Create a poster about our current British Value of Mutual Tolerance.

Looking at our Gospel Value of Peace, research and make a fact file on a winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.

Write an onomatopoeia poem about bonfire night.

Create a Christmas card in French.

Create a leaflet explaining how Christians prepare for Christmas.

Draw a detailed circuit, including all of the symbols we have learned.

Practise conversions between fractions, decimals and percentages.
