taking the exam. You are welcome to pick them up and drop off during the day. Thank you.

PTA Comedy Night - Friday 24th March 2023

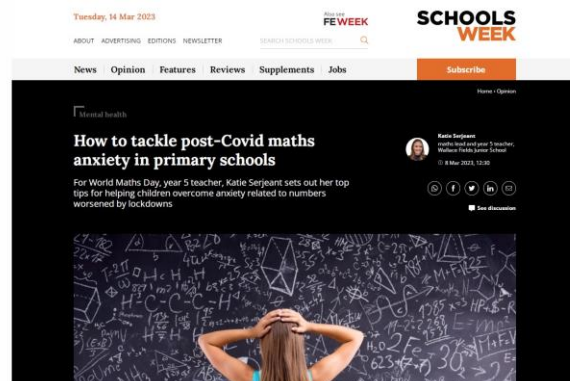

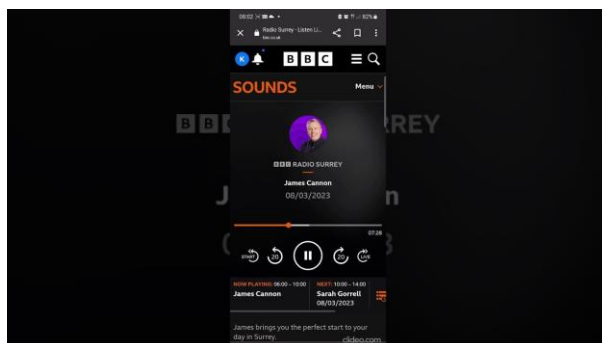

Year 4 Indoor Planetarium on Wednesday 22nd March 2023

On the week commencing 20th March 2023, Year 3 will be making a fruit salad as part of our Year 3 Design and Technology project. The children will be creating a decorative fruit salad and the purpose is for the children to make a healthy snack whilst learning about preparing food, food hygiene and how to safely cut foods.

Tuesday 21st March – Tasting Day!

On Tuesday 21st March, children will be tasting a selection of fruits that they could put in their fruit salad. The fruits children will be tasting include mango, banana, blueberry, apple, oranges and grapes. **The school will provide fruit for the tasting session only.**

Wednesday 22nd March – Designing Day!

On Wednesday 22nd March, the children will be designing their fruit salads and deciding what fruit they would like to include. The children will bring a letter home on Wednesday with a shopping list of fruits they want to include.

Friday 24th March – Making Day!

All children will need to bring in the fruits they would like to include in their fruit salad and the specified equipment list sent to Year 3 parents directly.

Please do not bring in any nuts.

If your child wishes to bring in hard fruits (e.g. apple, pineapple), please can these be pre-chopped at home as we do not allow any sharp knives (just cutlery). All soft fruit can be prepared at school. The children are welcome to bring in their own cocktail sticks or shape cutters if they wish.

We have cleaning products in school but if your child wishes to bring in their own antibacterial wipes then this is fine!

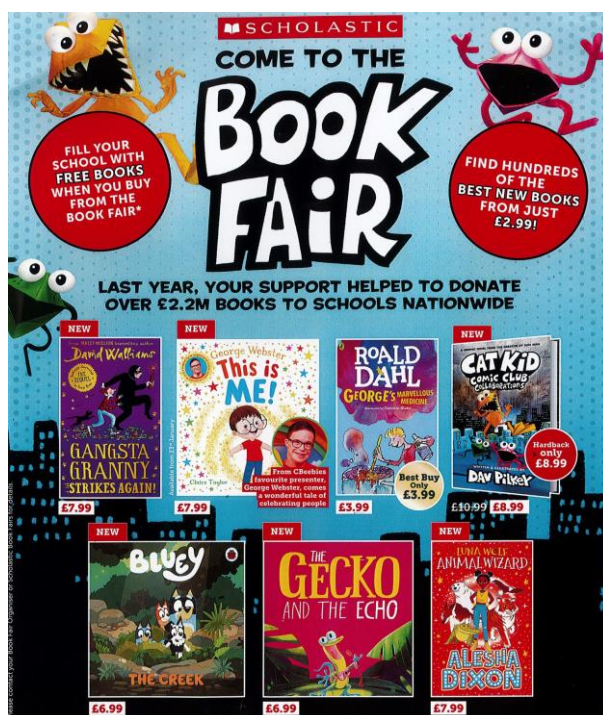
Help Your Child's School Get Free Books!

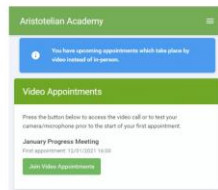
How to attend your appointments via video call

1. Log in and go to the Evening

On the day of the video appointments (or before, if you want to test your camera and microphone) login to Parents Evening at the usual web address for your school, or click the login link from the bottom of the email confirmation you will have received.

Once logged in you will see a notice that you have upcoming video appointments and under this the details of the event, along with a *Join Video Appointments* button.

Press the button to join your appointment on the day - or to test your camera/microphone at any time.



2. Check Audio and Video

When you click *Join Video Appointments* the *Check Audio and Video* screen will be displayed. You may at this point be asked if you wish to allow access to your camera/microphone, in which case please click yes.



From here you can turn on or off your microphone and camera, change which devices are being used for the call, and check your microphone and speakers. Once you are happy, click *Proceed to Video Call*.

