HEAD'S UPDATE

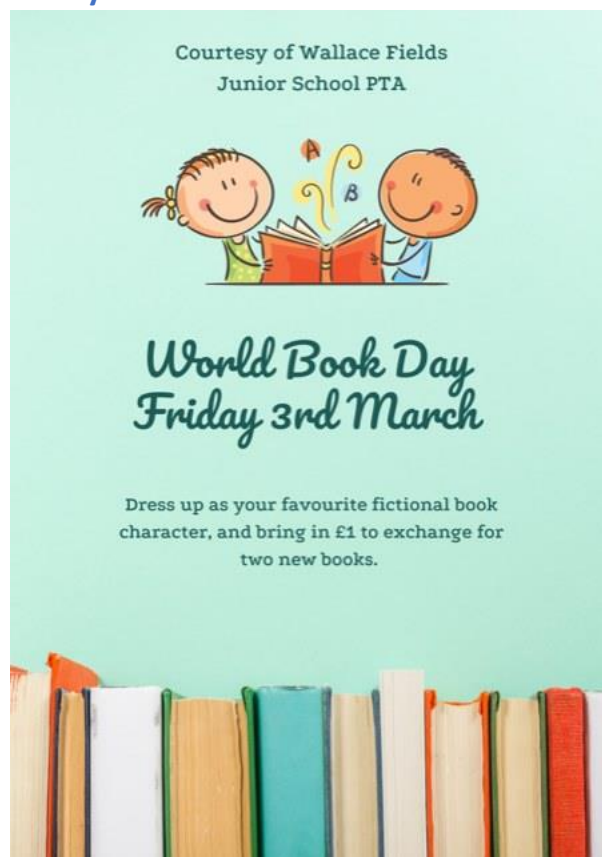

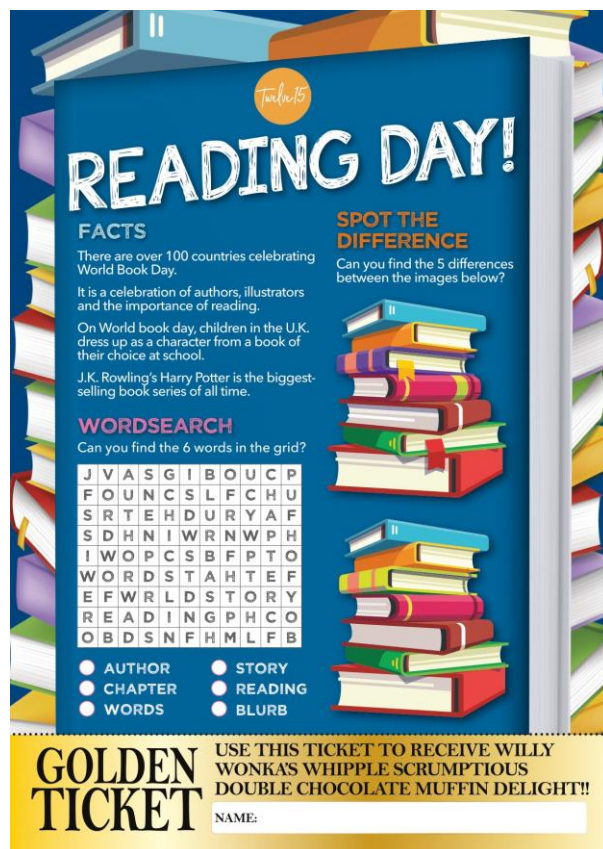
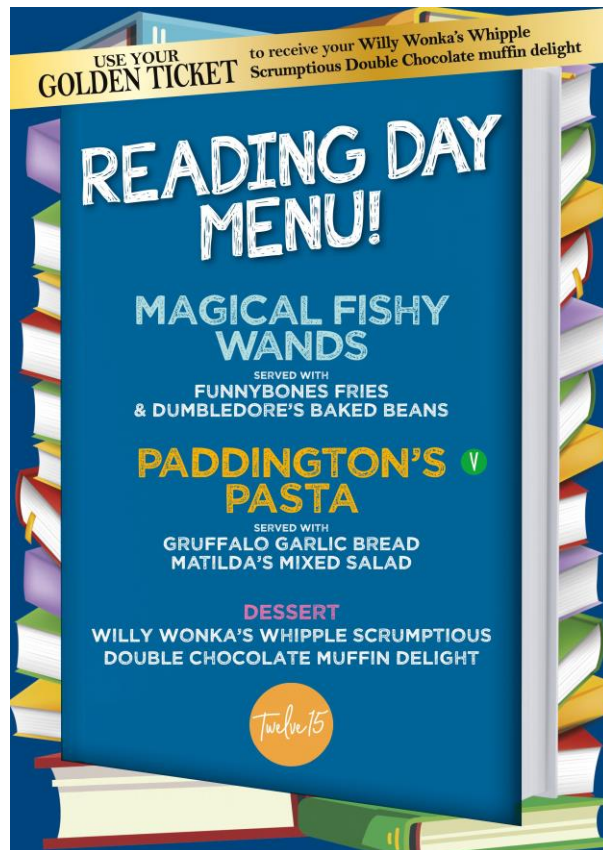

