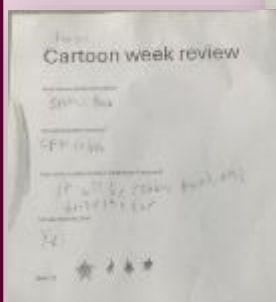
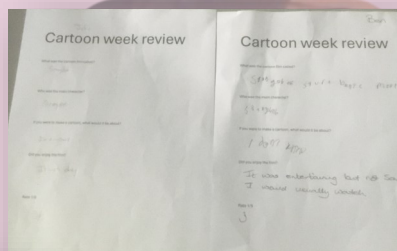

We looked at food labels to calculate nutritional values of biscuits.



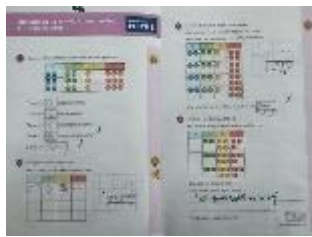


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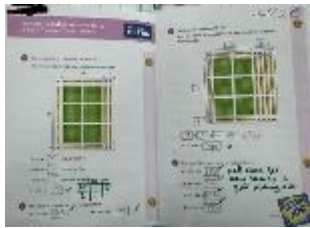
Primaries: Focus On...Maths

knowledge of timetables and place value to learn column multiplication and area multiplication methods.



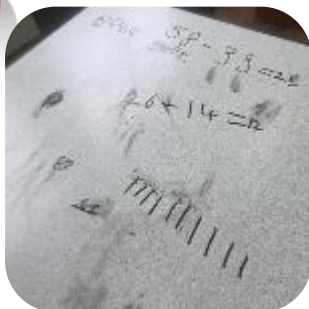
Well done!

Cooking is a great way to encourage the pupils to use their maths skills. Here they are measuring the ingredients to make scones.

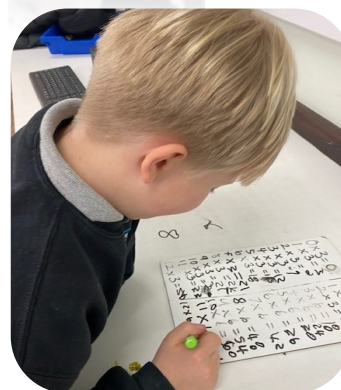


Green Class—have been busy practising our times tables and looking at the relationship between our 3 and 6 times table.
