#### **UNIFORM**

Due to price increases by the school uniform suppliers from Monday 2nd October 2023 the cost of the school blazer and the optional black jumper will increase in line with our suppliers, full details will be available on the Uniform Shop website.

#### **YEAR 11 SKIRTS**

Year 11 girls have been spoken to on Wednesday regarding the length of skirts. They were initially not made to purchase the new kilts as this is their last year at WLD however this was on the conditions that skirts were long enough. Those with skirts that are too short have been given notice to ensure they have a skirt that is long enough or wear trousers by Monday. If they are unable to organise something school have an extensive collection of spare uniform, we can lend them in the meantime.

### **MATHS HOMEWORK – SPARX MATHS**

Particularly for our new year 7 students but as a reminder for other year groups – all homework in Maths is set online using Sparx Maths (<a href="www.sparxmaths.com">www.sparxmaths.com</a>) which can be accessed from laptops, PCs, tablets, phones and any other devices with an internet browser. Student logins are their full name with no spaces (So Joe Bloggs would be "joebloggs") and they set their own passwords.

Homework should take approximately 30 minutes for years 7-9 and 60 minutes for years 10 & 11 and will be a mixture of topics they have recently seen in lessons for practice, and topics that they have seen previously in the course for revision. Students need to work on paper and write their working out as they complete the homework – not try to do questions in their heads. If they get stuck there is a video help available on every question and they should watch the video, copying the example as it is explained. They can then re-try the question using the example they have copied as a guide on how to complete it. If they are still stuck then they should send a message to their teacher on Teams or by email asking for additional help and then move on to another question.

We expect students to try and use the video help to get themselves unstuck as it teaches good independent learning and revision skills, but they should NOT be spending lots of time struggling on one question – once they've had a genuine attempt at sorting the issue they should message for help and move on. We strongly advise that they try to complete the homework soon after it is set, so that they have time to get help with anything that they find difficult. Students are also welcome to access the computer room in the Maths area at lunchtimes each day in order to work on homework and get help from staff with any topics they are struggling with.

In terms of home support we ask that you please check in with your child each week to make sure that they are completing the homework, and Sparx will email parents to keep them informed if homework is being completed or not. Homework in Maths is crucial to giving students the practice and variety of questions to ensure that they can retain and recall the skills, and students that complete their homework well each week show considerably higher levels of progress over time than those that don't.

#### **Calculators**

There are still a small number of students who do not have a calculator of their own for use in lessons and homework. Please could you make sure that your child has a scientific calculator — any calculator with SIN, COS and TAN buttons will be sufficient, but we recommend getting a CASIO calculator with a model number starting in "FX-83" or "FX-85" as these have a "natural display" allowing fractions and square roots etc to be written on the calculator as they appear in questions.
