

### **Music Overview**



#### **Intent**

Music at Walton Hall focuses on the 8 facets of music potential. Thais includes:

- Enjoyment
- Attentive listening
- Absorption in the music
- Commitment to the process
- Inclination to explore
- Inclination to lead
- Memory
- Being expressive

This allows music leaders to identify the potential of all students and appropriately structure lessons to support and foster this potential, providing meaningful opportunities to develop this further. Our music curriculum has been adapted to suit students within the three pathways as follows:

#### **Progression through the pathways**



Music is taught in a holistic manner within our seeker's pathway. Students will learn to immerse themselves in various soundscapes and recognise patterns and rhythmic sounds. This helps to promote self-awareness, whilst also developing their listening skills, communication skills and their ability to focus. Some lessons will incorporate the Charanga SEND scheme. Units are topic-based and presented in groups of six, each focusing on a specific musical skill or concept. Progress is measured through the seeker's 'areas of impact' assessment framework.



For Explorers students, musical concepts are taught through a repetitive-based approach to learning. Through listening to, appraising and performing a variety of genres, students will deepen their understanding of fundamental musical concepts, such as the 'pulse' and 'tempo' of a song. Students will also explore a variety of instruments. Through exploration of these fundamentals, students will also learn the basics of composing their own piece of music.



Music lessons for our Navigators students offers a practical approach to the musical facets. Lessons are delivered following the "School of Rock" scheme of work, covering a wide range of music instruments. Students will explore different genres and musical stylings to deepen their understanding and appreciation and put this into practice through performance. They will also have the opportunity to create their own music and explore the technical aspects of music production through Yu Studio.

As students move into Key Stage 4 and 5, music is an
option for them to choose and units are completed
from the BTEC Performing Arts Level 1 course.
