Year 9 DTP/ACWY Vaccinations



Year 11 Edge Hill University Visit

As part of the upcoming ASPIRE day on Wednesday 27th March we are planning on taking all students in year 11 on an aspirational visit to Edge Hill University in Ormskirk. The day will consist of information on higher education and the different types of courses on offer, a tour of the campus, opportunities to speak to students about university life, and a study skills session which will aid with their GCSE exam revision. The day is designed to give students an insight into university life and try to address some of the barriers that young people face when considering whether university is right for them, as many students often don't consider higher education because they feel that "university isn't for people like me".

The trip is free of charge and will take place entirely within the normal school day, setting off from school just after 9am and returning before 3pm. Students will need to be in full school uniform as usual, will need to have suitable outer clothing for the weather conditions when walking around the campus, and need to bring a packed lunch with them as there are unlikely to be any opportunities to buy food at the campus. Students who are entitled to free school meals will be provided with a packed lunch to take but will need to order it the day before.

We have sent an electronic consent form out on ParentPay, which covers consent to go on the trip and permission or not for Edge Hill to use images from the day as part of their marketing and publicity. Please could you complete this consent by **3pm on Tuesday 12th March** to allow us to confirm numbers and make arrangements for any students that are not going on the trip. Students who are not on the trip will be expected to be in school as usual and will have a day of self-study if remaining in school.


Behaviour Curriculum

At Walton-le-dale, we aim to provide an education for all students free from disruption, and that enables the school to focus on improving outcomes for all students. Research shows that good behaviour must be explicitly taught and modelled by all.

This behaviour curriculum explains to everyone in school, clear expectations under the overarching behaviour principles of being ready to learn, respectful of everyone and being safe in school. The principle of a behaviour curriculum is to create a positive ethos around school and a culture where we have high expectations of our students. This will create better relationships, a consistent environment from classroom to classroom and support all students no matter what ability or learning need.

We feel that the behaviour curriculum will:

- Simplify a student's day in school by having the same keystone routines and rules in every classroom so it's easy to know our expectations
- Will teach students how to behave not just expect them to know.
- Will make school a calmer and safer place for all to learn.
- Will make students able to understand their own behaviour and learn how to improve it.







Restorative practise in school

One of the key aspects of the behaviour curriculum is the implementation of restorative practice in the way we resolve behaviour that doesn't meet our expectations. This means that staff and students use carefully researched conversations to reflect on the issues, understand what needs to improve and support students and avoid future similar problems.

Staff have received training we have created time for these conversations to happen after schools to that matters are resolved on the same day, when staff are available, so that resentment and conflict are resolved for a fresh start the next day.

Already the impact of these conversations is apparent. We believe that we will empower our students with the ability to self-reflect and improve their own behaviour in the future.
