Shakespeare trip

Last Thursday evening, Mrs Lo and Miss Main took, 24 students (a mixture of Year 9, 10 and 11) to watch a theatre performance at the Shakespeare North Playhouse, Prescot. We watched one of Shakespeare's comedies – 'Love's Labour's Lost'. The play was was updated and set in the 1990s with lots of 90s music and lots of dancing. We were seated right next to the stage and had an amazing view of the production. The students were absolutely fantastic. We are really happy that they visited the beautiful 'Elizabethan inspired' theatre and experienced a play written in Elizabethan times. Hopefully this enrichment opportunity will help the students with their History, English and Performing Arts lessons and will inspire them to return to the Shakespeare North Playhouse in the future.



During our Learning for Life lessons this half term the topic has been Health and Wellbeing. Some classes have been looking at puberty and Menstrual health.
