With the colder weather upon us, we are encountering students wearing hoodies under their blazers. We do have a school jumper available to buy if students feel they need another layer to keep warm, however whilst in school, coats and hoodies must be removed.





Year 11 History GCSE trip to Hoghton Tower

On Tuesday 63 of our history GCSE students visited Hoghton Tower, the aim of the trip was to gain a deeper

understanding of Elizabethan England. The students listened to a talk about Elizabethan life and then toured the building. The students gained an understanding of what a Tudor grand house would have looked like and its functions. They saw an example of a priest hole, burn marks in the wood on the well (to protect against evil spirits) and the high-status Tudor bedroom. Students then had another talk, this time about Elizabethan religion and the links that the house had to Cardinal Allen and Thomas Campion.



The guides were engaging and knowledgeable and tailored the talk and the tour to the needs of our GCSE students. Our students were amazing, they were polite and asked and answered lots of questions. The students were a credit to the school and to their parents/carers.

RECRUITMENT: EXAM INVIGILATORS

Final Call

This is a paid casual role and will be required for both Year 11 mock exams (Dec/Jan) and the real exams (May/June). Full training will be given.

The job spec for this role is:

- To conduct examinations in accordance with the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ), awarding body regulations and instructions.
- To have a key role in upholding the integrity and security of the external examination/assessment process. Before examinations
- Report to and be briefed by the exams officer prior to each exam session
- Keep confidential exam question papers and materials secure before, during and after exams
- Ensure exam rooms are set up according to the requirements
- Admit candidates into exam rooms under formal examination conditions
- Give full attention to conducting the examinations properly
- Identify candidates and seat candidates according to the required arrangements
- Distribute the correct question papers and exam materials to candidates
- Instruct candidates in the conduct of their exams
- Deal with candidate questions
- Start exams

During examinations

- Supervise and observe candidates at all times and be vigilant throughout examinations
- Keep disruption in examination rooms to a minimum
- Deal with emergencies or irregularities effectively
- Record/report any incidents, disruption or irregularities
- Complete attendance registers
- Deal with candidate questions according to the regulations

After examinations

- Instruct candidates in finishing their examinations and collect examination scripts and materials
- Dismiss candidates from the examination room
- Check candidates' names on scripts, match the details on the attendance register
- Securely return all examination scripts and materials to the exams officer
