Week 1: hallucinating, spokesman, rare, beached, disorientated.

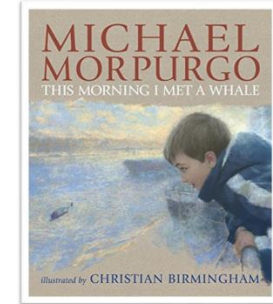
