STUDENT ABSENCE REPORTING

Please see the link to our website <u>here</u> where you will find information on reporting student absences. We only use Classcharts and Schoolcomms as the only two methods of notification. Please **do <u>not</u> ring or email** school. If your child has a medical appointment, please upload a copy of this evidence onto Classcharts.

Although we ask parents/carers to refrain from booking medical appointments during school time, we understand there may be times that this cannot be helped. Therefore, please can we ask you to specify on Classcharts: what time your child needs to leave site and whether they are getting picked up or making their own way to their appointment.

If you do not have access to Classcharts, please contact your child's HAL.

Please could we also remind parents/carers that they need to complete the Classcharts notification, and these are not to be made by students or siblings.

Arriving after Registers Close

As you are aware school has a statutory responsibility to closely monitor Attendance and Punctuality to school. This year attendance and punctuality has been a real focus for the school.

Here at Walton-le-Dale we are always looking at ways to improve attendance and punctuality and ensure that our students maximise every opportunity to be in school and achieve their full academic potential. There will a clear correlation between attendance and academic success.

You may already be aware that as per attendance policy, Students who arrived after 9:05am receive an Unauthorised mark in the register. This U mark affects their attendance percentage as they do not receive their morning mark, effectively halving their daily session marks and overall attendance percentage.

In certain circumstances we may have no alternative but to apply for legal intervention in the form of Fixed Penalty Notice for persistent lateness to school. However, as always, we would much rather work in partnership with all parents/carers to address any issues, if you know of any reason why your child should be persistently late then please contact the attendance team to request an urgent meeting to address any issues.

Punctuality plays an important role in all aspects of life including college, work and appointments we are trying to help our students with learning skills needed for life!

As always, we appreciate your help and support. Walton-le-Dale is committed to the success of every child.


Stationery Shop
