Welcome to Year 4!

This is information to help you understand the approach and key content of Year 4.

Topics and Curriculum

Year 4 covers some exciting topics such as:

- **History**: Anglo Saxons and Vikings.
- **Geography**: Weather, mapping and the developing world.
- Science: Forces, changing materials, the Earth and beyond, mini-beasts.
- Art: 3D modelling, silhouettes, Impressionism, observational drawing, clay masks.
- Design & Technology: Money containers, muffins, levers, linkages and pop-ups.
- **Personal, Social & Health Education**: Please see progression map on the PSHE webpage.
- Relationships and sex education: Changes to body and personal hygiene.
- Faith and Philosophy: Christianity and Sikhism and Judaism.
- **Computing**: Coding, research and word processing.
- **PE & Games** includes: Football, netball, rugby, hockey, tennis, rounders, cricket, athletics, dance, gymnastics and fitness.

Reading

We ask children to read at **least** <u>three times per week</u> at home. Please spend some time listening to your child read aloud, as well as allowing them time to read alone and record this in their reading record. This must be **handed in every Monday**. The children will receive house points/ class dojos for their efforts.

We ask you to **avoid reading** the books we study in class which are:

- "Gangsta Granny" by David Walliams
- "Leon and the Place Between" by Angela McAllister
- "Boy at the Back at the Class" by Onjali Q. Raúf

Discussing the children's books with them - characters, plot, predictions, language and motivations of characters – is important to develop their comprehension skills.

<u>Homework</u>

In Year 4, children will receive 1 piece of maths homework, 1 piece of English homework and are expected to read at least 3 times **every week**. They will also be set a project homework every half term which relates to a topic in our learning.

Weekly Homework:

Beginning every Monday:

Children are expected to read at least 3 times per week.

Every Wednesday:

The children will be given Times Table Rockstars activities and/or Mathletics tasks which **total 30** minutes.

The children will also be set **30 minutes of Spelling Shed activities**.

All of these will be due the following Monday.

Half Termly Homework:

One homework will be given on a Friday once each half term. This will usually be topic or foundation based, which is to be handed in on a date later in the term.

In the Summer Term:

In preparation for Year 5, the children will receive a Spelling and grammar homework on a Wednesday, due in the following Wednesday. This will not start until after the Easter holidays and will be in place of spelling shed.

If homework is not completed on time, pupils will go to the Catch-up Zone and they will then be expected to complete their homework that evening.

Visits and Trips

To help broaden the children's learning, enjoyment and understanding of their topics, we offer a range of visits and trips.

In Year 4, we have the following exciting visits and trips:

- In Year 4 they take part in their first residential trip to Hooke Court in Dorset, for three days in May. Residential trips are a great way for your child to develop independence, build team skills and improve their organisational skills. We have highly experienced staff that have been running and attending the same residential trips over many years. At the moment this is scheduled on Monday 15th May – Wednesday 17th May 2023. Please see the PowerPoint attached for further information.
- Crew Theatre come in to hold an exciting workshop on Forces, which the children study in Science. This is scheduled for the latter part of the Autumn term.
- The children will be able to experience the wonder of the universe within an inflated dome in the school hall when the Learning Dome mobile planetarium visits Year 4.
- As part of our study of mini-beasts, Year 4 will be visiting Nower Wood to look at habitats.

Personal growth

In Year 4 we encourage the children to aim high and get involved! There is lots to do so the children are encouraged to get involved as well as developing their **independence and resilience**.
