Welcome to Year 6! We would like to welcome all the new children and their families and we look forward to working with all of you. This is an important year for the children as we prepare their transition to secondary school and many life changes. Children will continue to develop their reading with daily reading lessons, explore short stories and historical tales in English. They will also continue to master times tables, and develop their reasoning skills using new methods in maths lessons.

### Maths

In mathe we will study numbers and the number system up to ten million, including fractions and decimals. We will also be looking at measurement; how to convert units and read scales, with an emphasis on using and applying the skills learnt in lessons in many different contexts. Pupils will also complete a fortnightly mental maths test in class and daily calculations to support their fluency in the four methods of calculation.

# History

Our history topic this term focuses on Parliament and how it has developed over time. We will be putting our learning into context by visiting the Houses of Parliament.

# Geography

In geography, children will be studying how a river is formed and its cycle. They will research and explore their local rivers and the impact they have on their community and landscape. They will link this to other important rivers around the world and their impact on humans and landscape.

# English

We will start the Autumn Term by reading 'The Wolves in the Walls' by Neil Gaiman. Children will be developing their ability to describe settings and to change the ending of a story. We will then be reading 'Little Badman and the Invasion of the Killer Aunties' by Humza Arshad and Henry White. Pupils will delve into the characters of the book, before writing a scene with dialogue.

#### Science

In science, we will be becoming taxonomists, studying and investigating living things by sorting and classifying. We will also complete investigations through testing of different components needed to improve electrical circuits.

## Art/DT

In art, we will be learning how to express ourselves using tools to create marks, studying 'Chiaroscuro' and conveying messages through street art.

For DT, pupils will create a game using electrical components learnt in science.
