In English, we will begin the term by exploring the children's classic, 'Matilda' and 'The Wolf's Footprint', where the children will be writing stories with alternative beginnings and endings and writing information texts. We will also be continuing our focus on times tables, in preparation for the statutory Multiplication Table Check in June. Although the new term will be filled with lots of hard work, we will also ensure that the children have plenty of fun along the way.

Topics we will be studying this term...

History – The Mayans

Geography – Mountain Regions

Science – States of Matter

Religion and World Views – What does sacrifice mean?

Maths

In maths, we will begin the term by continuing their knowledge in multiplication and division using written methods for these. Towards the end of the term, we will be focusing on area and fractions (equivalencies, fractions of amounts

English

We will start the Spring term by reading 'Matilda' by Roald Dahl, giving children the opportunity to develop their writing using dialogue. Finally, we will be reading 'The Wolf's Footprint' by Susan Price, which children will use as a stimulus to create information texts.



History

Our history topic this term focuses on The Mayan civilisation. The children will learn about what life was like, Mayan rituals and ceremonies, and the lasting impact of the civilisation.

Science

In science, we will be studying and investigating states of matter throughout the Spring term. Children will be learning about the properties of the three states, how they change and exploring what liquids freeze. They will be carrying out experiments to support their learning.

Geography

In geography, children will be learning about mountain regions. They will research where mountains are found, how they are formed, the features of a mountain and the nature of mountainous climates. They will also be locating the Rocky Mountains on a map.

Art/DT

In art, children will be studying life in colour. The children will be learning about contrasting tones, proportion and prints. For DT, children will be cooking. They will follow a recipe to cook and evaluate their own biscuits.

Also...

In Year 4, homework will be set online. There will be no homework books.

Mathletics – 2x tasks weekly

TTRS – please aim for 3x per week. Please encourage using soundcheck as this best supports their Multiplication Table Check.

Spelling Shed – weekly

Children should have their logins provided.

Children should practise their spellings online, ready for a spelling test each Friday.
