## End of Term 5 – May 2025

### Headteachers message:

Term 5 has been short but very busy for us. The disrupted weeks with the Bank Holidays has meant we don't really feel that the term has been a real term! We look forward to welcoming the children back on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> June ready to start Term 6 and begin preparation for the new academic year.

#### September 2025 – Class Groups

Class names are changing to help make it easier to distinguish between different age groups, developing an important sense of 'rite of passage' as children grow and move up through the school. The names chosen are also easier for the children to understand and will be more easily supported with symbols, objects of reference and images to create a strong sense of belonging.

EYFS and lower primary classes will be named after minibeasts. Upper Primary classes will be named after small mammals, Secondary classes will be named after trees and our 6<sup>th</sup> form classes will be named after regional national parks.

In the first week of Term 6, you will find out your child's class name and class teacher via a letter in your child's bag on the Friday. Supporting adults will be shared with you, but please be aware that these are subject to change. The class groups have been carefully created to support learning and class teachers have been involved on trying to get things right. It is undoubtedly an anxious time supporting your child to accept change so we thank you in advance for your positivity and support.

This year, we will be 'moving up' as part of an enhanced transition. From 7<sup>th</sup> July, your child will move into their new class groups, so they and you can get to know any new faces before the long break. The 16<sup>th</sup> July will offer 'meet the team meetings' so you can also come to put some faces to names.

#### Fundraising

A HUGE congratulations to one of our parents, Emily who ran the Paris Marathon raising money for the school. She raised over £3000 which will enable us to refurbish elements on the primary playground – thank you Emily and all those who donated to her JustGiving Page.

We are committed to developing the playground spaces for The Strand classes and have agreed some exciting work that will make this important outside space even more accessible and suitable to meet the children's needs. The artists impression below gives a flavour of what is planned for stage 1. The flat swing will be a 'mirage swing' to allow for wheelchairs users to also experience the swing. We hope that this will be completed over the summer.



The plan is to develop the adjacent space over a further 12-18 months. This gives us some time for further fundraising, but please do get in touch if you are able to access any grants or financial donations that could help with this space and others.

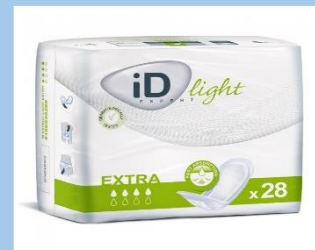