2. The Video Call

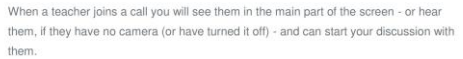
On this screen you can see the following, when in a call:

- At the top left the teacher name (and subject details) for the current and next appointment
- At the top right a countdown to the start of the appointment.
- At the bottom the controls for the microphone and camera.
- When another person is available these also show a pick up button to start the call
- and a hang up button to leave the call.
- In the middle, when your appointment is due to start, the *Start Appointment* button.



3. Making a call

Click the *Start Appointment* button. You will see yourself in the bottom right corner of the screen (unless you have no camera, or have chosen to turn it off). If the teacher has not yet joined you will see a notice to that effect in the centre of the screen.

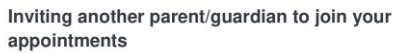


Note that if you or the teacher are late, or leave and rejoin the call, it does not reset the timer. The appointment will always end at the scheduled time.

If you have a consecutive appointment scheduled the screen will display a *Start Next Appointment* button. When you are ready to proceed, click on it.

If you do not have a consecutive appointment, but you have not completed your final scheduled appointment you will see a countdown telling you how long until the start of your next appointment.

Once your final appointment for the evening is complete you will see a message advising you of this.

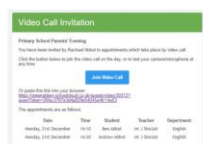
You **must** enter a *Name*, and an *Email address*, as well as tick the box to consent to that person being given access to the information used to make the appointments.

If there is more than one student linked to you, choose the student(s) in respect of whose appointments the access to this person will be granted.

When you click the blue *Send Invite* button an email is sent to the address entered, giving them a link and details on how to join the call.

Please note that **ONLY** that one invited guest should use this link. Anyone else using it (including the parent that sent the invite, who should be logging via their own confirmation email) will knock the guest out of appointments.

Here is an example of what the invite email looks like:



3. You will then see a *Manage invites* box that shows your sent invitation(s), allows you to add another invite if you have any more available (the person invited can be different for each student, if wished), and allows you to *Resend* invites or *Remove* them.



If you click *Remove* the link in the previously sent invitation will no longer work and that person can no longer join the video call.

Note that a call can have a maximum of 4 people in it at any one time. In cases where a school has assigned 3 teachers to take joint appointments for a class, a parent can still invite a guest, but once the number of participants in the call reaches 4 no further people can join it (unless one of them leaves).

Top Tips for Adopting SAFE & HEALTHY ONLINE HABITS

Everyone has so much going on in their lives, and that includes children: from exams and deadlines to anxiety and mental health struggles. It's quite easy to send memes, make jokes and vent online about the things that irritate us, but when was the last time you – or your child – took a moment to share something kind or positive instead? In fact, when did you last stop and think about your family's online activities? To help keep them safe and teach them healthy online habits, we need to develop our children's digital resilience. There are lots of ways that children can become more digitally resilient, and we've pulled together some popular strategies here...

WHAT IS DIGITAL RESILIENCE?

Resilience doesn't mean being so tough that nothing gets to you, and it's not about "putting up with things" either. Instead, it's the ability to recover from setbacks. Everyone feels sad, worried, scared or upset at times: it's how we respond and adapt to those situations which is important. Digital resilience is about making choices that keep us safe and happy online, even when we're exposed to something negative or upsetting. Building your child's digital resilience will help reduce the impact of potential risks as they engage with and navigate around the online world.

REACH OUT FOR SUPPORT

- ✓ If you have a problem online, don't be afraid to reach out to specialist people or organisations that could help.
- ✓ Follow people on socials who have the same values and morals as you.
- ✓ You could always talk to a friend, or a trusted adult like a teacher or family member for some advice.

MAKE POSITIVE LIFESTYLE CHOICES

- ✓ Make time for the people and things that make you happy.
- ✓ Monitor your screen time and stick to your limits.
- ✓ On social media, follow people that make you feel good about yourself – and unfollow the ones who don't.
- ✓ Spread some positivity: post good reviews, leave encouraging comments and share good news.

PUT SAFETY FIRST

- ✓ If you see something online that upsets or worries you, tell a trusted adult about it as soon as possible.
- ✓ You could also report the content that's making you feel uncomfortable to the site or app that you saw it on, so they can look into it.
- ✓ Another option is to block the person or the account that's causing you a problem – or you could go one step further by totally deleting the app you were using.

KEEP YOUR HEALTH IN MIND

- ✓ Try to factor in regular breaks offline and away from your screen – ideally, outdoors for some revitalising fresh air.
- ✓ Exercise is a brilliant stress-buster: even a walk around the block, a bike ride or a stroll to your local shop can really work wonders.
- ✓ Be strict with yourself about putting devices away in plenty of time before bed: they can interfere with a good night's sleep, which is essential for staying healthy.

GET THINGS CLEAR IN YOUR HEAD

- ✓ Ask yourself what kindness online actually looks like. Can you remember the last time someone was kind or supportive towards you online? What did they do?
- ✓ Think about how it makes you feel when someone sends you a positive or funny message online.
- ✓ What about the opposite: has someone ever been deliberately unkind to you online? What did they do and how did it make you feel?
- ✓ If someone's behaviour online is causing you stress, try to remind yourself of all the steps you can take if a person's being unkind online.
