Top tips for parents with babies

- When you say my name, I stop what I am doing and look at you.
- When a grown up I know talks to me, I make sounds and noises that are special to me.

Top tips for parents with toddlers

- When you read me a story, I like to join in with sounds that different characters and things make.
- I use words that I have heard you say, such as 'Oh dear' or 'All gone'.

Top tips for parents with young children

- I understand longer instructions or questions.
- I can show you that I understand who, what, and where.







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Activities to try at home

Activity to try at home for babies

• 'Hide' under some material, use your hands or a scarf to hide your face. Say words such as 'where has baby gone?'.

Activity to try at home for toddlers

• Share together the story 'We are going on a bear hunt'. Go to the local park and act this out e.g., we can't go over it, we can't go under it.

Activity to try at home for young children

• Have a teddy's bear picnic together. Make sandwiches using language such as 'inside', 'on top of' etc. When we're playing, ask me to put teddy under the blanket.
