

Wandle Valley Academy's Home School Agreement
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For pupils to be successful it is important that the staff, parents/carers and pupils work together in partnership. We must support one another if the partnership is to be effective. Our home/school agreement sets out the expectations of Wandle Valley Academy. Failure to sign this document does not provide exemption from these expectations or from statutory obligations.

Dental Check Up

Periodically throughout the year, Wandle Valley Academy offers free dental screening to all pupils.

Free School Meals

Wandle Valley Academy is certificated as a Healthy School. We believe that healthy eating is an important part of a holistic approach to education. As a result of this all pupils' at Wandle Valley Academy will receive a free school lunch regardless of whether they are eligible.

Personal Items

Personal items (e.g. mobile phones, mp3 players, bikes and scooters etc.) brought into the School by pupils are done so at their own risk. If items are confiscated due to misuse, they will be retained by the School and returned at the end of the day or when a parent/carer is able to collect it. If the offence is repeated the item will be kept for a longer period of time, negotiated with the parent/carer. Wandle Valley Academy will not take responsibility for theft, loss or damage to any personal items brought into the School.

Positive Handling

As part of our behaviour management and systems for keeping pupils and staff safe, staff will intervene physically when necessary. This is to prevent anyone being harmed or damage to the school environment. Any physical intervention will be reasonable, necessary and proportionate.

Regular training is provided to all staff.

For example:

- Pupils will be prevented from fighting, hitting or hurting others
- Damage to school property will be prevented where reasonable
- Pupils will be prevented from harming themselves
- Any other incident of a similar nature where deemed reasonable, necessary and proportionate.

If the behaviour of the pupil is causing extreme distress to others in the environment and may cause a serious incident the pupil may be physically guided from the area.

Sexual Health Education

As part of the Personal, Social and Health Education Programme your Child will be following a Sex Education Course. National evidence tells us that success in reducing unintended teenage pregnancies, abortion and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) is greatest where the following are in place:

- Early intervention, preventative work and aspiration-building.

- Support the school by attending readmission meetings in the event my child is excluded

- Do my classwork and homework as well to the best of my ability
- Take responsibility for my own learning and support other pupils in theirs
- Show courtesy towards all members of the school community

- Keep those around me safe by working with the staff and other pupils to ensure a positive learning environment
- Take full advantage of the opportunities provided to me both inside and outside the classroom
- Make a positive contribution to the school community
