Currently, a United Kingdom trans rights group has said guidance is "incorrectly stating the legal position" following the Supreme Court ruling on gender in April 2025.

The Equalities and Human Rights Commission (EHRC's) guidance was published in the wake of the ruling.

The ruling has directed that trans women are not legally women under the Equalities Act. This is potentially putting many trans individuals at risk. Lawyers that are acting on the behalf of the UK trans group "TransLucent" have sent out a letter warning that the guidance has incorrectly stated the position legally, fighting for the rights of the trans community.

Former United States President, Ronald Reagan, has warned of a "Donald-Trump style" war tactic.

A video from Reagan's speech in 1988, which mostly focused on free trade and the Canadian election, resurfaced at the beginning of April due to its large contrast to Trump's stance with the use of tariffs, a tax imposed on goods that are transported from different countries.

Animal Facts

Parrot/Parakeet of the month!



<u>Budgerigar</u>

The Budgerigar (also known as a Parakeet or a Budgie) are a small, long tailed type of parakeet which are native to Australia.

Budgies can be seen in many colours, but the most common colours are yellow, green and black; their feathers can fade from white to blue, green to blue or even be green, blue and yellow. They can have white or black spots on their nape, back or wings or no spots at all! The most common hobby that all budgies have is scavenging, that's because in the wild budgerigars normally scavenge for seeds, pellets or little bits of fruit and vegetables. A budgerigar's life expectancy is only 5 - 8 years in captivity which is quite short compared to its other bigger feathered friends, In the wild on the other hand they have a life expectancy of 7 - 15 years.

Budgies are known for their intelligence and are considered highly intelligent for their size. They can learn tricks, mimic human speech, and even solve puzzles when motivated. While not as intelligent as larger parrots, budgies are still quite smart and capable of learning and problem-solving.

Male Budgerigars are also known for being more vocal compared to their female counterparts, their more known for singing, chirping or even mimicking.

Budgerigars normally puff up their feathers. When a budgie puffs up its feathers, it can indicate several things, including feeling warm, relaxed, sleepy, or even excited or playful. Budgerigars sometimes give their owner a little nibble with their beak, A soft nibble or "beaking" from your bird might be due to exploration, playful behavior, or a way of testing textures and surfaces.

FUN FACT -

Male Budgerigars have higher affection rates with other males as opposed to female budgies.







On this day 80 years ago people across the country were celebrating VE Day, May 8, 1945. Bamber Bridge, Walton le Dale, Lostock Hall, Blackburn, Chorley and Preston like other towns and cities across the UK, erupted in celebrations to mark the end of the war in Europe. Street parties, dancing, and singing filled the streets as people rejoiced after years of conflict. These photos are of some of those celebrations. Do you recognise any of the areas?

Victory In Europe Day marked the formal acceptance of Germany's unconditional surrender and it provoked almost spontaneous celebrations across the UK. The streets of Preston were flooded with light for the first time since 1940 and the blackout. The town hall was lit up and Fishergate was hung with Union Jacks. Children made bonfires with Hitler effigies on top to burn, and a flag bearing the word: "A fitting conclusion to Hitler and his gang." Some didn't sleep for two days!

Caramel Brownies

Mrs. Denwood's

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup of Plain flour
- 1/2 cup of sifted icing sugar
- 2/3 cup of Cocoa powder
- 1 1/2 cups of Granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup of vegetable oil
- 1/2 teaspoon tsp of vanilla essence
- 2 tablespoons of water
- Toppings/fillings (this recipe is for caramel brownies, so I recommend a large bar of Cadburys Caramel, but anything can be used, glace cherries and white chocolate chips are also a good combination!)

Method

- Preheat your oven to 180°C.
- Mix the flour, icing sugar, granulated sugar and cocoa powder together in one bowl.
- Mix the oil, eggs, water and vanilla essence together in another bowl.
- Sprinkle the dry mix over the wet mix and stir until combined.
- Mix thoroughly, ensuring there are no lumps!
- Pour into a greased baking tray (the smaller your tray, the thicker the brownies, but the cooking time should be adjusted accordingly)
- Break your bar of Cadbury caramel chocolate into squares and push them about halfway into the mix (try to space these so there will be one in the centre of each brownie)
- You should have room for around 9 caramel pieces, evenly spaced.
- Cook for 20 minutes for gooey centres and 30 minutes for fully cooked.
- Allow the brownies to cool in the tray for 1 hour minimum before cutting.
- Serve and enjoy!
