Year 9 Options 2024-26: What happens next?

Monday 4th March - lessons 4 and 5

Year 9 students will have a short guidance conversation with Mrs Brown, Mrs Wall, Mrs Ardern or Mrs Long when students can tell us which options they are choosing. This conversation is a chance for us to check their options choices to make sure that they are choosing an EBacc subject and that they have decided on a balanced choice of option subjects that will support their future choices for going to college, doing an apprenticeship, getting a job. Don't worry if they haven't yet made a final decision, we can talk about that too.

Thursday 7th March 4.00-6.30pm: Year 9 Progress Evening and Options Info

Year 9 students, parents and carers are warmly invited to our progress evening when you can talk to teachers about how your child is getting on and find out more about their option choices. Behaviour Curriculum



This week we would like to focus on being READY to learn.

Each week we publish whole school attendance figures. Students are also made aware of their attendance figures on classcharts. Being in school is important but it is also important students are in every lesson for all the lesson.

Truancy is when students miss a large part or whole lesson without good reason. Students who truant will receive a 30 minute after school detention the next day to make up missed time. Persistent truancy could result in suspensions and parents being brought into school.

Student should not be late for school or lessons. If a student is late for school they will receive a late break detention as a sanction. If students are late to lessons, they receive a late strike and will be sanctioned in a similar way if it's a persistent problem.

To know that we have a uniform to reduce peer pressure and bullying, promote discipline and professionalism, to foster equality and

inclusivity and to promote pride and unity. Students cannot wear false nails, eyelashes or jewellery for health and safety reasons. Uniform policy can be found <u>HERE</u>.

If students have a problem with missing uniform school will lend a replacement item to support. Parents will be contacted by school to report the fact that uniform is missing.
