Parents with babies:

- I like you to read stories with me.

Parents with toddlers:

- When you read me a story, I like to join in with the sounds that different characters make.

Parents with young children:

- I listen to stories when you make different noises or use different voices.
- When you read my favourite stories, I can join in with words or phrases that appear over and over again.







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Activities to try at home

Parents with babies:

- Let me hold the book as you share the story with me and let me turn the pages.
- Follow my lead when sharing a story and it does not matter if we read it back to front.

Parents with toddlers

When sharing a story, let me point to things and you can make the sounds of things.

• Use a sock puppet when you are sharing one of my favourite stories with me.
