HEAD'S UPDATE



Year 6 Mountain Homework Projects: Stunning array of incredibly creative mountains models and information came in as part of the Year 6 project homework on mountains. A huge amount of effort has been made and they look wonderful. They are on display in the hall for all the see at the moment. Well done.

Welcome to New Parent Governors: A warm welcome from me on behalf of Wallace Fields Juniors to Lawrence Matthews and Jonathan Barker. They became our new parent governors as previous parent governors move to new roles within the governing body. We had two vacancies and with no other contenders so an election was not needed. I hope they enjoy their tenure as governors with us.

Clubs and Wraparound Care: The school has JAG (Junior Adventure group) for wraparound care and children can easily do a club and then go straight to the diner for JAG (or from a club straight into the playground in the morning). Kidsquest at the infants stopped collecting children from clubs a while back and so they cannot be collected after a club here. If you would like your child to have wraparound after a club then they need to be enrolled into JAG here at Wallace Fields Juniors. If you are collecting your child from school and they are not going to attend Kidsquest then please contact Kidsquest directly as their staff spend a long time asking teachers where the children are and they are already gone at the end of the day. Thanks.

Epsom College Links: We continue to grow links with Epsom College and we have had two key events this week involving the college. The excellent musical performances in the hall and the exciting Science Workshop at the college itself. I hope to be meeting with the head and some staff of Epsom College next half term to find further ways of maintaining this very positive relationship. Thanks to Mr Johnson-Hyde for organising the musical performance with Mrs Johnstone and well done to Year 5 for their active involvement in the science day!

The Kings Wildflower Seeds: A selection of wildflower seeds have been sent to every school. Thanks to Mr Findlay who helped selected children help plant these seeds in our upper field in the Queen's Green canopy area. This area will be left to grow naturally and not mown so that insects and creatures are encouraged to thrive there.

PE shorts permitted are only the red shorts supplied by Mapac.

All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip. If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel:• Less than 10 years old • Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France. You will need to send in your child's passport to the school office by Tuesday 6th June 2023.

All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card). You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is **free of charge** on the NHS website⁷. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. **Please ensure you apply for this in plenty of time.**

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



























Year 5 Isle of Wight Residential Trip - Monday 12th June – Friday 16th June 2023 Year 5 Isle of Wight Trip Reminders:

With the Multiplication Table Check taking place after the half term, please encourage your children to use the 'Soundcheck' area on Times Table Rock Stars. We can see some children completed their recent soundcheck at home within the last few days, which is excellent! Practising in this area will prepare children for the check in June, with a similar setup. We are doing lots of times table practice in school so please do encourage your children to practise them at home, too. Thank you for all your continued support.

Year 4 Trip to Painshill Planned for 20th June 2023

During the Academic year, the Year 4 pupils are given the opportunity to attend a number of trips and participate in a variety of talks and activities to complement and extend their classroom studies. In the summer term we have planned a trip to Painshill Park.

On Tuesday 20th June 2023 we will visit Painshill Park to support science studies on minibeasts. We will be having a guided activity called "Pond or Minibeast Investigation" and have the opportunity to look around Painshill Park. Pupils dip for water invertebrates or search for land to investigate further in the 'Bug Lab'. This learning activity involves identification and analysis using microscopes and identification keys. They will discover ecosystems, food chains, adaptation and life cycles.

To cover the cost we must ask for **a voluntary contribution of £22 per child,** which must be paid via the Scopay website. We take payment as indication that you give permission for your child to take part. If you have problems or wish to pay in smaller instalments please contact the school office on 020 8393 0350. We will treat payment as permission to take part in the trip.

For the trip, we would love to have some parent/ carer volunteers join us. This will consist of volunteering for the whole day, including the coach journey to and from Painshill Park and helping to monitor the children throughout the day. YEAR 3

Year 3 Music Performance - 13th June 2023

I am writing with information about the upcoming Year 3 Music Performance opportunities. When I spoke to the classes yesterday, I was delighted to see the enthusiasm and number of children who

would like to perform. I am going to give every child who wants to, the chance to perform to their peers during their Music lesson on Monday 12th June 2023.

As I am sure you will appreciate, I won't be able to select everyone for the assembly performance on the 13th June 2023 as there is only half an hour available for the assembly. I will be selecting performers who have a certain level of proficiency and who have a well rehearsed piece. I don't want this to deter pupils who are fairly new to their instruments but I will explain to them that they need a bit more time before they are ready for a big public performance. Likewise with the singers, it will be more than likely that almost all will just perform in class. There are many children with tuneful voices but the assembly performances are really intended to showcase those who have taken music to the next level (ie. have singing lessons and therefore have slightly more developed singing voices than most). Having said this, if your child is keen to sing to the class, please do encourage them and let them sing to you at home to practise. It takes a lot of nerve to sing solo in public!

Important dates:

I will be auditioning all instrumentalists at lunchtime (after they have eaten lunch) on **Tuesday 6th June 2023**. Please help them remember their music and instrument (if not piano!) on this day. (This is the first day back after half term)

I will audition all the singers at lunchtime (after they have eaten lunch) on **Wednesday 7th June 2023**. Singers will need to have rehearsed at home with a backing track from YouTube that is just music (not singing along with the solo artist).

After these auditions parents of those chosen to perform in the Assembly on the **13th June 2023** will be notified.

Monday 12th June 2023 - all children (whether or not they are playing in assembly) are welcome to perform to their class during their normal Music lesson so please bring instruments and music if required.


