


<u>Intent</u>

- Aspire to continue an art education to support related careers.


Progression through the pathways



In KS3, the students within our seekers' pathway have a timetabled art lesson every week. These lessons follow the topics identified on the KS3 3-year rolling programme, with chosen aspects of the content differentiated and adapted to meet the needs of these students. A much more sensory and kinaesthetic approach is adopted in terms of the planning and delivery of these lessons to ensure that they are meaningful and have a clear purpose, and that where possible they are linked with the EHCP targets of each student. As these students move into KS4 and KS5, art becomes integrated into core skills lessons and is linked to their termly themes so that continual progress is mapped and embedded.



In KS3, the students within our explorers' pathway follow a 3-year rolling programme, providing broad coverage of artists, mediums, and styles. The content of each unit is differentiated and adapted to meet the needs of these students and there is a greater focus on kinaesthetic learning and communication, allowing the students to express their artistic skills. The students develop practical skills and methods that can then be applied to other aspects of their lives. In KS4 and KS5 art becomes integrated into core skills lessons and linked to their termly themes. Some students have the opportunity to continue studying art and be entered for a qualification.



In KS3, the students within our navigators' pathway follow a 3-year rolling programme, providing broad coverage of artists, mediums, and styles. The content of each topic is closely linked with the National Curriculum. Students work on their individual artist skills showing the progress that is being made and we identify any areas of development. There are several opportunities within each unit for students to continue to develop their practical skills. In KS4 students have the option to complete Applied BTEC Level 1 Art. All art students work towards achieving a BTEC Level 1 Award, with our most able students working towards the BTEC Level 1 Certificate.
