## HEAD'S UPDATE



**Positive Feedback:** My very sincere thanks to all those parents who have taken time to make their positive points known to staff. Your emails, comments and personal praise at the gates are a huge boost to all the staff and mean a lot as often parents may only get in touch to complain or demand and it is lovely to receive lovely positive news. The children have been amazing this week and following a strategic visit by the local authority the feedback from them was extremely positive. At the brief feedback meeting after the visit it was said how all the children were fully engaged and extremely happy to be in school. A special thanks to Mr Findlay and the office staff who go over and above to ensure the children feel safe, welcomed and inspired at Wallace Fields Juniors. I am always very proud to show people round and I know as we reach each learning area, inside or out, the children will be loving learning and fully engaged.

**Mobile Phone Theft in the Park:** I have been made aware that an ex-pupil was robbed of his mobile phone by some school age children just before 6pm on Wednesday in Alexandra Park (7th June 2023). The phone was tracked and the perpetrator found with the phone subsequently returned. A few pupils have mobiles and although the idea is that they keep us safe, sadly, owning a mobile phone increases the chances of a child being mugged. Here is some helpful advice you might want to discuss with your child if they carry a mobile with them - look under the title 'Safety Dangers'.

We are helping with enquiries with this incident however I have not been formally notified by the police or local head teachers linked to this incident. Thank you for your cooperation and thank you for working with us to ensure the children are safe.

### Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

With the Multiplication Table Check taking place after the half term, please encourage your children to use the 'Soundcheck' area on Times Table Rock Stars. We can see some children completed their recent soundcheck at home within the last few days, which is excellent! Practising in this area will prepare children for the check in June, with a similar setup. We are doing lots of times table practice in school so please do encourage your children to practise them at home, too. Thank you for all your continued support.

### Year 4 Trip to Painshill Planned for 20th June 2023

During the Academic year, the Year 4 pupils are given the opportunity to attend a number of trips and participate in a variety of talks and activities to complement and extend their classroom studies. In the summer term we have planned a trip to Painshill Park.

**On Tuesday 20th June 2023** we will visit Painshill Park to support science studies on minibeasts. We will be having a guided activity called "Pond or Minibeast Investigation" and have the opportunity to look around Painshill Park. Pupils dip for water invertebrates or search for land to investigate further in the 'Bug Lab'. This learning activity involves identification and analysis using microscopes and identification keys. They will discover ecosystems, food chains, adaptation and life cycles.

To cover the cost we must ask for a **voluntary contribution of £22 per child**, which must be paid via the Scopay website. We take payment as indication that you give permission for your child to take part. If you have problems or wish to pay in smaller instalments please contact the school office on 020 8393 0350. We will treat payment as permission to take part in the trip.

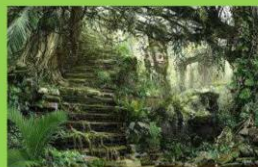