Year 6 French Trip Instalments due

As a reminder the following instalments are due:

Year 6 French Residential Trip - Passport & Visa Reminder

All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip. If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:

- Less than 10 years old
- Valid for at least **3 months** after the day we leave France.

You will need to send in your child's **passport to the school office by Tuesday 6th June 2023.**

What happens if my child holds a non-EU passport?

If your child holds a non-EU passport you may be required to obtain a Shengen Visa in plenty of time before the trip. Please click here for more information: Click here⁴ Please also inform Mrs Boddy in the school office if you hold a non UK passport.

French Residential Trip - EHIC or GHIC Health Care for Visitors to EU Countries

All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card). You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is free of charge on the NHS website. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. Please ensure you apply for this in plenty of time.

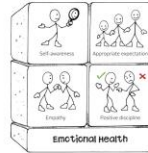
What is the Parenting Puzzle?

Children are rewarding, stimulating and fun, but looking after them can be stressful and challenging.

The Parenting Puzzle Workshops help deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier life.

A tried and tested programme, it helps us think about what we do, why we do it, and how it makes us feel.

The Building Blocks of the Parenting Puzzle



The Four workshops

Workshop 1 Understanding Children's Behaviour, Listening and Communicating, Praise and Encouragement.

Workshop 2 Praise and Guidance vs. Criticism, Challenging, and Positive Moments.

Workshop 3 Boundaries and Parenting Styles, Time to Calm Down, Dealing with Stress and Conflict.

Workshop 4 Choices and Consequences, Behaviour to Ignore, Putting the Puzzle Together, Looking after Ourselves.

Practical information

There are four 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break.

10-20 parents are invited and there are two family links trained group leaders.

Partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with another relative or friend.

Some groups provide a creche check with group leaders beforehand.

You need to come to all four workshops they fit together like a puzzle.

You will be provided with a copy of The Parenting Puzzle book to accompany the workshops.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about ROBLOX

Roblox is one of the most popular video games on the market by 2020, the game's makers were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it. Roblox is a free-to-play game that offers a huge amount of creative freedom. It lets players create their own gaming experiences with the Roblox Studio 3D build engine, assets and game, which can then be shared with other players online. Roblox fosters creative thinking and enjoys a large online community of users.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

Roblox encourages players to communicate using chat, allowing a player to talk to other players. Children can talk to strangers online, which can be dangerous. The in-game chat has some filters, but isn't perfect. Players can send private messages to other players, which can be used to contact strangers or to arrange to meet in person.

ONLINE DATERS

There are also online daters in Roblox. An online dater is someone who uses the platform to find a romantic partner. Some online daters are genuine, but some are not. They may be using the platform to lure children into a relationship, which can be dangerous.

PUBLIC SERVERS

Roblox has public or VIP servers, which are open to everyone. These servers are often used by strangers to meet in person. They can be dangerous, as they are often used for inappropriate behavior.

IN-APP PURCHASES

Roblox is actually free to download, but there are some hidden costs. Players can purchase virtual items, such as clothing, which can be expensive. Some players have been scammed, losing money to strangers.

Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox has several parental control options, which are explained in the game's official website. It is essential to set these controls up for your child, as they allow parents to monitor their child's activity and restrict access to certain features.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblox has a private messaging feature, which allows players to communicate with each other. This can be dangerous, as it allows strangers to contact children. Parents should disable this feature for their child.

PRIVATE SERVERS

Roblox has private servers, which are only accessible to a select group of players. These servers can be dangerous, as they are often used for inappropriate behavior. Parents should avoid these servers.

MONITOR SPENDING

If your child doesn't understand they're using real money, it's easy for them to spend too much. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help. Parents should also monitor their child's account for any suspicious activity.

DEALING WITH STRANGERS

At some point in their development, your child will need to learn how to deal with strangers online. Show them how to block and report any users who are upsetting them or asking inappropriate questions. Talk to them about what's OK to share and what they should never tell a stranger online - will help them understand how to communicate with other people online safely.
