Minestrone Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 clove of garlic
- ¼ cabbage
- 1 onion
- 1 rasher of bacon
- 1 carrot
- 1 stick of celery
- 1 potato
- 1 stock cube and 800ml boiling water
- 1 x 5ml spoon mixed herbs
- Black pepper
- 25g small pasta shapes or broken spaghetti

Peel and crush the garlic.
 Shred the cabbage.

6. Add the mixed herbs and black pepper, bring to the boil and simmer.



Top tips to reduce food waste

- Plan your meals and only buy ingredients you're going to use that week.

- Cover and refrigerate any food leftover from dinner and have it for lunch the next day.
- Store food leftovers correctly in the freezer or airtight containers in the fridge.
- Did you know, you can freeze bread close to the best before date and pop it in the toaster to defrost it when you need it!
- Think 'ingredients' not 'leftovers'. Use any leftover food as ingredients to create new delicious and healthy meals.
- Other food can be frozen too peppers and mushrooms are easily stir fried from frozen.


If you had cooked the original recipes, these are the items you would have had left:



The Sophie Scholl Awards

"Someone has to make a start." How about you?



Holocaust Memorial Day is commemorated each year on 27th January, the date of the liberation of the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1945. Holocaust Memorial Day remembers the millions of victims of the Nazi Holocaust, including six million Jews, and of other, more recent genocides.



The Sophie Scholl Awards were introduced at Runshaw as part of our events to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day. The courage of Sophie Scholl, of a similar age to Runshaw students, was an inspiration to us all. We now extend an invitation to pupils in partner high schools to help us celebrate the short life of this brave young woman by participating in awards reserved for them.

Sophie was 18 when the war started in 1939. She and her family, inspired by their strong religious beliefs, actively resisted the Nazis – an incredibly courageous thing for Germans to do. In 1942, Sophie, along with her brother Hans and a few other students, founded the White Rose, a non-violent resistance movement which painted anti-fascist slogans on walls, defaced Nazi emblems and distributed anti-war leaflets. In early 1943, Sophie and the other leaders of the group were caught, condemned as traitors and executed by beheading. Sophie was just 21.

During her trial, despite the attempts of the judge and prosecutors to browbeat and ridicule her, Sophie remained steadfast as one individual against the massive power of the Nazi state. "Someone has to make a start", she said. Convinced that good in the end would prevail, her last words as she was led into the execution yard were, "The sun still shines!"

For many inspired by Sophie's example, a white rose has come to represent peace, justice and a love of humanity.

Students in partner high schools are asked to make an entry based on ONE of the following themes:

- (a) The inspiration of Sophie Scholl
- (b) The White Rose
- (c) Someone has to make a start

Entries can be

- a written piece (maximum 250 words but could be much shorter)
- a poem
- a piece of art work or music of any kind
- an idea to do something at school based on Sophie's example
- anything at all based on one of the above themes.

Entries can be individual or group work.

APPLYING TO MEDICINE



Application deadline – In October each year, check the date for your year of entry.

Subjects - For students from England, UK medical schools look for applications that demonstrate the following (source - British Medical Association):

- · good GCSE grades in maths, science and english
- chemistry at A-level and often A-level biology
- one other science subject is often required, for example, physics (or physical science), or mathematics. A good A-level grade in an arts subject such as history or a modern language will usually be accepted as a third A-level.
- * Check directly if you are applying with other qualifications

TIPS FROM LEAH – Who has been through the process

Hello, my name is **Leah**, a final year medical student at the University of Sheffield. I applied to medical school feeling uncertain, anxious and overwhelmed (with the excitement of it all bubbling underneath).

Applying to medical school is confusing and daunting and can certainly feel like a step into the unknown. It is normal to feel out of your depth - I spent hours on google trying to wrap my head around it all - and with that in mind I want to share my top tips for thriving through the medical school application process and getting into med school.



