It is centred on what successful behaviour looks like and defines it clearly for everyone. There is more information below on how we will be introducing this in school below.

Changes to Morning registration

Following the cancellation of the school buses a decision was made to provide leniency on students receiving their morning registration mark. This period of time has now come to an end and the coding of registers will change from Monday 19th February.

Our school day starts at 8.45am and students are expected to be in their form room for this time.

If a student arrives after 8.50 the must sign in as the school office and will receive a late mark.

Our registers will close at 9.05 meaning any students arriving after this time will receive U code in the registers. This code has an effect on students attendance figures and persistent U codes may result in our attendance team undertaking legal advice in accordance with government guidelines.

We would appreciate your support in ensuring that your child is punctual to school every day.

Behaviour Curriculum 2024

We are very excited in school because soon we will be launching our new behaviour curriculum. Students in all lessons and always when in school will be being taught this curriculum. It focuses on three core principles of being **READY** to learn, **RESPECTFUL** to others and **SAFE** when they are in school. We believe this new curriculum will further develop our students into being well rounded, respectful citizens of the future. We have already started to work on these core principles, last week we started to reinforce being READY to learn with uniform checks, this week we have started to check students have the correct equipment with them to take part in their lessons.

It is pleasing to see that most students are already living up to our high expectations. These checks will continue to be conducted each morning to ensure our standards are maintained. We need parents' full support in ensuring students have the correct uniform and equipment. Uniform can be purchased (add link) Any difficulties with uniform and parents should email your son/daughters HAL, school will then loan students uniform for a short period of time, until the issue has been resolved. If any parents have preloved items which they can donate for this purpose, we would be appreciative, especially during this cost-of-living crisis. Any donations can be sent in to school with your child or dropped off at school reception. We also need to remind parents that **LEGGINGS** are not suitable uniform and students wearing leggings may be isolated if they wear them for school. Jewellery and piercings, false eyelashes and false nails are not part of the uniform policy which can be found here <u>UNIFORM POLICY</u>.

Another important aspect of being **READY** to learn is attending all lessons and arriving to school and lessons on time. Students who do not arrive to lessons on time receive a Late strike. If they receive 2 or more late strikes in a day, they receive a late break detention. If they miss part or all a lesson, they will be marked as Truanting and receive a lunch isolation. Parents are notified of these, and we would ask for parents to support school to ensure their son/daughter is in all lessons and on time. Should students receive detentions please ensure they attend on the day set.

Year 9 DTP/ACWY Vaccinations E-Consent Link





Brief Job Specification:

- To conduct examinations in accordance with the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ), awarding body regulations and instructions.
- To have a key role in upholding the integrity and security of the external examination/assessment process.

Before examinations:

- Report to and be briefed by the exams officer prior to each exam session
- · Keep confidential exam question papers and materials secure before, during and after exams
- · Ensure exam rooms are set up according to the requirements

During examinations:

- · Supervise and observe candidates at all times and be vigilant throughout examinations
- · Keep disruption in examination rooms to a minimum

After examinations:

- Instruct candidates in finishing their examinations and collect examination scripts and materials
- · Securely return all examination scripts and materials to the exams officer
