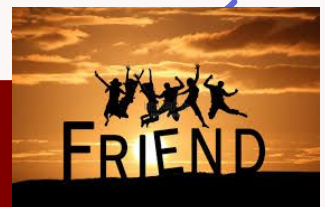
We hope you have a lovely weekend. Please remember to ensure your child has a PE kit in school.
