How to fill your hot water bottle safely:

- Check the hot water bottle for signs of damage. Look for splits in the rubber or along the seams
- Follow the instructions on the bottle
- Don't use boiling water as it can damage the seams of the bottle. For children use cooled boiled water that is around bath temperature
- Don't fill more than two thirds full
- Carefully let out the air from the bottle before putting the stopper on
- Make sure the stopper is screwed in straight, is tight and doesn't leak.

- Look out for special deals and discounts at the supermarket.



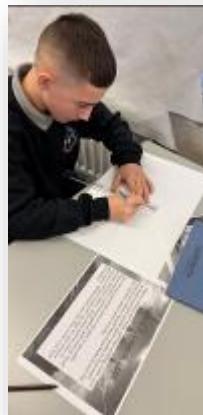
