### Holocaust Memorial Day

Holocaust Memorial Day is marked every year on 27 January. It is an important way to make sure the Holocaust is not forgotten and to try and prevent something like it ever happening again. The event is also used to remember other victims of genocide from countries around the world. In school we have marked the event in several different ways.

Mr Lamoury, Miss Hill and our Head Students, Alfie and Eleanor, represented our school at the South Ribble Holocaust Remembrance Service on Monday. Alfie and Eleanor gave speeches at the service and lit candles on behalf of all the students and staff at our school.

The experiences of Holocaust and genocide survivors gives us a unique insight into the lives of those who have endured persecution. Last Tuesday students had the opportunity to hear the testimony of the Holocaust survivor, Heidi Argent. Heidi is in her 90s and gave her talk via Zoom. She told the students about her very happy family life before the Holocaust in Austria. Following the Anschluss (the German invasion of Austria) Heidi's family attempted to leave the country and eventually Heidi and her parents were able to leave and come to England. Tragically her cousin and other members of her family were not able to leave and they were murdered by the Nazis in death camps. Our students found Heidi's testimony to be incredibly moving and they asked lots of questions. Many were inspired by the testimony to write stories and poems that have been performed in our Holocaust Memorial assemblies.

Miss Hill and students from Amnesty Club and International Club have delivered Holocaust Memorial Day assemblies this week. The assemblies have poems, stories and drama sketches that have been created by the students. Our students and Miss Hill have put a huge amount of effort into the assemblies and form time resources and we are very proud of them.





## Year 10 Runshaw trip

Seven Year 10 students visited Runshaw College to take part in a Philosophy and Religious Studies workshop. They examined the challenging and interesting topic of whether human beings truly possess free will. Students were encouraged to reflect on the nature of human freedom and to assess whether we can make sense of this idea. They also explored the philosophical arguments for the existence of God. It was a brilliant opportunity for our students to visit Runshaw College and experience an 'A' Level lesson.

I was very impressed by their contributions to the discussion work and immensely proud of their behaviour and attitude to learning.



## Year 9 football

### Football Match Report: Walton le Dale Year 9 vs Wellfield (South Ribble Cup Quarter-Final)

Walton le Dale Year 9 have secured their place in the semi-finals of the South Ribble Cup after a convincing 4-1 victory over Wellfield.

The match got off to a fast start with Reilley B scoring the opener just 5 minutes in. He raced onto a perfectly timed through ball from Ollie S and calmly slotted it into the bottom corner to settle any early nerves. Oliver F doubled the lead midway through the first half after fantastic work in midfield from Will P. The game was end-to-end, with Kayden M and Cydan T dominating the midfield battle, while Aston M and George R held a solid defensive line, leaving goalkeeper James W with little to do in the first half. The score remained 2-0 heading into the break.

Wellfield came out strong after halftime and controlled much of the early second-half play. However, a brilliant through ball sent Ollie S clear, and he expertly curled a shot into the far right corner, giving the goalkeeper no chance and putting Walton le Dale 3-0 up. Wellfield responded with a well-worked goal of their own, pulling one back and creating a tense finish as they looked to get back into the game with 10 minutes remaining. But Oliver F sealed the win with a brilliant individual effort, bursting through the defensive line and finishing across the goalkeeper to make it 4-1 with 5 minutes left.

Walton le Dale came close to extending their lead when Ollie S tried to lob the keeper following some excellent work from Joe M on the left wing, but his shot narrowly missed the target. Defensively, Harry S and Joe M were outstanding, both putting in their best performances for the school, and the team as a whole showed great composure and determination. With this dominant performance, Walton le Dale advance to the semi-finals full of confidence after securing their first win as a team. They'll be hoping to carry this momentum forward into the next round.
