<b>English</b>	Revise different spellings for the /igh/ sound family.	Write <b>I spy</b> sentences for two of your <b>igh</b> words, e.g. <i>I spy a <b>light</b>.</i>  Remember to use: <b>a capital letter at the start,</b> <b>finger spaces between each word</b> and <b>a full stop at the end.</b> 😊	Write a sentence for each of the /igh/ sounds we have looked at today (ie, igh, i_e, y).  ★ Can you have three words with that sound in each sentence? Can you write a number calculation that makes a number greater than their number?</p> <p>Can you write a number calculation that makes a number smaller than their number?</p> <p>Can you write a number calculation that makes a number?</p>	<p>Have a go at one of the activity sheets on the website.</p>	<p><b>Number Whisper</b>  Think of a mystery number and write it down (keeping it hidden). Then, give clues to your grownup. For example, "Mine is greater than one, but less than 10. If you add four twos together, you are 1 less than my number..."
