

It's Disability Awareness Month:

After a very successful ADHD Awareness Month at Words First (with our social media posts reaching over 2200 views!) we are now shifting our focus to celebrating #disabilityawarenessmonth2023.

We know that many disabilities are not visible, and this can sometimes make our young people feel isolated and alone in their challenges. I thought I would share some examples of adults who have learnt to manage their needs and pursue their passions. I was unaware of some of these individuals, and perhaps you or your young people will be too! Having discussions around neurodiversity and disability helps to reduce stigma, dispel myths and foster a sense of community where everyone is included, seen and heard.
