Black History Month

This October, we are celebrating Black History Month! The theme of Black History Month 2025 is "Standing Firm in Power and Pride" — a powerful tribute to the resilience, strength, and unwavering commitment to progress that defines the Black community across the globe.

We've already started our celebration of Black History Month with assemblies, and there's lots more to come! Year 9 Football

Final Score: Brownedge St Mary's 1 - 8 Walton-le-Dale

In a spectacular display of attacking football, Walton-le-Dale's Year 9 team secured a resounding away victory over local rivals Brownedge St Mary's. The visitors set a ferocious pace from the first whistle and never looked back.

The game was barely a minute old when the dynamic Frankie SS announced himself, firing Walton into an immediate lead. Frankie turned provider soon after, creating a golden opportunity that was expertly finished by Dexter R to double the advantage.

The goals continued to flow as Max D produced a moment of pure quality, unleashing a stunning half-volley that rocketed into the top right corner of the net. Brownedge managed to find a brief response just before the break, pulling a goal back with a well-placed header from a corner to make it 3-1 at half-time.

Any hopes of a Brownedge comeback were quickly extinguished after the restart. Keyarni I restored the three-goal cushion with a composed finish into the bottom right corner, before a flowing team move was capped off by Luca G, who found the net thanks to another assist from the influential Frankie SS.

The standout moment of the match arrived when Frankie SS scored a truly unbelievable goal, spotting the keeper off his line and launching an audacious effort from miles out that dipped perfectly under the crossbar. The final goal of the afternoon was a fitting end to a superb team performance. A swift counter-attack saw Aiden M burst down the right wing before delivering a pinpoint cross to Keyarni I, who made no mistake with a clinical finish to complete his brace and round off an 8-1 victory.

It was a day where everything clicked for the away side, and they will take immense confidence from this result. Every player on the pitch contributed to a magnificent performance, representing their school extremely well with both their skill and their sportsmanship.