TOP TIP 1: Planning is KEY - from your UCAT prep to your nights with friends

There is a lot to juggle when applying for medical school. Entrance exams, interviews, open days, attending school and college and revising for your A-Levels, as well as trying to juggle a social life and give your brain valuable switch off time. It is important that all these aspects are taken into account and planning and organisation can allow for a healthy balance in these areas.

I would suggest having an annual "to do" list. Writing down all the key dates and deadlines you have upcoming. Then when you sit down to plan your week you can adjust it accordingly to your deadline. It is really important to set boundaries in your revision to avoid burnout, and therefore I'd suggest choosing a set 'stopping time'. This will be the time in the day that the books close and you have free time, which I would fill with time with family/friends, extra-curricular, or soaking in a bath! Time to rest is just as valuable as time to revise.

TOP TIP 2:

Learn the essentials for interviews, there is such a thing as being over-prepared

The interview process is perhaps the most daunting aspect of the med school application, but actually the best part. You can finally introduce the medical school to who YOU are, outside of your academics and grades. They want to know more about you, the person, and why you want to be a doctor. They want to assess if you have the natural qualities to be a good doctor and that you are aware of the current environment for doctors and the NHS.

With that in mind, they are also aware you are a school student and would not be expected to have all the traits of a good doctor (no one has them all no matter what stage of training!) but they want to see you are eager and willing to learn and have a good understanding of yourself, the career, and the university.

Lwould recommend researching:

- the university as an institution and the city itself, why do you want to be at that uni and in that city, and what is it about that medical school that makes you want to go there?
- The life of an NHS doctor, what are the current struggles, the positives of the career, and the ways to cope with the negatives?
- Why do YOU want to study medicine? How will you cope with the stress and what excites you about the degree.

Overall, there is such thing as being over-prepared and authenticity is vital in interviews, as long as you are yourself, you should find the interviews will flow naturally.

TOP TIP 3:

Volunteering is just as valuable as work experience

Work experience can be really tough to get, and opportunities slim. However Medical schools are mindful of this and really appreciate hearing about volunteering opportunities you do and part time jobs you may have. For example, I worked part-time at a coffee shop and spent ample time at interviews discussing how I would apply the skills I learnt there to succeed at med school. Any opportunities you have, or work you do, will develop skills you can discuss at interview. So I suggest it would be good to make a written log of all the work/volunteering/clubs you've been a part of, so you remember the skills you can discuss at your interview.



Catering manager

Catering managers plan, organise and develop the food and beverage services of organisations and businesses.

As a catering manager, you'll be responsible for meeting customer expectations and ensuring food and hygiene standards are met. You'll also recruit and manage staff, plan menus and work to budgets and financial targets.

The role varies according to the size and nature of the business. In a small establishment, you'll usually have a hands-on role and will be involved in the day-to-day running of the operation. In larger organisations, however, you may have the help of other managers and supervisors to handle the different catering functions and outlets.

Types of catering manager

Catering managers can work in-house for a variety of organisations, including hospitals, schools, factories, prisons, cruise ships, hotel chains, universities and visitor attractions, or they can work for a contract catering company providing services to a range of clients.

Catering manager jobs in hotels are often advertised under the title of food and beverage manager.

Responsibilities

As a catering manager, you're likely to:

- manage the food and beverage provision for functions and events
- · supervise catering and waiting staff at functions
- plan menus in consultation with chefs
- recruit and train permanent and casual staff
- organise, lead and motivate the catering team
- plan staff shifts and rotas
- ensure health and safety regulations are strictly observed
- budget and establish financial targets and forecasts
- monitor the quality of the product and service provided
- keep financial and administrative records
- manage the payroll and monitor spending levels
- maintain stock levels and order new supplies as required
- interact with customers if involved with front of housework
- liaise with suppliers and clients
- negotiate contracts with customers, assess their requirements and ensure they're satisfied with the service delivered (in contract catering)
- ensure compliance with all fire, licensing and employment regulations
- maximise sales and meet profit and financial expectations.
- keep abreast of trends and developments in the industry, such as menus or trends in consumer tastes
