



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# Football Journament

The KS3 pupils attended the annual Grafham Grange football tournament and were in high spirits going into the event. Due to some last minute changes, our schedule had changed and we were placed in a larger group of 5 teams so we had to play 4 games. Teams were given 3 points for a win, 2 points for a draw and 1 point for a loss. Our first game ended with a 2-0 victory over a well organised team. Our second game was a cagey affair, but Wandle kept the pressure on the opponents for most of the match. Unfortunately, we conceded a penalty as our defender entered the penalty area, which resulted in us losing the second game 1-0. Our 3rd game in the group stages ended in a 0-0 draw, leaving Wandle on 6 points after 3 games. We needed to win our final group game to stand a chance of qualifying for either the Cup or Plate play offs. Our 4th game ended up as a 6-0 victory with goals coming from our very intense press from our front line.

This resulted in Wandle qualifying for the Plate play offs, as we finished 2nd in our group out of 5 teams.



Before our first play off game, we had our team captain and coaches give an inspirational team talk to motivate the team in our final games of the day. The first game started as we finished our group, with two quick-fire goals, giving us a 2-0 advantage. As the game went on the opponents gained confidence and our substitutions really played their role, coming on to give our team the energy required to see out the game. Wandle Valley won 2-0 in the first play off game.

The final play off game was immediately after, and began with Wandle pushing for an early goal. We had many chances to score following some good individual play by the team. Half way through the game, the dread penalty area caused us to concede another penalty after our defender entered the area to clear the ball. The penalty was scored and Wandle went 0-1 down. Following this I was impressed with the approach and attitude we had, as the team kept pushing for the next goal, coming close as we hit the post and dragging some chances just wide of the goal. Unfortunately, time ran out for Wandle and we lost the final play off match 0-1.

Despite a short discussion within the team about our performance, pupils found the positives, as it was our first tournament as a team and we came second in our group. Also not conceding a goal from open play *and* getting to a Plate Final game in the process. The pupils did themselves proud and I am happy that all 10 players had a role to play within the team. I am looking forward to taking the pupils on this tournament again next year. *Mr Brett*


To help with generalisation of our SaLT goals to the home environment, I wanted to share some resources to help get the conversation going!
