OTHER NOTICES

PE Kits

All children need their PE kit in school at all times, and it should be returned the following day if taken home to be washed. If you are struggling to source a kit, staff can provide spares.

The expected PE kit is black/burgundy shorts and a white t-shirt. For colder weather, children can wear unbranded black leggings/jogging bottoms and a hoodie.

For safety during PE lessons, all jewellery (especially earrings) must be removed, and long hair should be tied back.

Parents are expected to ensure the PE kit is clean, clearly labelled with the child's name, and in good condition.

PE is part of the National Curriculum, and participation is considered beneficial for a child's physical and mental health.
