

### **Rocket Powered STEM Session**

Year 7 pupils at Wandle Valley were selected to participate in a K'Nex Rocket Powered car Workshop. Proctor Learning Technologies led the session with two highly respected engineers, one of whom is currently working on the Bloodhound SSC project to break the land speed record. This was organised through the Princes Trust Achieve Programme the pupils are following. Pupils were amazed at the explo-

sive gas demonstration and lis-

tened attentively as their mission became clear - to break the Wandle gym speed record !

The pupils organised themselves into pairs and constructed their own designs of car using k'Nex. The variety of cars and creativity was inspiring to watch. They tested and modified their cars with the intention to be Champions.

Finally the moment of truth arrived and vehicles were sent hurtling along the gym floor (aologies for any scorch marks Mr Kirkwood!).

Recordings of distance and time allowed pupils to calculate their MPH speed. Team Flash astonished onlookers with their distance of almost 15 metres and took the chequered flag.

All pupils were praised for their engagement by the organisers and we really look forward to the next event...

Following on from our successful taster sessions at Carshalton College and JACE Training in October 2018, during January and February 2019, Year 11 pupils had the opportunity to visit three further Post-16 educational venues.

At each venue, pupils had the opportunity to explore the facilities, chat to course leaders about course content and access requirements and also to plan how they would travel independently to each location.

Representatives from each of the venues also came in to school on separate occasions to discuss further the opportunities and support available and to help pupils to complete online applications for their preferred courses.

This year's pupils have all now applied to college(s), for courses and apprenticeships including Catering, Travel and Tourism, Car Mechanics, Game Design/Creative Media and Construction.

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
